



Service above Self
Paul P. Harris 1869-1947

Born 19-Apr-1868 Died 27-Jan-1947

Paul P. Harris was born at Racine, Wisconsin, USA on April 19, 1868. A man with varied experiences, he received the Bachelor of Physical Culture and LLD degrees from the University of Vermont and the LLB degree from the University of Iowa. He was later awarded a honorary PhD in 1933 by the University of Vermont.

He worked as a newspaper reporter, a business college teacher, a cowboy and a salesman for a marble and granite concern, before finally settling down in Chicago as a lawyer in 1896. In July 1910 he married Jean Thompson, a Scottish girl and a co-member of the Chicago prairie club.

The first Rotary Club was formed on February 23, 1905 by Paul Harris with Sylvester Schiele - a coal merchant, Gustavus Loehr - a mining engineer and Hiram Shorey - a merchant tailor, to bring together business and professional men in friendship and fellowship. This first club meeting formed the nucleus for the thousands of Rotary clubs that were later organised throughout the world. These new clubs were called "Rotary" because members met in rotation in their various places of business.

Paul Harris was elected President in the First Rotary Convention for the year 1910-11. He was then re-elected

President for 1911-12 of the National association of Rotary Clubs. Their bulletin came to be known as "The National Rotarian."

Elected President Emeritus of Rotary International in 1912, he was active in Rotary until his death on 27-Jan-1947.

First and foremost, let us Celebrate Rotary by putting Service Above Self.I hope that you will share this celebratory spirit with our entire Rotary family and everyone who has been touched by Rotary — our Ambassadorial Scholars, Rotaractors and Interactors, Youth Exchange Students, GSE team members, and the many thousands of people whose lives have been enhanced by our humanitarian efforts. Let us also invite the communities we serve to join in our celebration. The Centennial Community Projects are an excellent way to publicize the Rotary Centennial locally and leave a lasting memento of this anniversary in thousands of communities worldwide.

The positive publicity surrounding the Rotary Centennial will no doubt raise awareness of and interest in Rotary among potential members, making 2004-05 an ideal time to strengthen our membership. We must also continue the retention efforts of recent years, actively involving current members in club projects and maintaining Family of Rotary committees to promote an environment of concern and caring within our clubs. We have seen how important a stable and growing membership was to Rotary's first century of service. Let us make every effort to secure our future by retaining active, committed Rotarians and increasing their numbers.

A hundred years is an important milestone — one that few organizations reach. It signifies that Rotary is doing something right and that the need for Rotary service remains strong. 

Report on Club Activities for the Rotary Year 2003 - 04

It is my pleasure to prepare this annual report on Club Activities for the Rotary Year 2003/04. Despite busy schedules, all the members of Rotary club of Patan have been successfully implementing various projects and activities undertaken under the guidance of board of directors. I am very much obliged to inform that the entire club members had supported and cooperated with me to run our club meetings smoothly. So I thank from the core of my heart to all the club members for "Lending their Hands". Here is the brief annual report on the projects and activities undertaken by the Rotary Club of Patan for the year 2003/04:-

Category: CLUB SERVICE

1. Installation Ceremony.

a) The Rotary Year starts from 1st July 2003. 18th installation ceremony was held on 14th July 2003. During this year when an African national was the RI President for the first time, Rotary Club of Patan thought it appropriate to hear from a development worker from Africa at the Installation. Accordingly, we had Mr. Bill Musake, a national of Uganda, who was serving in Nepal as UNFPA representative, as our Chief Guest. This helped us in strengthening our relation with the UN system and we had two other Guest Speakers from UN, namely, Representatives of UNICEF and WHO.

b) Another aspect of the Installation Ceremony was that it served as the fund raising event also for the Scholarship program. Three lakhs and twenty one thousand rupees was raised that evening alone by Rotarians of the Club and Annes. The impact is that today the Club Rotarian contributors' number has gone up from 12 to 37 i.e. 90.5% coverage.

2. Club Program and Meeting:

- a) As per our program schedule we had published and distributed four quarterly calendars. Accordingly we had performed the following activities:-
 - Eight business meetings with five club assembly,
 - Classification talk from six club members,
 - Twelve board meetings including two joint board meetings and one special board meeting.
 - On August 09, 2003 our club has celebrated Soil Conservation and Tree Plantation Program at Balkumari Madhyamik Bidhyalaya at Sunakothi VDC. The chief guest of the program was Honorable Serbendra Nath Sukla, Minister of Forest and tourism.
 - Clubs COTS Seminar, ICM on membership development and retention, the Rotary Foundation, Rotary Awareness Quiz Competition, World understanding and peace "Conflict Resolution" and District Award Ceremony.
 - Two Rotary fellowship family picnic at Bandipur and Godavari.
 - Our club arranged Intercity Meeting in December as a "Rotary Family Month", Fun Fair Food Festival with entertainment program, co-hosted by RC Tripurewsar and RC Yala.
 - Sunshine collection is Rs. 75643.00 (Seventy five thousand six hundred forty three) from our regular club meetings.
 - Twenty-eight talk programs from various personalities on different topics were organized.
- b) The club meetings were held very regularly despite bandhs and general strikes and were never cancelled. A special event was also organized to mark the 900th meeting of the club which was coordinated by the Past Presidents. This also lead to the formation of a council of past presidents to advise the club presidents and executives on policy matters. The DG gave away Letters of Appreciation to past presidents.

