Participation and Fellowship:

The RCP has had an outstanding participation in the regular meetings that on average reached more than 70 percent (highest 86% and minimum 55% during Nepal Bandh). The RCP President did substantial research to invite well known and appropriate personalities as Guest Speakers during two regular club meetings a month.



The innovative quarterly family fellowships based upon a clustering of members' birthdays continued to be a grand success with an average participation of 40 members of the RCP family. The annual family outing this year was in Nagarkot with the participation of 30 members of the RCP family.




In addition, the Charter Night celebrations had a participation of a total of 70 participants including the District Governor and many distinguished District level officials.

Board Meetings and Club Assembly:

The RCP successfully completed 12 Board Meetings and 5 Club Assembly.






Matching Grant (MG) Service Projects:

During the Rotary Year 2011/12 the Rotary Club of Patan completed three MG projects with the total funding of US \$128,989. The Club also established four new MG projects with the total amount of US\$188,419.

MG 75113 Equipment to Nepal Orthopedic Hospital: The Project started in April 2011 with the total funding of US\$55,957 and officially ended in May 2012.

In addition to the RC Patan, the other parters to this project were: District 3292, RC Maldegem, District 1620 (Luc Salens, Belgium) and RC Aabt, District 1620. The funds were used in providing beds, furniture and washing machines to Nepal Orthopaedic Hospital.



MG 73271 Dietician Training Programme: The Dietician Training Programme was started in Feb. 2011 with the total funding of US\$15,690 and ended in Dec 2011.


In this project the RC Patan partnered with the District 3292 in collaboration with the Nepalese Youth Foundation as well as the international partners such as RC of Central Main, and District 5150.



The project activities were focused on three aspects: providing dietician training, placing trained dieticians at hospitals and follow up training. Under this project 30 dieticians from different hospitals of Nepal were trained. The project was coordinated by Rtn. R.R. Pandey.

MG 74893 Equipment for ICU at Hospital and Rehabilitation Centre for Disabled Children (HRDC): The Project started in April 2011 and the MG has now been officially closed.

Total funds US \$ 57,342. Host: RC Patan, District 3292. International partner: RC Vashon Island, RC Des Moines, RC Bellevue, Districts 5030 and 3211. Coordinator: Rtn. R.R Pandey with Dr. Prakash Raj Regmi. This project benefited hundreds of physically challenged people of Nepal.



In addition four new MG projects started this year totaling US\$ 188,419. These projects are: MG 76730 Aquaponics – US \$20,403; MG 76992 Medical Equipment to Nepal Orthopaedic Hospital – US\$ 75,450 and from other sources US\$ 21,689; MG 76482 Equipment to CFO children village – US\$ 46,115; and MG 76909 Second phase dietician training – US\$ 24,762.

Advocacy to raise TRF Contributions:

RCP under the leadership of the President was successful in raising club contribution to TRF of US\$10,150. Rtn. Narayan Govind Halwai (MPHF+3); Rtn. Ganesh Raj Shrestha (MPHF+4); Rtn. Jamuna Krishna Tamrakar (MPHF); Rtn. Khruschev Shrestha (MPHF); Rtn. Dr Amina Shrestha (MPHF); Rtn. Padma Lal Maharjan (MPHF); Rtn. Lalita Thapa (PHF); Rtn. Dr.Bishwa Bandhu Sharma (MPHF); Rtn. R.R. Pandey became MD; Club Contribution to four new MG Projects; and annual Polio Plus contribution from Rtn. Gabriele Mallapaty.

Fundraising and Contribution to Community Service Projects:

RCP also raised a total of NRs. 2,159,841 for community service projects. (PEEF Scholarships NRs 1,965,841; Chepang Village mid-day meal programme NRs




134,000; Patan senior citizens recognition NRs 25,000; and Rotary Walk NRs 35,000.)

The RCP Club Service Fund was increased by NRs 315,000 reaching NRs 615,000, due to the effective advocacy by RCP members. The purpose of the fund is to bring more sustainable contributions to the RCP club-owned service projects.

The RCP 'Sunshine' contribution reached at NRs 120,650. The voluntary announcements of 'good news' are encouraged from all RCP members and these include happy landing, happy birthdays, wedding anniversaries, various good news from family members of RCP members, publication and presentations in print media and TV programmes of members, and any other good news such as ownership of houses or vehicles. Members are also encouraged to bring a souvenir from international travel that is auctioned and the proceeds generated are donated by members. These are systematically reported in the weekly 'Lalitdhara' both as a formal record and as encouragement to others to voluntarily report the good news.

