
We will be equally involved in following up of other smaller projects/programs initiated earlier for their successful implementation. Also we will be exploring more future projects with our international brotherly clubs.

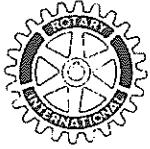

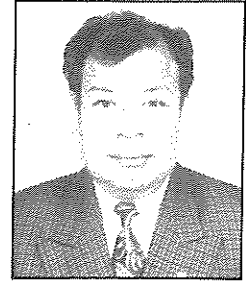

Dear fellow Rotarians,

The day have come to say goodbye to fellow Rotarians myself as president of 2000/2001 as all the team of mine for the year completing their tenure without whose supports I cannot dream the year could be a successful. I would say it could be still better if all members had given little more time than coming regularly to our Monday meetings and enhance themselves little bit more time to some possible projects. Merely attending meeting regularly is not enough and one has to give little more time for the Rotary cause as a social worker. However, friends who has given sole and whole heartily whenever called and asked for their time is highly laudable and I thank them.

The projects undertaken during my tenure and initiated are described separately under Club Report complied Just to give a glimpse, we succeeded to receive US\$ 93,114.00 as matching grants from RI and sponsoring clubs from abroad. We had initiated projects with estimated cost of US\$ 274,000, which are on pipeline; hopefully these will be materialized in days to come. Right Honorable Prime minister has inaugurated the Senior Citizen Home, which is nearly ready to run. The increase in Prajapati Endowment fund, from Rs.1,6 05,029 to Rs. 1,889,415 is remarkable. This year the Club has indicated a surplus of over Rs.50, 000 that may be further increased with collection of outstanding payment from advertisers. The relationship established with the foreign clubs and the initiation to establish the twinning club approach to Bakewell Club in UK, with whom we initiate a matching grant to supply Pediatrics equipments to Amp Pipal Hospital, are notable.

I am glad to mention here that we had initiated to get 100 computers from Computer Aid International, U.K. for an interesting project to provide 10 computers to each high school in Lalitpur Sub Metropolitan City where no computer classes has been started.

The Hon'ble Mrs. Teresa de Cruz, The Consular of Nepal to Portugal, helped with funds equivalent to US\$ 3,500 to Bhaktapur Cancer Care Center, CBR projects in Bhaktapur and Disabled New Life Center along with cloths, medicines, toys, three euro-guard water filtration equipment, tooth brushes and paste.

We hope much more can be done and the Rotarian friends must take the challenges to continue and I hope the incoming board members of President Elect Rtn. Narayan Govind Halwai will take the challenges and I would be happiest person to give hand in hands to the incoming board.

I wish the best of everything's to the entire fellow Rotarians.

पाटनको रोटररी क्लवले आफ्नो पदस्थापन मीटिङका उपलक्ष्यमा प्रकाशित गरेको (बुलेटिन) विशेषाङ्कमा के कुरा लेख्ने ? आफ्नै क्लवका बारेमा लेख्ने अथवा रोटररी संसारका ज्ञानगुनका कुरा लेख्ने ? कि नेपालमा रोटररीको प्रसार के कस्तो भैरहेको छ भन्ने विषयमा कुरा जोर्ने ? सम्पादक भएर जवाफ दिने हो भने मैले भन्नु पर्छ: तीनमध्ये जुनसुकै विषयमा लेखे पनि हुन्छ, अरु तपाईंले आफ्नै विषयमा, आफूले रोटररीमा कमाएका अनुभवका बारेमा लेखे पनि फरक पर्दैन ।

तर, मैले ऐले सम्पादक भएर होइन, लेखक भएर, एक जना नेपाली रोटररियन लेखक भएर, लेखन वस्ता समस्या परेको हो मलाई । यो समस्या समाधान गर्नगराउन पनि मलाई कसैले मदद गर्न सक्तैनन्, मैले आफै गर्नुपर्छ जे गर्ने । तर के गर्ने ?