3. Club Bulletin and Magazine:

The weekly club bulletin, "Lalit Dhara" is being published regularly under the editorship of Senior Rtn. Kamal Mani Dixit; not one single issue is missed. In addition to supplying various Rotary Information, the bulletin also serves as the minutes of the weekly meetings. Likewise we have also published the 18th "Lalit Dhara souvenir Issues" with Rtn. Kedar Bhakta Shrestha as coordinator. The Club has published 1000 copies of "Rotary Thatta" book sponsored by Rtn. Kamal Mani Dixit. The proceeds from the sale of this book will go to RC Patan.

4. Club Extension:-

The Club sponsored one more new club i.e; Rotary Club of Nepal Gunj Mid town recently Chartered. The G.S.R. from our club is Rtn. P.P. Dr. Bhisma Raj Prasai. We have sponsored nine clubs so far and has thus contributed to our own District formation in an impressive way.

5. Membership Growth:-

The club has inducted two new members namely Rtn. Padam Lal Maharjan and Rtn. Khrushchev Shrestha.

6. Fellowship and Inter Club relationship:-

- a) Fellowship is a strong bond of Rotary Club of Patan. In addition to the regular fellowships at the weekly meetings and Executive Board Meetings, the club organized two picnics for its members, one at Bandipur and second on the occasion of New Year B.S.2061 at Godavari. Eight special fellowships, including one with a cultural programme, were also organized during the visit of a team of 11 Rotarians and 9 Interact students from USA. Likewise, several Fellowships were celebrated at the residence of the club members on various matters.
- b) Rotary Club of Patan organized **two joint meetings** with Rotary Club of Kopundole and Rotary Club of Mahaboudha.
- c) Inter-city meeting: Rotary Club of Patan organized the first ever Intercity Meeting (ICM) on Rotary Family month as Rotary Family Fun, Fair, Food Festival with entertainment programme, co-hosted by Rotary Club of Tripurewsar and Rotary Club of Yala.
- d) At the initiation of our club, Presidents of Rotary Club in Lalitpur meet every second month. They have jointly undertaken four projects so far, one of which namely Rotary Welcome Plaque at Bagmati Bridge has been completed.

7. Participation in District Event:-

 Our club bagged the largest participation awards including winner of Rotary quiz at the ICM on Rotary Awareness Quiz Competition.


8. Public Image:-

Category: VOCATIONAL SERVICE

Among four avenues for the rotary international "Vocational service is the way Rotary fosters and supports the application of the ideal of services in the pursuits of all vocations".

1. Vocational Training:

- a) As part of teacher training, computer training was provided to 26 teachers from various public schools. More than 2500 students at various public schools also have gained some computer skills.
- Our club has arranged training for six trainees in b) handicrafts, wood and stone carving. Our fellow Rotarian Santa Kumar Shrestha has given a word for two persons to give jungle guide training. One trainee is undergoing airways ticketing training.

2. Women Empowerment: -

Education empowers women. Hence 57 % of our total scholarship is provided to girl students.

3. Vocational Award:

In recognition of the invaluable service rendered to the cancer patients, Rotary Club of Patan has conferred Vocational Award, together with a cash contribution of Rs 5,000 to Staff Nurse Mrs. Shanti Bajracharya of Patan Hospital.

4. Rotary and Rotaract relationship: -

Rotary and Rotaract work together in the implementation of various projects like computers, training of trainers, health camp, polio plus, update rotary website and so on so forth.



Category: COMMUNITY SERVICE

1. Literacy:-

- a) Rotary Club of Patan has increased the number of scholarships. It provides scholarship to 326 student from this year compared to last year which was 188. The scholarship is provided to the economically deprived and needy public school children only. The scholarship recipients are 57 percent girls and 28 percent from under privileged families.
- b) Resource Mobilization: Scholarships are provided out of the interest generated from an endowment fund and annual contributions. A fund in the Endowment has increased from Rs 21 lakhs in June 2003 to more than Rs 27 lakhs. Similarly, funds in the annual contribution has risen from Rs 60,000 to nearly Rs 200.000. This substantial increase in funds has enabled us to allocate Rs. 400,000 for scholarships this year.

2. Information Technology (Digital Divide Project):-

Rotary Club of Patan has handed over 173 computers to 23 public schools for computer literacy, on two different occasions. Funding was provided under two matching grant projects- one with Rotary Club of Branchberg, USA and another one with four Rotary clubs of Washington, USA. 27 computers were received from Rotary club of UK also. About 2500 students and 26 teachers were benefit from this project.

b) This is the first time in the history of Nepal that so many computers have been donated for the community service. This new project will narrow the digital divide gap between the haves and the have-nots in school children in the country.