Scholarships: The RC Patan Prajapati Education Endowment Fund (PEEF) scholarships are given to 670 students in 28 schools of Lalitpur District. During this Rotary Year, a total of NRs. 1,965,841 were raised while a total of NRs. 2,019,600 (for two school years due to a change in distribution timing) are distributed in installments. The distribution trips to schools had a large participation of Rotarians, Anns and other relatives.

Village Development Programme through RCC and School Mid-day Meals: This project is benefiting about 150 students in their nutritional status and also to improve the attendance of the students in the Chepang Community School in Chandibhanjyang, Chitwan District. RC Patan members visited the village four times this year.

On 19 October 2011 a group of RC Patan members visited the village to observe the mid-day meal, RCC and Interact activities. During the visit 150 pieces of soap, 150 pieces

of pencils and erasers were distributed. Support by Inner Wheel of several boxes of warm clothes to women and children. Efforts are underway to collaborate with Heifer International to make RC Patan's support more sustainable.



Health Services Related Community Services:

Historically RCPs Service Projects have had a strong focus on Education, Water and Sanitation, and Health. This Rotary Year, RCP has also formed a specific Health Activity Committee and has again carried out/participated in many health-related activities.

Blood Donation Camp: On 27 August 2012, the RCP organized a Blood Donation Camp at Mangal Bazar, Patan in collaboration with Rotaract Club of Patan, Innerwheel Club and the National Development Cooperative (NDC). Participants: 14 Rotarians, 2 Inner-wheel members, 30 members from Rotaract Club of Patan, and staff of the NDC including the Chairman and Directors.


This programme was inaugurated by the President RCP himself and the first to be donating his blood. Altogether 48 packets of acceptable blood donation were received on that day. The RCP contributed NRs. 2,000 while the Partner NDC contributed NRs. 12,000.

Polio-plus programme: On 22 October 2011, the RCP participated in a Polio Eradication Rally organized by the District with a walk from Patan Durbar Square to Thapathali. Participants from RCP: 5 Rotarians and 1 Ann. This was a major advocacy programme that was covered by both the print media and TV.

Heart Screening in Six Schools: Screening of about 3000 school children in 6 schools in Patan was conducted by medical doctors. Of which 87 children underwent further tests including echocardiography at Lalitpur Heart Clinic; 19 children were found to have heart disease, 8 of them needed heart surgery. They were sent to Ganga Lal Hospital for surgery. Doctors participating in the screening were Dr. Regmi, Dr. silwal, Dr. Amina, Dr. Harihar Khanal and Dr. Badri Nepal. The Program was jointly organized by RCP and Nepal Heart Foundation. Dates: Nov 2011 – Feb 2012.




Diabetes Public Awareness on World Diabetic Day: Diabetes Public Awareness Program was organized on the occasion of the world diabetes day 14 Nov 2011. An interaction program was also organised in a school at Rabi Bhawan jointly by RCP and Nepal Diabetes Society. 100 people participated. Lecture on diabetes was given by Dr. Prakash R. Regmi and Rtn. Rtn Ganesh Shrestha also participated in the programme. Blood sugar test of 245 people was done.

Heart Diseases Public Awareness with Nepal Heart Foundation: Heart Diseases Public Awareness programs on heart diseases were organised in Lalbandi of Sarlahi district and in Kapilbastu on 19 and 20 Nov 2011. 45 people participated in Lalbandi, 170 people participated in Kapilbastu. Programme was conducted by Dr. Prakash R. Regmi of RCP jointly with local district branches of Nepal Heart Foundation.

Rheumatic Heart Disease Awareness-Dramas: Rheumatic Heart Disease Awareness: 6 street drama on rheumatic heart disease were performed at Bir Hospital, Ratnapark and Tundikhel of Kathmandu on 4 Dec 2011. The artists were school students from Boudhaschool, Swoyambhu. Was organised by RCP, Nepal Heart Foundation and Nepal Breakdance Foundation. The drama was telecasted by NTV.

Health Camp in Manthali, Ramechap: A Health Camp was conducted in Manthali, Ramechap on 12 March 2012 at the Tamakoshi Community Hospital wherein 528 patients were examined with 98 ECG Tests, 58 Echo Tests and free medicine worth of NRs. 35,000 distributed.