पैलेपैले हामी रोटररीमा, अमेरिका, इलिनवायवट निस्कने रोटररी इण्टरनेशनलको 'द रोटररियन' भन्ने मासिक पत्रिका पढ्थ्यौं, किनभने प्रत्येक रोटररी क्लवका सबै सदस्यले एकेक वटा त्यो पत्रिका किनै पर्थ्यौं, त्यसको ग्राहक हुनै पर्थ्यौं । त्यसै हुँदा पढ्नु पनि पर्थ्यौं । अब पर्दैन । किनभने रोटररी इण्टरनेशनलले 'द रोटररियन' फिकाउनै पर्ने बाध्यताबाट सदस्यहरूलाई मुक्त गरेको छ । त्यसको सट्टा उसले नियम बनाइदिएको छ— हरेक रोटररियनले या त 'द रोटररियन' या अन्य कुनै, आर.आइ.का क्षेत्रीय मुखपत्र, पत्रिका लिए हुन्छ । तर क्लवमा एउटासम्म चाहिँ 'द रोटररियन' मगाउनै पर्ने, पारेको छ । अमेरिकाबाट 'द रोटररियन' फिकाउन वार्षिक बाह्र डलर नौसय जति रुपियाँ पर्छ । तर दक्षिण एसियाका लागि बंगलोर वाट प्रकाशित हुने 'रोटररी न्यूज' फिकाए वार्षिक भार. २४० (३८४ रुपियाँ) तिरै पुग्छ । त्यसैले अचेल म पनि 'रोटररी न्यूज' कै ग्राहक भएको छु । त्यही आउँछ, त्यही पढ्छु । तर त्यो 'रोटररी न्यूज' पनि ठीकठीक समयमा आइपुग्दैन । दुइ-तीन महिनामा दुइ तीन अंक एकैसाथ आइपुग्छन्— पढ्नै 'बोर' लाग्छ । यसपटक पनि त्यस्तै भयो, मार्च अप्रिल र मे (२००१)का तीन अंक षण्डैषण्डै एकैसाथ मेरा हात परे । कुन पढ्नु के पढ्नु, भयो । मार्चको अंकमा गुजरातको भूकम्पमा रोटररीलेले गरेको सहायताको राम्रो वर्णन रहेछ । तर मलाई लाग्यो हामी नेपाली रोटररियनहरूले ध्यान दिएर पढ्नै पर्ने कुरा चाहिँ अप्रिल र मे महिनाका ती अंकहरूमा दुइ भाग गरेर छापिएको रो.डा. पी.सी. टमसको लेख छ । यी रोटररियन डाक्टर टमस आर. आइ.का डाइरेक्टर-इलेक्ट अर्थात् जुलाई २००१ देखि रोटररी इण्टरनेशनलको बोर्डमा (जोन फाइभ र सिक्स) रोटररीको पाँचौं र छैठौं क्षेत्र (जसमा नेपाल पनि पर्छ)का तर्फबाट डाइरेक्टर भएर वस्नेछन् । त्यसउसले पनि उनले भनेका कुराले हाम्रा कान ठाडा हुनु पर्छ । हुन त मैले जस्तै हाम्रा रोटररियन अरू मित्रहरूले पनि त्यो पत्रिका हेर्नु भएकै होला, पढ्नु भएकै होला र त्यसबाट आ-आफ्नो धारणा पनि बनाउनु भएकै होला । भए पनि मेरो मनमा लागेका कुरा चाहिँ आज यो पदस्थापन समारोहका बेला

उठाऊँ कि भनी यहाँ पोख्तैछु । मेरा मनमा लागेको कुरा यो :-

CLUB REPORT – 2000-2001

Chirinjibi Acharya - Secretary 2000-2001

Club Service

The Club Activity started with attending Pre-PETS seminar at Butwal, PETS and SETs at Kathmandu, District Assembly at Kathmandu and organizing **Club Officers Training Seminar (COTS)** jointly with Rotary club of Patan South. The trainers were past Rtn.Sagar Rana, Rtn. Mani Joshi, Rtn. Tika Man Vaidya.

Rotary Year 2000-2001 organised 11-classification talks from our club members, 17-guest speakers from different personalities and walk of life, 12 business meetings, two club assemblies and 14 Board meetings with fellowships. Since the establishment of our club it never had remember its chartered day. This year we had gala dinner with recognition of continuing chartered members. Rtn.Gopal Rajbhandari, a senior most Rotarian member in Nepal, was the chief guest.

Fellowship and Attendance were wonderful. First half-year recorded 81 attendance and was 80% during second half and second half-year. 19 Rotarians had achieved 100% attendance, recorded separately in this issue.

We have four new members - Rtn.Krishna Bahadur Pradhan, Rtn.Sudan Shakya, Rtn.Krishna B.Basnet and Rtn.Capt. Dhuba Man Singh Rajbhandari were introduced. Our Past President Rtn.Rabindra R Pandey was designated as GSR for extension of new club Rotary club of Kupondole. We sponsored an Intract Club in a school, St.Xavier high School, Jawalakhel.

International and Club Service

We had laudable International relation marked by successful achievement to receive US\$93,114 from Matching Grants and through sponsoring clubs with US\$3,500 from Hon. Consul to Portugal for Nepal Ms.Teresa de Cruz. Details of these grants are:

1. **Matching Grant No.13278 of US\$11,000** to help and provide an X-ray automatic film processor and a oxygen mixing Ventilator equipment to the Patan Hospital. Sponsoring club was Tamworth-First Light in Dist.9650 in Australia. On 22nd June 2001 a draft No.A4578485 of INR.5, 06,000 equivalent to Nepal Rupees 8,09,600.00 is handover to Patan Hospital. The automatic X-ray machine has cut down the processing time of X-Ray from 30-40 minutes to a bare 2-3 minutes which helped the emergency patients. Status: Closing Summary report to be prepared.