3. Mother and Child Health:-

Rotary Club of Patan has provided vehicle, computers, various training aids like films, posters and flip charts and birthing kits amounting to Rs 22 lakhs from a Matching Grant project, implemented by MCHP. The project mission is to reduce the infant and maternal mortality in Nepal In addition it provides training for birth attendants and community health volunteers.

4. Service to the Physically Challenged:-

The Deaf school has been provided with 16 computers and a computer teacher for two years to enable the students at the school to learn computer skills. Fifteen Rotarians from RC Patan, 11 Rotarians and 9 students from Washington assisted in cleaning and painting of the school premises.

5. Nepal Orthopaedic Hospital:-

6. Rotary Health:-

a) A health care clinic has been established in Godavari effective from 25 th October, 2003.



- b) Some x-ray plates & related equipments to the Bhaktapur Cancer Hospital as well as a cheque of Rs. 70,000 were handed over to the President of the Hospital Management for cancer Upchar Dan Kosh for treatment of patients who cannot afford to pay. RC Patan had colleted these resources from external sources from the initiation of PP Rtn. Puskar Man Shakya. Some Rs. 60,000 has also been collected from club Rotarians.
- c) Health Program and Camp: Rotary "Save the Children Heart Program" as well as Rotary Deworming Program were conducted in different schools of Lalitpur District with initiation of community service director Rtn. Dr. Prakash Raj Regmi.




Likewise, 2 Blood Pressure recording trainings were provided to members of Inner Wheel Club of Patan and Rotaract Club of Patan.

A Rotary health camp was organized last March 2004 in Sunakothi VDC, Lalitpur.15 doctors and medical personnels provided their expert services in several specialities. A total of 267 patient were examined and medicines valued at Rs. 30.000 were distributed free of cost.

7. Solar and Sanitation project:-

Rotary Club of Patan has supplied the Sunakothi Village residents with some Solar dryers, Rocket stoves, Solar Water Disinfector and Composting toilet out of US \$ 3000 WCS project from Rotary Club of Los Altos, USA. The main objective is to reduce the use of forest wood and thereby preventing deforestation and to introduce healthier life style in the community's daily lives.

RC Patan has provided 28 % of the scholarships for the underprivileged children. A programme has also been started in Dukuchhap (Danwar) village to bring in all "dropout" school children to school so that the village could achieve 100 % literacy.

Rotary District - Nepal

Rtn.Gopal Rajbhandary is the Chief Counselor to the District Governor, and is the most Senior Rotarian in Nepal. He is often known as the pillar and bhismapitamaha of the Rotary movement in Nepal. He was recently interviewed by our President Rtn. Siba Bhakta Rajbhandary regarding the formation of a Rotary District in Nepal.



"As successful our Clubs have been, imagine how much more we could do for those in need if Nepal had its own Rotary International District."

Please brief us on the concept of the Rotary District and Rotary in Nepal.

Rotary International began as the world's first professional and social service club in 1905. As more people became interested in joining Rotary, Clubs were formed by RI. In time, RI formed districts so that clubs could work with one another and better serve the common needs of their communities. Today, it is a worldwide organization committed to serving communities in need. As we enter our centennial year, over 1.2 million members, in at least 160 countries, make up what we now know as Rotary International. Currently, there are over 31,000 Rotary Clubs, which belong to 129 Rotary districts.

Nepal's first Rotary Club was chartered in 1959. Today, Nepal can boast that it has 65 Rotary Clubs, made up of about 2,000 members. Our Clubs provide immeasurable health, education, and humanitarian assistance to our communities. Rotary Clubs of Nepal all currently fall under the jurisdiction of District 3290, which also serves parts of West Bengal and Andaman and Nicobar Islands. We have always had a solid relationship with the clubs that belong to our District. Our team members have shown us guidance and support when we needed it.

Why should Nepal be awarded its own Rotary International District?

Nepal is a sovereign country.

- Nepal has fulfilled all the set criteria required for it to have its own Rotary International District.
- District 3290 is the largest within Rotary International. Even if the District Governor were to visit a Club every 2 days of his Rotary year, he would barely have visited all of the clubs within his district. With travel between Nepal and the Governor's office in Kolkata, India being expensive and often unreliable, visits to Clubs in Nepal have been bypassed.
- Travel between Kolkata and Nepal is difficult for the District Governor as well as for Nepali Rotarians. If a District was awarded to Nepal, many more Nepali Rotarians would attend events at the District Governor's office. Currently very few of us are able to participate in important meetings which are mostly held in Kolkata.
- 115 of the 180 District 3290 Clubs are located in West Bengal. It is only natural that programmes that are planned for the Rotary year concentrate on the problems within West Bengal. Nepal has its own complications, which are often left unattended by the District.

When will Nepal be awarded its own Rotary International District?

I believe that we will have a Rotary District of our own within the next two years. Early this year, we were notified that the Rotary Redistricting Committee has favorably reviewed our application and passed it on to the RI Board for a final decision.

It is only a matter of procedure that has to be observed before Nepal is awarded its much-awaited status. Meanwhile, we should ensure that all our Rotary Clubs pay R. I. Dues on time, continue our efforts to form more clubs, while ensuring membership growth and retention in other clubs. We are on the right track in our leadership development plan and are fully confident that we have the necessary capacity to manage Nepal District on our own.