The Camp was served by 8 doctors, 3 Technicians, 10 Nurses and 15 Volunteers which was led by the RCP Members: Dr. Prakash R. Regmi and Dr. AminaShrestha. Organizers: RCP, Nepal Heart Foundation and TamakoshiSewaSamaj.

Talk on Hypertension & Diabetes, Lalitpur: A talk programme on "Hypertension & Diabetes" was conducted by Dr. Praksh Regmi at Sinchahiti organized by Sinchahiti

Saving and Credit. In that even, Dr Regmi also conducted Blood Sugar test for 80 people.

Vocational Services to the Community:

Vocational Awards: With cash award of NRs 5000 were given to Ms. Samjhana Maharjan who is working as a media staff in Sagarmatha FM radio and Ms. Bina Tamang working in Medicare Hospital as a Ward Assistant. The vocational award committee included Rtn. Kamal Nyachheon, Rtn. Ganesh Raj Shrestha and Rtn. Prakash Raj Regmi.

Vocational Training: On 19 May 2012, the vocational training on renewable energy technology was organized at the Engineering College, Patan for the Rotaracts of different Rotary Clubs. Total participants were 32. This event was hosted by the RC Chandragiri and co-hosted by RCP. Contribution from the RCP was NRs. 5,000 for this event.

Involvement in District-wide Community Service Projects:

RC Patan is Managing the 3H Grant #62681: It was officially launched in April 2009 between District 3292

of Nepal and 5030 of USA and is near completion. The 3H Grant has four core objectives: 1) Increase awareness; 2) Disseminate information; 3) Establish a call center; and 4) Provide direct benefits to people with disabilities (PWDs) in Nepal. The Project has a funding of US\$330,000 and 25 clubs of Nepal have partnered with USA clubs for projects worth over US\$ 440,000. Coordinator: Rtn. R.R. Pandey RCP is also actively involved in District level Matching Grant.

MG 74703 School Toilets and Water Project: Total funds US\$ 46,150. This is a District managed project to allow smaller and newer clubs in rural Nepal to link to their local schools and communities. The project is to provide toilets for girls in public schools. Coordinator: Rtn. Narayan Halwai.


MG 76956 School Toilets Project: Coordinated by RC Patan Durbar Square in Nepal and several clubs in USA. RC Patan's role is to guide RC Durbar Square in implementing the project by sharing experience of MG 74703 and District Simplified Grant. RC Patan has also included two projects in the package.

Advocacy and Rotary Image:

Partners-in-Service: Under the leadership of the President, the RCP collaborated with many local, national and international partners through its club-owned projects, MG projects, and various community service projects. RCP oversees one Rotaract club, two Interacts club and one RCC. RCP also has an Innerwheel club.

Communication Efforts and Media Coverage: There were numerous TV programmes, Radio programmes and print media coverage for advocacy and communication generated from the activities of the RCP. The coverage this year has been very wide and too numerous.

Rota Quiz: The RCP participated and won the Rota Quiz programme competition of Zone 8 on 11 March 2012.

The RCP also contributed NRs. 5,000 to the South Asia Literacy Seminar.

The RCP joined (4 Members and 2 Anns) the District Team to travel to Bhutan for the Charter ceremony of a new club in Bhutan under our District 3292.

'सर्वजनहिताय' रोटरी

अमेरिकाको सिकागोमा सन् १९०५ मा जन्मेको रोटरी ५३ वर्षपछि मात्र छिरेको हो नेपालमा । तर अंग्रेजको राज्य भएको छिमेकी, भारतमा भने यो सन् १९२० लाग्नुभन्दा अधि नै पसिसकेको थियो । सम्भे हुन्छ- एसियाकै पहिलो रोटरी क्लब भएर २० सदस्यीय रोटरी क्लब अफ क्यालकाटा खुलेको थियो, सन् १९२० को जनवरी १ तारीखका दिन । तर त्यो भन्दा ४ महिना अधि १९१९ को सेप्टेम्बर २६ मै त्यहाँका एकजना फलामका व्यापारी, रोआर जी कम्सको अग्रसरतामा त्यहाँको प्रख्यात ग्राण्ड होटेलमा रोटरीको पहिलो कम्भेन्सन सम्पन्न भएको हो ।