2. **Matching Grant No.14370 of US\$39,000** to help and provide a minibus, motorcycle and medical equipment for Orthopedic Hospital. Sponsoring clubs are Brugge't Vrije, Menen, and Maldegem in Dist, 1620 Belgium. And on 20th.June 2001 A special function was organized on June 29, 2001 by the Board of director of

Nepal Orthopedic Hospital to handover the purchased mini bus and motorcycle air-condition and other medical equipment from matching grant received. Status: Closing Summary report to be prepared.

3. **Matching Grant No.11402 of US\$7,590** to help and provide the furnishings and medical equipment to the Abenteur Land Senior Citizen Home and Girls hostel. Sponsoring club Bayreuth –Eremitage in Dist.1880 Germany. Status: Grant approved and on process.

4. **Matching Grant No.14723 of US\$28,000** to help and provide funds to support a daycare center for mentally disabled people. Sponsoring club Neuburg/Donau, Germany. Status: Approved and on process.

5. **Matching Grant No.15379 of US\$3,824** to help and provide medical equipment to the Amp Pipal Hospital, a mountainside hospital serving 5,00,000 people in rural area. Sponsoring clubs are RC Vinderupof Dist.1450 in Denmark; District 1220 and RC Bakewell of Dist.1220 U.K. Exemption from VAT and Import Tax were obtained. Status: Paid and equipment on the way.

Following projects have been initiated and entrusted to the team of the 2001-2002 for follow up actions.

1. **Matching Grant No.17790 of US\$50,000** to provide books, computers, educational materials and furnishing for a library and recreation hall as well as a school bus for a Deaf school at Naxal. Sponsoring club is RC Bellevue, USA in Dist.5030. Status: Pending

2. A basic logistic support for the establishment of a **Bachelor of Orthoptic Science** affiliated to Kathmandu University in Nepal Eye Hospital project has be initiated and project report has been prepared and send to the sponsoring club Richmond Rotary club in Canada. Contact person in Richmond is Ms.Sandy Simspon. This projects has been asked to promote within Canada by Professor Dr.John Pratt-Johnson. Estimated cost is US\$50,000.

3. A proposal for establishment of a **Community Heart Clinic** at Lalitpur has been prepared with initiation of Rtn. Dr.Krishna Jung Rana and forwarded to our Dist.3290 to be listed as a WCS project. Cost estimated US\$1,48,000

4. **Computer Education Program** is initiated in this year. An application has been forwarded to Computer Aid International, U.K. for providing 100 computers which will be handed over to Lalitpur Sub-municipality's High School, oldest high school in the Lalitpur and other schools. Rotary Club of Mansfield, U.K is helping us to foward these computers from U.K. Request has

been made to Ministry of Tourism and Culture for recommendation to Royal Nepal Airlines to help airlifting all 100 computers free from Gatwick to Kathmandu. Similarly Rtn. Tulsi Maharjan, USA has initiated to collect more funds in USA for the supply of the computers.

5. Project proposal for the provision of **Basic Logistic Support to the Underprivileged Public Schools of Lalitpur** has been prepared and forwarded to two International clubs i.e. Albuquerque Del Norte, New Mexico, USA contact person Rtn. Matthew E. Cohen and to a German Club contact person Rtn. Dr. Uwe Rehling. The projects cost US\$20,000.

Polio Plus: The fact that our Polio Plus Committee Chairman Rt. R. R. Pandey is also a member of the Polio Plus National Committee has benefited us in our polio plus activities. Almost all members took an active part in all Polio plus programmed.

Prajapati Endowment Fund. This year the fund swelled from Rs. 16,05,029 to Rs. 18,89,415. Thanks to Ms. Sikha Prasai, PDG. Tehmas R. Manekshaw, Rtn. Tulsi Maharjan, Rtn. Bhim Kshetry and Mr. Robin Marston of Summit Hotel who have contributed generously to support the program. Details are given separately.

Senior Citizen Home Abenteur Land: Right Honorable Prime Minister Mr. Girija Prasad Koirala inaugurated long awaited dream projects of our club, Senior Citizen Home Abenteur Land on March 26, 2001 amidst the contingent of donors. Now the challenges lies to us how to run it. It should not be as a white elephant We need to decide ourselves not awaiting to sponsoring agent and look for the good management so that it can run in no loss no gain situation.

Nepal Orthopedic Hospital: The hospital is satisfactorily running under vibrant leadership of Prof. Shanker R Pathak and Dr. Anil Shrestha. Till date RCP had managed 4 Rotary programs to this hospital with fund for construction to equipment and furniture supplies. Blood donation by Rtn. Yagya Bahadur Shrestha and Rtn. Pushkar Man Shakya during Disabled Day at Nepal Orthopedic Hospital is appreciated.

