Minutes of Meeting No.1670

Date: 13 Shrawan 2076 / 29 July 2019

- 1. President Rtn. Lalita Thapa called the RCP Meeting No. 1670 to order with 15 seconds of 'Silent Invocation' for World Peace and Happiness.
- 2. Guests welcomed by the President: President of Rotaract Club of Patan Rtr. Sajal Khadka, Mr. Suraj Pradhan and Mrs. Meera Pradhan formerly with RC Chitwan.
- 3. The last meeting minutes were reviewed and adopted.
- 4. 'Happy News'/Sunshine Contribution:
 - Rtn. Shiva K. Pradhan, Rtn. Lalita Thapa (NRs. 500) & Rtn. Jeevan K. Shrestha for having friends from Chitwan as guests in today's meeting.
 - Rtn. Prakash R. Regmi for getting major funding of US \$100,000 from Lions Club to Banepa Heart Clinic, which he has been supporting through Nepal Heart Foundation for many years (NRs. 500).
 - Rtns. Matsyendra L. and Chandralekha Kayastha for getting building permits for 3 building projects designed by their company including an office building of Rtn. Shiv P. Khemka (NRs. 1,000 each).
 - Rtn. Gabriele Mallapaty for approval of the RCP's 10th global grant on a master's level scholarship of Ms. Monika Niroula (NRs. 500).
 - Rtn. Maheswari Bisht Rawal for 'Happy Landing' from the USA with an extensive tour of two months on the happy occasion of her son's completion of master's degree in education policy from Brown University, Rhode Island, USA with excellent achievement of 4 GPA (NRs. 1,000).
- 5. Other Contributions:
 - Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty contributed NRs. 1,850 to the PEEF Operational Fund from his participation in Nepal Orthopaedic Hospital committee meeting.
 - Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty handed over a cheque of NRs. 1,000,000 received from honorary Rtn. Anuradha Shrestha on behalf of Sarswati Govinda Foundation being the annual contribution to the PEEF as per the MOU between the Foundation and the RCP. The formal handover/acknowledgement will be done during the Charter Day ceremony of the RCP on 29 August 2019.
 - Rtns. Lalita and Kiran Thapa pledged to contribute US \$ 100 each to Polio Plus.
 - Rtns. Bijaya and Gabriele Mallapaty contributed US \$200 each to the Rotary Foundation. US \$100 each to the Polio Plus and US \$100 each to the Annual Fund of TRF.

 of club officials and option of getting 100 name cards for NRs. 500.

- Rtn. Mahendra S. Rawal briefed on the planned monitoring visit to WASH project schools together with Prabhav (Splash) Board members and requested respective PEEF coordinators to join.
- Rtn. Gabriele Mallapaty confirmed the approval of the RCP's 10th global grant for the master's level scholarship of Ms. Monika Niroula in UK.
- 7. PDG Rtn. Tirtha M. Sakya honoured new member of the RCP Rtn. Sita Gurung with the Rotary Pin.