कलकत्तालाई छाडेर नेपालमा आऊँ । कलकत्तामा क्लब चार्टर भएको ३८ वर्षपछि, रोटरीको तत्कालीन डिस्ट्रिक ३२५ को एउटा क्लब, रोटरी क्लक अफ दरभङ्गाको संयोजकत्वमा २९ जुन १९५९ मा रोटरी क्लब अफ काठ्माण्डूको चार्टर भयो । तर यहाँ पनि, त्यो चार्टर हुने भन्दा सात महिना पहिले नै सन् १९५८ को नोभेम्बर २० मा पहिलो रोटरी कन्भेन्सन सम्पन्न भएको थियो यहाँको होटेल रोयलमा । गौरव मान्नुपर्ने कुरा के भने त्यस कन्भेन्सनमा काठमाण्डू (अर्थात् नेपालका) गण्यमान्य जन, १०५ जनाको भव्य उपस्थिति थियो, र त्यसरी काठमाण्डूमा रोटरी क्लब खुल्दा नेपाल अधिराज्य रोटरी भित्र्याउने विश्वको १११ औं मुलुक हनपुगेको थियो ।

"स्वार्थभन्दा माथि सेवाभाव" भन्ने परोपकारी सिद्धान्त बोकेर आएको रोटरीलाई त्यसरी भित्र्याउँदा हामीले नयाँ कुरा भने क्यै गरेका थिएनौ । किनभने त्यो सेवा र पर-उपकार भन्ने कुरो हाम्रो नेपाली परम्पराभन्दा परको वस्तु नै थिएन ! अनादि कालदेखि हामी नेपालीहरूले अँगालि आएको धर्म (हिन्दू र बौद्ध) को अन्तर्निहित कुरा नै हुन् सेवा र दया भनेका । हाम्रो धर्मका अङ्ग नै हुन् यी ।

यसो भनेर मैले रोटरीको आदर्शलाई सानो देखाउन खोजेको होइन । बरू, त्यसको विपरीत, भन्न लागेको हुँ- 'रोटरी-धर्म नेपालको धार्मिक आदर्शको 'कम्प्याटिबल' छ' भनेर ! रोटरीका आचारसंहिता र सिद्धान्त वाक्यहरू अध्ययन गन्याँ भने हामी देख्छौ ती सबै हाम्रा पारम्परिक धर्मसँग एकदमै मेल खान्छन् । जैन या बौद्ध दर्शनको आदर्श वाक्य 'भवतु सब्ब मंगलम्' रोटरीको 'फोर-वे-टेप्ट' को कति निकट छ तुलना गरी हेर्दा हुन्छ । 'इज इट' फेयर यान बेनिफिसियल टु अल कन्सर्न्ड' नै

भनेको होइन त्यो ? अथवा उपनिषद्को "सत्यंवद, धर्म चर" या पुराणको "परोपकार पुण्याय पापाय परपीडनं" पनि शत प्रतिशत हाम्रो रोटरी आदर्श अनुरूप नै छन् भन्ने प्रमाणित गर्नलाई कुनै स्वामीजी या प्रवचन-प्रवीण गुरुजीलाई गुहार्नु पर्देन!

रोटरीको आगमनले हाम्रो पारम्परिक दानको प्रवृत्तिमा भने केही परिवर्तन ल्याइदिएको छ । र त्यो परिवर्तन स्वागतयोग्य नै छ, नराम्रो छैन । दानधर्म हामी पैले पनि गर्थ्यों । हाम्रा यत्तिका मठमन्दिर, विहार र गुम्बाहरू छन् । ती सबै नेपाली दानशीलताका नै परिणाम हुन् । राम्रो हो । तिनमा हामी गर्व गर्छों । तर ऐले, अब रोटरीले हामीलाई दानको थप नयाँ बाटो पनि देखाएको छ । रोटरीले भन्छ- 'तिम्रा दान अलि बहुजनहिताय हुन् । को आफ्नो, को पराई भन्ने भन्नेमा ध्यान नराखी दाना गर !'