The amount received from Hon. Consul Ms. Teresa Cruz, cash US\$2000 to procure toys, cloths, toothbrush and paste and some medicines worth US\$1000 were distributed by herself to Bhaktapur Cancer Care Center and Bhaktapur CBR project. Further US\$500 worth of three Euro-guard water filtration for drinkable water were distributed to Disabled New life Center (1) and Bhaktapur Cancer Care Hospital (2). Thanks to Her Excellency Madam Cruz.

Prajapati Education Endowment Fund

Resource mobilisation for the scholarship programme of Patan Rotary Club (RCP) got under way in 1989 and a modest beginning made in 1992 by distributing scholarships from interest earning of the Scholarship Fund. The objective of the Programme is to provide education to those needy girls and boys belonging to the economically impoverished stratum of our society. The scholarship grant to each awardee amounted to 1,200 rupees a year paid in two half yearly installments. Growth in fund generation and number of students receiving scholarships over the years are given in the table below.

The annual interest earning is falling due to reduced bank interest rates, current annual interest earning is estimated at about Rs 150,000, whereas it was much higher in previous years. Till date only 10 Rotarians from our club had contributed to the fund and lot more is expected from the rest. Our Rotarian friends are contributing towards a Multiple Paul Harris Fellow and we expect similar generosity from our Rotarian friends. It is heartening to note that there was generous contribution from our Rotarian friends to support more students in this year onwards.

A review of the programme was undertaken in 1999 with the participation of the grantees from a few schools, and their guardians and teachers. The problems identified included difficulty in making regular payments to the grantees, uncertainty as to whether the most deserving were chosen for the grants, and the lack of compulsion for the grantees to do better in studies. An analysis of the 87 recipients (female 50 and male 7) in 2000 showed that the recipients came from Grades 2 to 10; most (45) came from Bahun Chhetri caste groups; and only 32% had scores higher than 60%. In order to finetune the Fund's focus on poverty and achievement, the scholarship committee decided also to launch a community-based initiative so that the grant could be exclusively targeted on children known to be poor and diligent. In order to be able to fund this initiative, the committee decided not to recruit new grantees in the existing

programme while the old ones would continue to receive the support until they go on to complete Class 10 without fails in between. However, the committee also brought about some changes in the existing programme by deciding (on 12/3/2001) to raise the annual grant from the regular 1200 rupees to 1500 to the students scoring more than 70% marks in the exam, and to reduce it to 800 rupees for those scoring less than 50%. Those scoring in between are to continue to receive it at the regular rate.

The community based approach is a cooperative scholarship programme where the concerned VDC also contribute towards the education fund. We have limited budget and plan to implement in 2 VDCs. This was discussed with Tikathali, Dukuchhap VDC (through Rotary Voluntary Corps of Dukuchhap) and Chhampi VDC for possible matching contribution from VDC. We got positive response from Chhampi only and it was implemented accordingly in its two wards, 1 and 7, which were selected by it for their higher incidence of poverty.

A special survey was undertaken by the VDC under the technical guidance of the RCP Scholarship Committee which helped to identify the poorest (Class C) households in its area. A total of 80 scholarships (20 from the VDC and 60 from the RCP) each carrying a cash grant of 1000 rupees were earmarked. Based on the number of households in the two wards, 47 scholarships were set aside for Ward 1 and 33 for Ward 7. For the initial year, first priority was given to the out-of-school (OSC) children (6-15 years) in order to attract them to go to school. The remaining major bulk of the scholarships were given to the highest scoring students from the C class households in those wards. While the OSC children (12 in Ward 1 and 3 in Ward 7) are to be enrolled during the academic year of 2001, 35 scholarships for the highest scoring poor students were distributed in Ward 1 and 30 in Ward 7.

The distinctive features of the new approach are: the programme is owned by the VDC, which contributes 25% of the grant money from its own resources. The programme is exclusively focussed on the poor with increased representation of the Dalit students (25 out of 65 grantees). The grant is focussed on achievement; only the highest scoring children are eligible. There is, thus, a continuing competition among children (with support from parents) to do better in exams. And since the programme is VDC-based, it is also easier to manage. The replication potential seems to be high; The VDC now wants to implement it in all its Wards. RCP and Chhampi VDC look forward to declare 100% children of school going age in VDC are enrolled in school in next few years.

Other VDCs have shown positive response towards this community based approach following Chhampi example. We hope that RCP will be able to facilitate implementation of this community based programs in many other VDCs in Lalitpur District where 100% literacy among school going age could be achieved. We appeal generous contribution from all the Rotarian friends to this fund.