For the year 2003/2004, the results have been computer literacy oriented. Till this date, we have distributed 173 computers to different schools of Patan and Kathmandu as well as to some in Bhaktapur districts. Not only the computers were distributed

but training on Computer Literacy program was also conducted by the Patan Rotract clubs to two of the teachers of all receivable schools.

This year, we will be able to give more training to more teachers of computer receiving High Schools and the venue will be at Patan High School & Durbar High School, which will be considered the focal point for trainings to be provided to teachers of other receivable schools by such professionals. The Patan Rotary club will also be providing a two year salary for the teachers of Patan High School & Durbar High School who will be giving such trainings for teachers, all internet connections, and other miscellaneous costs with support from Belleview Rotary Club, Emerald city Rotary Clubs and of matching grants received from Rotary International. A teacher's salary for two years has also been provided to the Deaf School.

The media coverage of this dedicated program of the Rotary has increased its demand and thus popularity among other government schools as well in the whole of the country. Thus I urge all Rotary Clubs of Nepal to look for such projects, through national or international Rotary aid, and support it for the better of the education system of Nepal. I hope the concerned ministries and department of His Majesty's Government will help and support this endeavor of the Rotarians of Nepal.

Our children are the future of the country. Better and quality education to them shall only help benefit and develop our country, a dream of every patriot Nepali. Thus, I would like to request all Rotary clubs in Nepal to go for this kind of projects which helps to strengthen and support the educational programs of education ministries. Let's take these projects as National Projects of all Nepalese Rotarians. I welcome all Rotarians friends to share my experience about what we have done to make these projects a success .May all deprived and poor children's too gets the opportunity to learn the computer education.



A Rotary Initiation



Why a new heart hospital in Nepal?

Today throughout the world more than 12 millions deaths per years occur as a result of heart diseases. More than 50 % deaths per year are accountable to heart diseases. In Nepal 10 % of the population suffer from heart disease. At present the number one killer- "Coronary Heart Disease" has emerged in Nepal as the major heart problem. Rheumatic Heart Disease affecting children of school going age is still prevalent in high number in the community. WHO has forecasted that by the year 2015 South Asia countries will be facing an epidemic of heart disease taking away life of millions of people of the region. In the last decade in Nepal, heart diseases have increase by 5 fold affecting more and more young adults.

Despite rapid increase in the number of heart patients, existing facilities for diagnosis & treatment of heart diseases in Nepal are minimal. Whatever available facilities are concentrated in the capital city of Kathmandu only. Sahid Ganga Lal National Heart Centre located centre in the entire country with a papulation of 23 million. Due to high case overload, heart patient has to wait for more than a year for Surgery in this Centre.

Treatment in private hospitals is very expensive which is out of reach of the majority of Nepalese people. Due to lack of treatment facilities & high cost of treatment heart patients are dying in large numbers. Thousand upon thousands of Nepalese suffering form heart diseases will directly benefit by the establishment of the proposed Nepal Heart Hospital.

Where will this proposed hospital be located?

Although a big submetropolitian city, heart care facilities in Patan, Lalitpur are minimal. People of Dhapakhel, Lalitpur are very interested to provide land for this hospital project. Efforts for acquiring around 8-10 ropanis -1.1-1.3 Acres) of land in that locality is in process.

What sort of Medical facilities will be made available in the proposed hospital?


This will be 100 bedded state-of- the Art hospital with all the diagnostic and treatment facilities for heart disease (ECG, CHO, TMT, Holter, Amb, Stress Echo, MRI for heart etc.), closed & open heart surgery facilities, Cathlab with Angiography &



Angioplasty, EP study of heart etc. Preventive programmes and Rehabilitation programmes will also be Launched by the hospital.

Who is going to work this project?

All the Rotary Clubs in Lalitpur and a NVO working for the welfare of the heart patient for the last 16 years- Nepal Heart Foundation have agreed to work together for this project. Lalitpur heat Clinic established 10 years back and being run by Nepal Heart Foundation, Lalitpur will be the Cooperating Agency For this project, All the Rotary Clubs in Nepal will be supporting this project. It is expected that the government of Nepal, Rotary Clubs around the world and Rotary Foundation will put their maximum efforts to launch and complete this project.



Introduction: Basic education, though a fundamental right of every child, is still a distant dream to many poor children in Nepal, one of the Least Developed countries in the world, with an average per capita income of \$250.

Although the government and several international and private organizations have made considerable efforts, they still fall short of the target, set by the government, to provide universal basic education to all.

Humble Beginning and Remarkable Growth: Rotary Club of Patan (RCP), one of the oldest social organizations, initiated an education program in 1989 to provide scholarships to poor and needy children in rural areas. The scholarships are provided a) from the interests gained from the Scholarship Endowment Fund, deposited in a local bank, and b) annual donations generated through contributions of the Rotarians and philanthropists. The fund has swelled from a modest Rs 100,000 in 1991/1992 to over Rs 2.7 million in Endowment fund and over Rs 0.2 m as annual contribution. Similarly, scholarships which were limited to 10 students only in 1991/ 1992 has increased substantially to 337 (planned) in 04/05. Tables 1,2 and 3 reflect fund growth, contributors and schools and students receiving scholarship respectively. 400,000 is being distributed during this school year (04-05) for scholarships. A total of 566 school children, of which 55% are girls and 30% dalit students, in 42 public schools have received scholarship till Year 2003/2004. To this list, 153 new students will be added in this Year 04/05.