टीआरएफ अर्थात् रोटरी फाउण्डेसनमा दान गर्ने भनेको यही हो । यो 'टीआरएफ' भन्ने कुरा रोटरी अभियानको सबभन्दा महत्वपूर्ण कुरा हो भन्ने लाग्छ मलाई । यो नहुँदो हो त रोटरी र संसारभर अनिगन्ति संख्यामा रहेका अरू क्लबहरूका बीचमा कुनै फरक हुने थिएन । फाउन्डेसन या 'दाता गुठी' मात्र भनेर पिन हुँदैन, अरू फाउन्डेसनले पिन करोडौं या अफ अरबौं रूपिया दान गर्छन्, तर टीआरएफ-को दान गराइ निकै फरक हुन्छ । यसको 'दान' मा परोपकारको भाव त हुन्छ नै, तर त्यस भन्दा बढी मानवीयता भनौं, कि मित्रता या सहभागिताको मात्रा रहन्छ जस्तो लाग्छ मलाई । अर्को कुरो । रोटरी फाउन्डेसनमा दिएको दान संसारभरका विपन्न र पीडित वर्गमा पुग्छ । सबैको हितमा, सकेसम्म धेरैको सेवा गर्छ टीआरएफ-मा दिएको दानले । त्यित मात्र पिन होइन । अन्य देशका असहायहरूको सेवा गरिसकी त्यो दान फेरि फर्कर आएर दान दिने दाताको आफ्नै देशमा सेवा गर्छ पिछ । यो भन्दा आदर्श दान अरू के हुन सक्छ ?



Education for Nepali School Children

The Rotary Club of Patan (RCP), Nepal has been spearheading its initiatives in the field of education for years out of a commitment towards the intellectual development of the youth in the country. In a country like Nepal, one of the Least Developed Countries in the world with the latest per capita income equivalent to US \$ 742 (The Economic Survey 2011-12), many children do not profit from the fundamental human right to empower themselves through learning.

The Nepalese government had previously declared its commitment to provide free primary and, since a few years, secondary education for all. However, the government's

coverage does not include all school related expenses of a student. Therefore, in order to encourage lower-income families to continue sending their children to schools, RCP initiated this programme.


RCP's Scholarship Programme


To support children's education in Nepal, the Rotary Club of Patan (RCP) established the "Prajapati Education Endowment Fund" (PEEF) in 1991 and simultaneously launched a scholarship programme to bridge the education gap for children from economically underprivileged families. The RCP implemented the scholarship programme in government schools, each year selecting four students enrolled in class 6 to receive financial assistance until the completion of class 10 as a supplement to family expenses on education. The needbased assistance package has been offered on a staggering scale to take into account student's educational performance. From the school year

2011/2012, the package has been maximized for all (Rs. 1,500 per child), with higher amounts (Rs. 2,000 per

child) to recognize students performing with distinction.

Through generous donations from fellow Rotarians, friends and relatives of Rotarians, and other charitable institutions and individuals, RCP has mobilized funds to support a total of 2001 students, over a span of more than two decades. The girls represented 58% of these students in the school year 2012-13. This year, twenty-three Rotarians, 3 Anns and 5 others associated with the RCP took part during the selection and distribution of the scholarships. Many of them made several visits totalling 64 visits. The RCP's supplement to their educational costs has allowed these students to continue attending school while reducing the burden to their economically





challenged families. In the year 2012/2013, the number of students receiving scholarships reaches 694 from 28



participating schools. The programme's aim is to reach a target of supporting 1000 students annually.

Although ambitious, the RCP has full faith in the realization of this target and the benefit that the economically deprived children of Nepal stand to gain from its initiative.

Management of the Scholarship Programme

The Fund is managed by a RCP Committee which meets regularly to discuss policy and practices. Every 3-4 months a progress report, including detailed financial information, is submitted to the RCP General Meeting. All activities, from record-keeping, liaising with donors, communicating with schools, selecting suitable candidates, and checkingup on student performance are conducted by the RCP team in a transparent manner and on a voluntary basis. This effort has been the prime driver in the success of this programme. In addition to the resources, the donation of valuable time and expertise by the highly motivated Rotarians and their family members, ensure that there are no overhead costs to manage this model scholarship programme. The RCP Management Committee of the PEEF is also looking into the best options for investment of the Trust Fund in the context of fluctuating interest rates with a downward trend and the need to secure adequate funds to cover annual requirements.

The Trust Fund has reached an amount of Nepalese Rupees 7.99 million and there are additional annual contributions of Rs. 281,200 as detailed in the annex 1. The anticipated income being generated by the Trust Fund together with the additional annual contributions have brought about a budget of Rs. 2,019,600 for the school years 2011-12 and 2012-13. Because of a change in the distribution schedule the amounts of two school years are reported together during this Rotary Year.