Nepal Orthopaedic Hospital

Dr. Rtn. Anil Shrestha

It has almost been 3 years since the Nepal Orthopaedic Hospital has opened its doors to treat patients with orthopaedic problems. This hospital was conceived as a World Community Service Project of various Rotary Clubs of District 7090 of USA-Canada and Branscombe family with Rotary Club of Patan and Nepal Disabled Association as local partners. US\$ 225,000 was raised to construct the building. Similarly US\$ 12,800 was provided under Matching Grant with sponsor of the Rotary Club of Mount Baker, USA through Rtn. James Sinclair to procure furniture and hospital beds. There was still not enough funds to start the hospital. Then in 1998 a generous fund of approximately US\$ 40,000 was raised from various friends and individuals from Belgium through the effort of Rtn. Luc Salens. This gave us initial thrust to start the hospital and since then it has not looked back. Till the end of 2000, more than 9484 patients were treated in the OPD and over 710 underwent major or minor surgery at NOH and financial assistance was provided to 163 patients amounting over Rs. 790,000.

To generate funds to construct a hospital of this kind was difficult, to start the hospital was more difficult, but I think not impossible. Our goal and mission now is to be self-reliant in the next 7 years. For this we require the help and cooperation from everybody. We can achieve this only if we can expand the hospital to accommodate 50 beds and add new facilities. We have already taken a step forward because of financial help from Foundation Help for Nepal, Holland, which has contributed more than US\$ 30,000 for the construction of the block for physiotherapy, X-ray and laboratory along with a new X-ray machine. Just recently a Matching Grant of US\$ 39,314 through the efforts of Rotary Club of Patan, has been released, which will be used to add necessary equipment for the hospital.

Nepal Orthopaedic hospital is an example of the project where Rotary Clubs of various, country, individual donors, institution, friends and well-wishers have pooled in their resources for a single cause-to provide comprehensive and standard health care in the field of traumatology, orthopaedics and rehabilitation to the people of the Nepal at an affordable cost.

Performance and the financial status of the Hospital is given below. The figures indicate that revenue from the patients have been increased over years and slowly catching up donors contribution. The hospital still has to depend upon donors support for its operation.

Rotary Club of Patan (RCP) was chartered on April 19, 1985 as 3rd Rotary Club in the country. This compilation aims to archive the Rotary Projects undertaken by RCP with the mobilisation of resources from various institutions and own resources during last 16 years are briefly listed below.

1985-1986 President : Late Rtn Surendra Raj Sharma

No record available for this year.

1986-1987 President : Late Rtn Surendra Raj Sharma

II-1 Sipadol Multi Purpose Project, Rs 500,000, funded by South Asia Partnership, Canada was implemented in Sipadol Village in Lalitpur District. The project consisted of construction of school building, health post, and horticulture development.

II-2 Establishment of AWON Library, Lalitpur. RCP initiated to establish AWON library at Kopundole, Lalitpur in association with American Women Organisation of Nepal.

1987-1988 President : Rtn Matsyendra Lal Kayastha

III-3 Indrayani School Building construction was undertaken at Khokana village in Lalitpur District with fund (Rs 500,000) made available by Rtn Ranjit Ratnaik from Australia. It benefited about 200 students. Further strengthening of the school is anticipated.

III-4 Polio Eradication Project was launched as a world wide Project by Rotary International with contributions from the Rotarians around the world including RCP. It is an ongoing National Project till date.

III-5 Support to Health Post at Geutal, Lalitpur. RCP supported to run the health post with its own resources till 1991.

III-6 Support to Health Post at Natole, Lalitpur. RCP supported to run the health post with its own resources till 1991. RCP had arranged some furniture to the health clinic (VI-20).

III-7 Support to Achheswor Vihar Rehabilitation, Pulchok, Lalitpur Municipality. RCP members donated Rs 10,000 to support the rehabilitation work.

III-8 Support to Ama Milan Kendra, Kathmandu Municipality. RCP members contributed Rs 40,000 to support the Kendra. Rtn. Surendra R Sharma co-ordinated the RCP support.

1988-1989 President : Rtn Matsyendra Lal Kayastha

IV-9 4 beds for TB patients at Kalimati Chest Hospital, Kathmandu was made available with the contribution of Rotary Club of Sesojiya, Japan.

IV-10 Equipment for Disabled Persons was made available by Rotary Club of Sesojiya, Japan and handed over to Nepal Disabled Association, Jorpati Kathmandu.

IV-11 6,500 litre water tank was constructed at Thecho village, Lalitpur District with fund (Rs 28,000) made available by Rotarian J Sinclair, South Amherst Club, Canada and local contribution. Part of the fund is used to construct a bus stand (V-16). It is considered as one of most successful project undertaken by RCP and is operating successfully.

IV-12 Clothes for Earthquake Victims, costing about Rs 250,000, were distributed in East Nepal donated by Japanese citizens.

IV-13 Financial Support to Earthquake Victims in East Nepal. Club members contributed Rs 51,000 for the support to Prime Minister's Fund.