Scholarship amount: Scholarship amounting to just Rs 800 to 1500 a year is meant to supplement for the continuation of education of children from economically deprived families. Students are selected in Class VI for scholarship and they continue to receive it till they graduate from school at Class X, unless they failed in a class.

Community based program provides scholarships to children who had discontinued their education but wish to join the school. 62 children in Dukuchhap VDC receive scholarship under this program.

Selection Procedure of New Students: New students are selected in Class VI. To facilitate the selection process, the

Headmaster prepares a list of 8 students. RCP Fund Committee Member personally interviews all eight students and selects 4 of them, based mainly on economic condition of the family – orphan, profession of parents, members in family generating income and enrolment in school. The selected students continue to receive scholarship until they graduate from school in class X, unless they fail in a class.

Issues Identified: Concern has been expressed by some that the scholarship amount of Rs 100 a month is too small. However, it should be remembered that the scholarship is just a supplement and need not cover all the expenses required for education of a child. Our target is to provide scholarship for 1000 students. Let us achieve this target first; we can then

consider increasing the amount.

Computer Literacy Program: The Fund has contributed US\$ 1250 toward two Matching Grant projects for computer literacy. 173 computers have been distributed to public schools under this

program.

ललितधाराको कथा

– रो. कमलमणि दीक्षित



पाटन रोटरी क्लबको साप्ताहिक बुलेटिन 'ललितधारा'को कुरा गर्दा नेपालको पैलो रोटरी क्लबको बुलेटिनलाई सम्छनुपर्छ। कुरो त्यहीँबाट उठाउनुपर्छ। मैले त्यसो गर्नुपर्नाको कारण छ। कुनै जमानामा, केही काल म त्यस बुलेटिनका सम्पादक समेत भएको थिएँ। नेपालमा रोटरीको प्रवेश सन् १८५८ मा रोटरी क्लब अफ काठमाण्डूको स्थापना साथ भएको हो तर यस क्लबले आफ्नो बुलेटिनको प्रकाशनको थालनी कैलेदेखि गऱ्यो यकीन थाहा छैन। शायद कसैलाई पनि सम्छना छैन यो कुरा। भए पनि, मैले राखेको अभिलेखवमोजिम सन् १८६७ तिरदेखि काठमाण्डू रोटरी क्लबले 'याक बेल' नाम दिएर आफ्नो 'विक्ली बुलेटिन' प्रकाशन गर्न थालेको हो। त्यस बेला यसका एडिटर थिए रो. एस के दत्त । 'याक बेल' भन्ने नामचाहिँ शायद रो. रवर्ट फ्लेमिडले दिएका हुन्। शुरुमा केही वर्ष साइक्लोस्टाइलमा छापिएर वीचमा सन् १८६८ मा 'याक वेल' प्रेसमा छापिएर पनि निस्केको थियो तर पुन: यो साइक्लोस्टाइल मै फर्किएका रहेछ। मैले सन् १८७० मा रोटरी प्रेवश गर्दा यो 'याक बेल' निकै अनियमित थियो जस्तो लाछ । किनभने सेकेटरी र एडिटर एकै जना थिए- रो. डा. फ्लेमिङ। म काठमाण्डू रोटरी क्लवका मेम्बर भएपछि रो. डा. फ्लेमिडले 'याक वेल'को जिम्मा मलाई लगाइहाले। मैले यसलाई नियमित बनाउन प्रेसवाट छापेर निकाल्ने कुरा गरें, हुन्छ भिनयो। छाप्ने खर्च के गर्ने भने। मैले एक पेज विज्ञापन रोटरियनहरूले नै दिनुपर्छ भनें। सबैले माने। अनि सन् १८७० नवेम्वर १० तारिख (२५ कार्तिक २०२७) मा म एडिटर भएर पहिलो 'याक बेल' निस्क्यो । त्यो अंक छ मसँग । त्यसअघि बुलेटिनमा अंक हाल्ने गरिन्नथ्यो। मैले पहिलो पल्ट नं. १०१ हालेर शुरु गरें 'याक बेल'लाई। तर त्यहाँ मैले 'याक बेल'को नेपाली अनुवाद 'चौंरीको घण्टी' भन्ने नाम पनि थिपदिएको थिएँ सानो अक्षरमा। साथै एक या दुई वाक्य नेपाली पनि जड्न थालेको थिएँ मैले प्रत्येक अंकमा। त्यसपछि मैले 'याक वेल'लाई एउटा 'माष्ट हेड' पनि चाहिन्छ भनी मेरा मित्र, साका प्रकाशनका कलाकार टेकवीर मुखियालाई भनी एउटा डिजाइन गराएँ। त्यसलाई क्लवले स्वीकार गऱ्यो अनि त्यसको ब्लक बनाएर छाप्न थालियो। 'याक वेल'को पूर्णांक १६० मा त्यो पहिलो पटक छापिएको थियो। त्यो अंक पनि मसँग सुरक्षित छ मदन पुरस्कार पुस्तकालयमा।