IV-14 Jawalakhel Environment Improvement Project, Lalitpur. RCP members contributed a sum of Rs 20,000 to Lalitpur Municipality for the Project implementation.

IV-15 Guardianship to 2 Orphans from Earthquake Affected Areas, Tehrathum District, Eastern Nepal. RCP handed over Rs 100,000 contributed by RI District 2540, Japan, to Bal Mandir, Naxal, Kathmandu to provide guardianship to 2 orphan girls.

1989-1990 President : Rtn Bhism Raj Prasai

V-16 Bus Stand was constructed at Thecho village, Lalitpur District near the water tank (IV-11) with the fund (Rs 7,000) remaining from Project IV-11 and local contribution.

V-17 Mulpi Water Supply Project was implemented in Mulpi Village in Kavre District with a contribution of Rs 25,000 made available by RI District 3290.

1990-1991 President: Late Rtn Prajapati Prasai

VI-18 Two Class Rooms were constructed at Balodaya Primary School at Dhapakhel Village, Lalitpur District at a total cost of Rs 91,000 made available by RCP and local people's contribution.

VI-19 Support to 4 Martyr's Family of Lalitpur District was undertaken with fund (Rs 150,000) made available by Rotary Club of Akita Amori, Japan.

VI-20 Furniture to School and Health Post, Lalitpur. RCP distributed furniture worth Rs 20,000 donated by Hotel Narayani, Lalitpur to school at Thecho village, Lalitpur District and Health Post at Natole, Lalitpur Municipality.

VI-21 Training of Lady Doctor in Japan. RCP sponsored a lady doctor from Teaching Hospital, Kathmandu to undergo training in Japan. It was funded by Rotary Club in Japan.

1991-1992 President: Late Rtn. Hom Raj Bajracharya

VII-22 Traditional Stone Spouts were rehabilitated at Nahity and Lagankhel, Lalitpur Municipality. With a seed money of A\$ 2,500 from Rotary Club of Alice Spring, Australia, RCP mobilised resources of Rs 75,000 from local people and Rs 125,000 worth of reinforced cement concrete pipes from Nepal Water Supply Corporation to rehabilitate 2 stone spouts. The spout is discharging about 2 litres per second of clear water which benefit about 500 local people. This project is considered to be a successful and honoured with **Significant Achievement Award** from Rotary International.

VII-23 Medical Equipment for Patan Hospital, costing A\$ 34,000, Lalitpur Municipality. Contributors were Rotary Clubs in Australia (Doncaster - A\$9,000, Croydon -A\$ 4,000, Forest Hill - A\$ 3,000); Rotary Club of Patan - A\$ 1,000 and RI Foundation - A\$ 17,000 under Matching Grant No 2671. Grant is used to provide modernise internal telephone system, dental and medical equipment to Patan Hospital.

VII-24 Ultrasonic Machine and Accessories to Amp Pipal Hospital, Gorkha. RCP sponsored for the donation of above equipment Rs 174,000 with contribution of RI District 2050 of Canada (US\$ 1,475) and RI Foundation (US\$ 1,475) under Matching Grant No 2568.

VII-25 Water Supply to Simal Banjyang Village, Pokhara, Kaski District. RCP sponsored the Project with contribution from Rotary Clubs of England (Worthington - £2000, Little Hampton - £200, Shoreham and Southwick -£200, Bognorhortham -£50 and Rotary Foundation -£2450 under Matching Grant No. 2636. Total project cost is Rs 450,000 and benefit 7000 villagers.

VII-26 Scholarship to Poor Students Program was initiated in this year as a regular RCP Program. Late Rtn Prajapati Prasai initiated the Program, later named after him as Prajapati Scholarship Program. About Rs 1.9 million (as of June 2001) has been collected as trust fund and accrued interest is distributed as scholarship to poor students. It is discussed separately.

VIII-27 Nepal Orthopaedic Hospital (16 bed) at Jorpati, Kathmandu. With generous assistance from clubs in RI District 7090, RCP and Nepal Disabled Association, Jorpati undertook the construction of the Project at a cost of \$225,000. Amherst South, NY and Rotary Club of Hamilton AM, Ontario, Canada were

co-ordinators for fund raising in USA and Canada. The Rotary Club of Hamilton AM alone provided \$45,000 and others by over 50 clubs in District 7090. The Hospital is currently in satisfactory operation. It is discussed separately.

VIII-28 Clothes to Bhutanese Refugees were distributed through UNHCR, Kathmandu. The clothes were donated by Rotary Club of Yotuba, Japan.

VIII-29 Goat Breeding Project was launched in Bhardeo village in Lalitpur District. A grant sum of Rs 62,000 received from SAP Canada was used as a revolving seed money to provide loan to villagers to raise goat. The beginning of the Project was satisfactory but loan recovery was poor.

Ongoing **Scholarship program (VII-26)** continued with fund swelled to Rs 100,000 and scholarship offered to 10 students.