'याक बेल' छापेर निकालन थाल्दा मैले प्रत्येक अंकमा नेपालीका एकदुई वाक्य छाप्न थालेको थिएँ भनें। त्यसमा मेरो अर्को स्वार्थ थियो, मेरो पुस्तकालयको (अङ्ग्रेजी याक बेललाई म पुस्तकालयमा दर्ता गर्न सिक्तनं थिएँ। तर एक-दुई ओटा वाक्य मात्र भए पिन नेपाली छापिने 'चौरीको घण्टी'लाई नेपाली पित्रका भनी भित्र्याउन मिल्थ्यो। मदन पुरस्कार पुस्तकालयको नियम थियो त्यो। त्यसै हुँदा मैले त्यित चलाखी गरेको थिएँ। 'चौरीको घण्टी'को त्यो पिहलो अंक लगी मैले पुस्तकालयको सूचीमा चढाएँ। त्यसको नम्बर ४८४ परेको थियो। सम्ब्रुच्छ। 'रोटरी क्लब अफ काठमाण्डू'का साप्ताहिक मिटिङका 'निर्णयहरु' (मिनिट्स) छाप्ने पर्ने भएको र बुधबार त्यो क्लबमा पुग्नुपर्ने भएकाले आइतवार सम्म त्यो 'मिनिट्स' मकहाँ आइपुगेन भने म शान्तभवनमा डा. फ्लोमिङलाई फोन गरिहाल्थें। यसरी ताकिता गर्दा डा.फ्लोमिङ मसँग कर्कनुको सट्टा प्रसन्न भएर भन्थे— "एस, कमल, डाट्स ह्वाट यु शुड इ (हो कमल यस्तै गर्नुपर्छ)।"

मलाई सेक्रेटरी रो. गणेशले मैले अर्के क्लबको बुलेटिनको कुरा गरेर पेज भरें। क्षमा चाहन्छु। अब आऊँ 'ललितधारा'मा।

Vocational Service and Awards

Vocational Service: The responsibility spelt out in the second part of Rotary's Object is the basis of Rotary's Second Avenue of Service – Vocational Service. It calls for Rotarians to apply high ethical standards to their business or professions to recognize the inherent worthiness of all useful occupations, and to view their respective occupations as an opportunity to serve society. All Rotarians have an important responsibility to their vocation – termed as classification in Rotary.

Ethical standards in business have been the concern of Rotary service since its founding in 1905. It is interesting to note that while Rotary's object has evolved over the years, the issues promoted in its second part were included in earliest incarnation, as two of the five objects adopted at the 1912 Convention. Although the principles governing the role of Rotarians in the workplace evolved early in the organization's history, it was not until later that they were given the tools to achieve these goals. The first of these "The 4-Way Test" was the sole guide for Rotarians in their business life almost 50 years.

Declaration for Rotarians in Business and Professions: In 1989, the Council of Legislation adopted a declaration of "Rotarians in Business and Professions" to provide more specific guidelines for the high ethical standards called for. As Rotarians engaged in Business or professions, they are expected to:-

- Consider their vocation to be another opportunity to serve:
- Be faithful to the letter and the spirit of ethical codes of their vocation, to the laws of their country, and to the moral standards of their community;
- Do all in their power to dignify their vocation and to promote the highest ethical standards in their chosen vocation;
- Be fair to their employer, employees, associates, competitors, customers, the public and all those with whom they have a business or professional relationship;
- Recognize the honour and respect due to all occupations which are useful to the society;
- Offer their vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in their community;
- Adhere to honesty in their advertising and in all representations to the public concerning their business or professions; and
- Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarians a privilege or advantage not normally accorded to others in a business or professional relationship.

Vocational Awards: Rotary Club of Patan (RCP), the third Rotary Club in the Kingdom of Nepal, was chartered on August 29, 1985, with an objective to promote public recognition of individuals who practice high ethical standards in their business/ professions/ careers and those who achieve

exemplary vocational excellence in their field. RCP has started to organize presentation of a Vocational Award to a person who achieve exemplary vocational excellence in his/her field since the Rotary Year 1993-1994. After 10 years of its establishment, RCP has also established a Vocational Service Fund of Rs 100,000 (Rupee One hundred Thousand in Rotary year1995-1996 with an objective to provide trainings in different vocation and profession and to present Vocational Award in each year with a Letter of Appreciation and Rs Five Thousand. Till this date, 10 Vocational Awards had been presented and 11th is being presented on 5th July 2004 as listed below:

- First Vocational Award to Mr. Vishnu Jwalanand Rajopadhyaya, a senior and dedicated school teacher, popularly known as "Nati Bajya" in Patan in the year 1993-1994.
- Second Vocational Award to a dedicated woman sweeper, Mrs Pun Maya Pode in 1994-1995;
- Third Vocational Award to an intelligent disabled teacher Mr. Amrit Ratna Shakya in 1995-1996;
- Fourth Vocational Award to a skilled metal craftman Mr. Kaji Ratna Shakya in 1996-1997;
- Fifth Vocational award to a dedicated senior staff nurse Sister Rinjay Rai in 1997-1998;
- Sixth Vocational Award to a skilled young woman stone carver, Miss Sarju Bajracharya, 1998-1999;
- Seventh Vocational Award to a young and popular Cartoonist/Artist Mr. Raja Babu Shakya in 1999-2000. Mr. Shakya is now a member of Rotary Club of Mahaboudha, Patan;
- Eight Vocational Award to a young and talented Classical Musician Mr. Suresh Bajracharya in 2000-2001;
- Ninth Vocational Award to a young skilled, talented and creative Metal Repouse Mr. Raj Kumar Shakya in 2001-2002. Mr. Shakya is also a recipient of Gorkha Dakshin Bahu Decoration from His Majesty the King and is currently a member of Rotary Club of Mahaboudha, Patan;
- Tenth Vocational Award to a senior and dedicated staff nurse Mrs. Shanti Bajracharya in 2002-2003; and





Traditional Stone Spouts in Patan




The stone spouts are marvelous creations of ancient Nepalese engineering and architectural feat. Utilizing the underground spring water, terracotta pipes buried 2 to 6 meters underground were used to carry water about one kilometer downstream. These artistically built spouts have been providing continuous flow of drinking water to various localities in the city for centuries. There are more than 40 stone spouts in the Patan city but many of them are not functioning these days due to lack of maintenance.



Thapahity spout is presently running but dries up during summer. Spouts at periphery of city, Dobikhola at west, Kumbheswor and Aluko at north, Chyasal and Sinchahity at east of city are currently serving large population. Night flow could be conserved for its efficient use.

Stone spouts were the main water sources for domestic use prior to the introduction of municipal piped water supply system in 1896 AD. Stone spouts are still supplementing the inadequate municipal piped water supplies at many city core areas.




Artistically decorated Tusha hity at Sundarichowk inside Patan Durbar is dry

In simple sense, rehabilitation of these stone spouts would supplement municipal water supply in the areas, but in the broader national perspective, it will boost up the psyche of the local people to conserve the archeological and cultural heritage of Nepal.

Laying of sewer system in the city core area had disturbed the supply conduits and drain outlets, whereas uncontrolled settlement and lack of care and maintenance had disturbed the system as whole. It is possible to rehabilitate most of these stone spouts.

Naricha hiti (adjoining photo), Sincha hiti and Nuga hiti had been running satisfactorily since their rehabilitation few years back with local initiatives. Rehabilitation work which could effectively run 6 spouts - Tusha hity, Bhandarkhal hity, Sougal, Thapa hity, Tangal hity and Lagankhel hity is ongoing through Lalitpur Heritage Conservative Group, Lalitpur Sub-metropolitan City and European Commission fund. It is difficult to have cooperation from communities involved in 6 spouts. Response from Thapahity community could have saved substantial rehabilitation works, but they think the work is being planned just to take water to Tusha hity and they could never believe that it would benefit them as well.



Continuous flow about 2lit/sec in Naricha hity in Ward No 6 of Patan. Prior to rehabilitation in 1991 through RC Patan, it was a stagnant pool due to blockage of drain outlet. Funding arrangement usually take long time to materialize.

Tens of spouts in the city, some just trickling and others dry, are waiting for rehabilitation. Resource mobilization is a tiresome effort, but the civil societies like Rotary Clubs have to take initiatives. The rehabilitation costs range from Rs 200,000 to 500,000 (about US\$ 2,500 to 7,000) for each spout.

"Nepal Orthopaedic Hospital"

It was after fifteen years of its formation and with the help of some Rotary clubs of U.S.A., Rotary Club of Patan committed itself to support in constructing an orthopaedic facility in Nepal i.e. "Nepal Orthopaedic Hospital". Nepal Orthopaedic Hospital is the only charitable, first of its kind and rotary supported orthopaedic facility in Nepal. The hospital lies in the compound of "Khagendra New Life Centre" at Jorpati, Kathmandu. After its completion, the hospital was graciously inaugurated by His Majesty King Gyanendra Bir Bikram Shah Dev and Her Majesty Queen Komal Rajya Laxmi Devi Shah on 16th April 2004.

This hospital was initially conceived as "Rotary World Community Service Project" of various rotary clubs of District 7090 U.S.A and Canada and Rotary Club of Patan and Nepal Disabled Association as local partners. Even though the hospital building was completed number of years back, the hospital could not be commissioned for operation until the provision of necessary equipment and initial running costs that was possible to obtain from different rotary clubs specially the rotary club of Maldegem, Belgium. With the untiring and dedicated efforts of Dr. Anil Bahadur Shrestha, the orthopaedic hospital finally opened its service doors to common citizens at affordable cost on 1st August 1998.

With the increasing demand and load of the patients for advance orthopaedic services, the need for the expansion of the hospital from 20 to 70 beds and the need for generating sufficient funds to sustain regular hospital operation was realized on 17th April 2003 by more than 140 Nepalese Rotarians of 22 Rotary Clubs in the presence of the Chief Guest Dr. Upendra Devkota. Consequently, with the help of different national and international Rotary clubs, international donors, German-Nepal Help Association, Foundation Help for Nepal-Holland, Association-Fennes D' Europe etc., the 70 bedded "Nepal Orthopaedic Hospital" became fully operational in April 2004. The hospital now is well manned with doctors and professional staff as well as well equipped with modern facility including computer and three modern operation theatres with AC and

one for infected cases. The operation theatres are well equipped with state of the art anaesthesia machine, brand new monitors and C-arm fluoroscopes. It also has separate recovery stations and post operative rooms.

The hospital, despite of being far from the city, has been able to provide orthopaedic services to more than 35254 outpatients and operations of more than 2992 patients uptill now.

Opening soon



Senior Citizens Home, with the objective to support the senior citizens, was built to those who are economically better, can come and stay, was planed by the Rotary Club of Patan in close co-ordination with the Germany based Help Nepal Association. Dr. B.N. Rana and Mrs. Rana have contributed through their efforts to build the Home and Honorable Former Prime Minister Mr. Girija Prasad Koirala inaugurated the building after completion. 





INNER WHEEL CLUB OF PATAN ANNUAL REPORT ON CLUB ACTIVITIES

Reported by Anne Mithila Rajbhandary President 2003-2004

Background

The Inner Wheel Club of Patan has been in existence since October 14, 1994. As we come to being a decade old, we are proud to make the friendship positive in the 2003-2004 service year. What an honour it is to be part of one of the largest organizations of women, working in harmony with members around the world to provide service to others. In addition to having twelve months of energetic activities, a key strategy for us has been working with others; networking with various groups to raise funds, lending a hand to plans others have had, and supporting their efforts. One of our greatest accomplishments this year has been to more than double the amount of our contribution to Rotary Club of Patan Scholarship Program from Rs. 50,000 to Rs. 110,000. This past year we have been successful in strengthening our partnerships, resulting in improved community service.

Our Activities

In 2003-2004 our members continued to work tirelessly to help those less fortunate than us. We concentrated on providing assistance to the community regarding healthcare and education. Our alliances with organizations at home and abroad allowed us to expand the services we provide to those in need. As always, our main focus remains improving the lives of our fellow sisters. Some highlights regarding our works this year are:

Health

Gynaecology Health Camp

We organized a one-day gynaecological check up at Ikhaluku Health Clinic, providing Pap Smear tests to the 60 economically deprived women who attended the clinic. Our thanks to the Ikhaluku Health Clinic, Dr. Roshini Amatya, Dr. Hira Dangol, and Dr. Mita Shrestha, for donating their invaluable time, space, and voluntary spirit to this program.



- Rtn. Dr. Prakash Raj Regmi provided Blood Pressure Recording Training to our members.
- Provision of Medicines In conjunction with the Rotary Club of Patan, we organized a Health Camp at Sunakothi Village and distributed medicine worth upwards of Rs. 5,000 to needy patients.
- Eye Camp We partnered with the Community Based Rehabilitation of Patan and provided Rs. 7,022. 61 for medicines needed by poor patients at the Eye Camp.
- Support to Cancer Patients
 We provided Rs. 40,000 to Bhaktapur Cancer Hospital for the purchase of a computer, to be used to register and organize patient data, resulting in improved quality of care.

Education

• Scholarships and School Supplies In alliance with the Scholarship Program of Rotary Club of Patan, we continue to support four female students at Adarsha Kanya Nikitan High School as we have in the past. This year we are proud to announce that we have provided scholarships to an additional four girls at Madan Memorial High School.

Supply of School Furniture

Through our relationship with the International Ladies
Bridge Group, we provided 26 benches and tables for
Kindergarten and Class 1 students at Saraswati Middle
School in Lele at a cost of Rs. 35,100. In this remote and
low-income village, students were previously sitting on
the floor while learning their lessons.

• Construction of Bathrooms for Female Students Through our association with the Westchester, New York (USA) division of the United Nations Womens Group, US\$ 1,000 has been sanctioned and is on its way to Nepal. These monies will be used to build latrines for female students at Sarswati Middle School, where young girls would not go to the bathroom for hours because older students would be using the few latrines that existed.

Future Projects

 A proposal to help Community Based Rehabilitation of Patan with additional funding for other projects is currently under review by the United Nations Womens Group of Westchester, New York (USA).

Contact with other Inner Wheel Clubs

The Past President of the Inner Wheel Club of Vellore North met with me to learn about our Club activities, and we exchanged Club Banners. We hope to maintain our good relations with other Clubs.

Guest Speaker

Mr. Nanda Ram Baidya, Rotary Club of Tripereshwor, enlightened our group regarding micro income generation in Nepal, and the use, possibilities and benefits to poor Nepali women. Small amounts of monies are lent to groups of women to undertake cottage industry projects. The women ideally work as a team and encourage each others' success, ensuring that the funds and minimal interest are repaid within the allotted time and the women are given loans again in the future. Rotary Club of Branchburg, New Jersey (USA) has shown interest in supporting this venture.




Avenue: Club Service