Only ongoing program as Adult Orthopedic Hospital, Scholarship, Thulo Parsel Project preconstruction activities were continued during the year.

XI-30 Statue and Thanka Painting Training was conducted under the trainer Mr. DB Lama, a total of 43 persons were trained.

XI-31 Wood Carving Training was offered to 6 persons at Wood Carving Industries (P) Ltd., Patan Industrial Estate.

XI-32 Stone Carving Training was offered to 5 persons under trainer Mr. Lok Raj Bajracharya, a resident of Bhinchhebal, Lalitpur.

XI-33 Sponsor of Rotary Clubs and Rotract Club. RCP sponsored Rotary Club of Patan West, Rotary Club of Yala Patan and Rotract Club of Patan, Hakha. RCP is contributing seed money about Rs 12,000 annually for Rotract Club of Patan, Hakha.

XI-34 Laboratory Equipment and Visual Aids worth US\$ 3200 were made available for Balodaya School at Kanibahal, Lalitpur Municipality with contribution from Rotary Club of Branchburg, District 7510, USA - US\$ 1600 and Rotary Foundation - US\$ 1600 under RI Matching Grant No. 5008.

XI-35 Hospital Beds and Furnitures for Nepal Orthopaedic Hospital, Jorpati, Kathmandu worth US\$12,800 was made available with contribution from Rotary Club of Mount Baker, RI District 5050, USA - US\$ 6400 and Rotary Foundation - US\$ 6400 under RI Matching Grant No.6042.

XI - 36 Vocational Training Fund of Rs 100,000 was created and deposited in fixed account in the bank. It was initiated with transfer of some fund from education fund, use of sunshine fund and contribution from club members.

1996-1997 President: Rtn Vishnu Prasad Dhital XI-37

Donation to Prime Minister's Flood Relief Fund. A sum of Rs 12,000 was raised from RCP members and donated to Prime Ministers Flood Relief Fund.

XI-38 Donation to Cancer Care Hospital, Bhaktapur. It is a Rotary International 3H Grant Project. Contributors are - \$1,000 each from 5 Rotary Clubs in the Valley (Kathmandu, Patan, Kathmandu Mid-town, Kathmandu North and Patan West); NRs 5.5 million from Ministry of Health, HMG; NRs 2.5 million from Nepal Cancer Relief Society. The Clubs in United Kingdom raised \$20,000 including \$6,000 from Rotary Club of Mansfield and \$5,000 from RI District 1220. The Rotary Foundation granted \$ 353,025 under 3-H Grant which includes cost of buying a new Cobalt Radiotherapy machine. The hospital is currently in satisfactory operation.

XI-39 Donation of 10 Sewing Machine to Rotract Club of Patan. RCP handed over 10 sewing machines worth about Rs 45,000 donated by Rotary Club of Delhi Mid-town, India to Rotract Club of Patan to run training course on sewing.

XI-40 Donation of Ambulance and Fire Fighting Vehicle. RCP

coordinated the handed over of ambulance to Mayor of Bhaktapur Municipality and fire fighting vehicle to Mayor of Banepa Municipality by His Excellency Dr C. Barth, Ambassador of Federal Republic of Germany to Nepal. The vehicles were donated by Rotary Clubs of Germany.

XI-41 Thulo Parsel Water Supply Project was successfully implemented at Thulo Parsel Village Kavre District. A total of 97 private connection to each house hold and 76 toilets were constructed under the Project to benefit about 1000 persons. Contributors were - US\$13,000 (District 6250, 4 clubs in District 6250 which included Rotary Clubs of Denver Mile High and Eau Clair Noon and 1 club in District 5450), about Rs 50,000 from RCP, US\$ 13,000 from Rotary Foundation under Matching grant No. 6411 and 1,500 mandays of voluntary labour from the local people.

A cheque of Indian Rupee 506,000 was received on June 20, 2001 only and handed over to Patan Hospital on June 22, 2001.

XV-52 School for Mentally Retarded people at Bandipur RCP in collaboration with Mentally Retarded Children Association of Nepal established a school for mentally retarded people at Bandipur. RCP arranged a contribution of Rs 10,000 for the school out of remaining fund of project.....

XV-53 Awareness on Mentally Retardation Training Program. RCP in collaboration with Mentally Retarded Children Association of Nepal conducted Awareness on mentally retardation training program for 60 social workers of the locality and the parents of mentally retarded children.

XV-54 Training Programs. a) Six month training on **Power Glass Making** was given to 2 girls at Nepal Optical Industries, Patan Industrial Estate, who got employment in the same industry. b) Training were given to unprivileged women on **Stone Carving** at the residence of Miss Surya Bajracharya. c) 18 people at Dukuchhap VDC were trained on **Sewing and Vegetable Farming Technique** through Rotract Club of Patan. d) 8 poor ladies were trained on **Knitting** through Nari Sewa Kendra.

XV-55 Distribution of Clothes. Clothes were distributed to 90 poor women and children of Dukuchhap through Rotract Club of Patan.

XV-56 Support to Niten Niketan School. A sum of Rs 6,000 was provided to support Niten Niketan School.

Ongoing Projects:

Senior Citizen Home and Girl's Hostel Project (XI-42) – construction ongoing and management plan discussed the operation plan. **Scholarship to Poor Students (VII-26) –** Fund swelled to Rs 1.6509 million and scholarship distributed to 122 students. **Nepal Orthopaedic Hospital (VII-27):** Hospital is in operation.

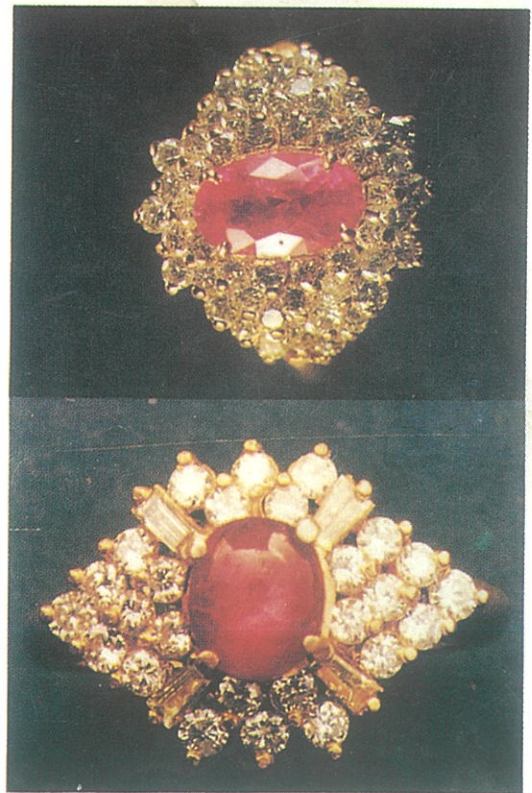
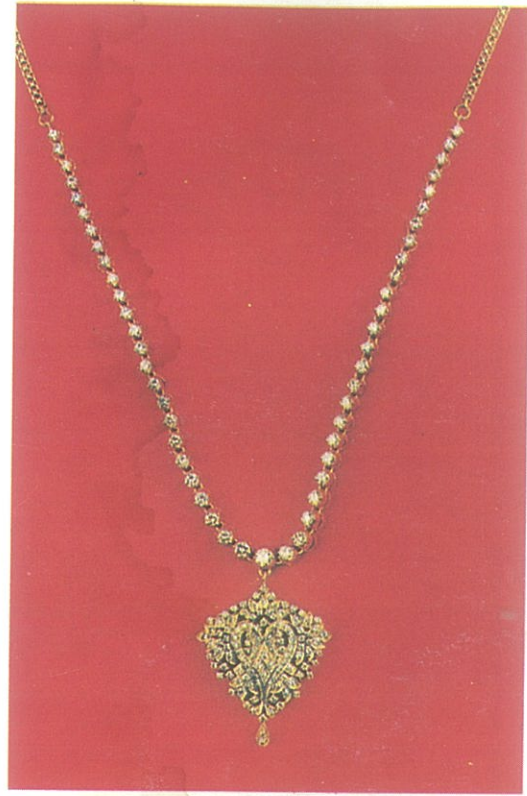
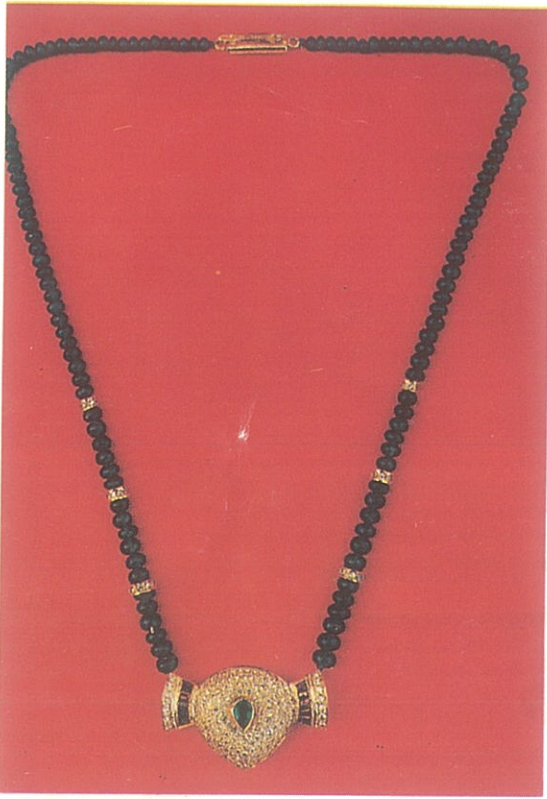