Criteria for Student Selection

Students are selected on the basis of their economic need. In order for students to qualify for assistance, the RCP Selection Committees take into account the following criteria:

- low income household/inability to pay for school fees, books, stationary and other education-related costs
- part of a large family with many children/schoolgoing siblings
- no father or mother or both
- not working as domestic helpers whose education would be the responsibility of the house owner.

How Funds are Raised

A onetime contribution of NPR 15,000 to the PEEF proposed to be raised to Rs. 20,000 (approximately USD 250) supports one student's scholarship for perpetuity through interest earned from investing these funds in secured, maximum interest-bearing accounts by Rotary. With the growth in the number of students supported, RCP has decided to advocate only this mechanism (stopping any new annual contributions), as this ensures continuity of the scholarship programme.

Feedback Provided to Donors

Each donor is assigned a student for a period of five years, from Class 6 to Class 10, after which the scholarship is transferred to a new student beginning again from Class 6. Donors receive a statement of annual examination scores together with the student's receipt of scholarship money. In addition a photograph of the student is also sent wherever possible. (See Annex. 1 with a list of sponsors and the latest funding details)





MY TWO YEARS IN ROTARY

Rotary pin. My wife was observing me curiously and she made a poignant remark, "You miss so many deadlines all the time. It is not because you do not have time, but because you are so forgetful, but every Monday morning you don't forget to fix your Rotary pin. What is so special about your club which makes you so devoted?" I gave her a short answer, "To understand this, first you should be a Rotarian." It was a casual conversation, but it makes my passion for Rotary work clear. Actually my contact with Rotary life started almost twenty years ago when my friend Dr. Prakash Raj Regmi was an active member and encouraged me to be a Rotarian. But his attempts then did not meet with success. The reason was my scepticism and incomplete information about the Rotary movement.

Since I joined the club two years ago, my perception of Rotary has changed completely. I think the Rotary movement itself has gone through a process of transformation over time. It is no longer perceived as a gathering of rich traders with bow tie and pocket square, smoking cigars and chatting their daily businesses. This image has been completely transformed into a global network of diverse professionals dedicated to serve. This is the first message I observed during these two years of Rotary life. The second thing I discovered is that once you become a Rotarian, you cannot leave it easily. The reason, in my opinion, is the friendship and mutual intimacy we develop in our club. Although different people may have different motives to join a club, I came simply because I wanted company of people from various walks of life. And I felt the need to be in an intellectual circle spending my free time in worthwhile interactions. For this, there could not be a better place than a Rotary Club.

I did not anticipate that within this short span of time, I could develop such a passion to club life. Many Rotarians

from elsewhere tell me that RC Patan is a special club with distinctive image. Some say, it is an elite among the clubs. Whatever may be the reason, it is already an integral part of my life.

Sometimes, during our club meetings I feel, I am in a Board Meeting of some corporate house, especially, when we discuss projects and proposals. A tired and almost retired busy psychiatrist may not give any input in such serious plans. So I am consciously avoiding taking any serious responsibility in the club, at least for the time being. But, I am truly following the MANTRAS spoken to me at my induction: attend the meetings regularly, pay the dues timely, and contribute, as you can, to charity; the rest depends on your time, desire, motivation etc. Nevertheless, I truly became a Rotarian with the spirit of service and fellowship.

I notice there are few things very distinctive to rotary culture. First, we are punctual and very conscious of time. I have attended many highly professional business meetings of international standard and almost every time the proceedings are behind schedule and last speakers often have to face almost empty halls. I never observed this in any of the Rotarian gatherings. Second, we are very concise and clear in our agendas. I have not seen any Rotarian talking near and around, but always to the point. Third, we know our business: service and mutual fellowship, nothing with politics and religion.

I was fortunate to attend the RI Convention in Bangkok this year. I anticipated that it would be a superfluous fanfare and multiple appeals to donate to different charities. But I was wrong. I was impressed by the grandeur and meticulous preparation of the event. My salutations to the organizers and volunteers who made it such a grand success! The preparation and proceedings were flawless, with Rotarian-punctuality. The scale of the events involving



around 30,000 people were breathtaking. The breakout sessions, where concrete issues were discussed, were of the highest standard. After this unique experience, I am more convinced that I made the right decision to join Rotary. I will never be a black sheep among my Rotary friends.

I realize that just joining a Rotary Club does not mean we have ideal values in life. There is a long way to go to internalize the Rotary's 'Four Way Test' in our daily life. We come from different background and upbringing. We are human beings, and the human weaknesses are also part and partial of us. Sometimes we aspire to get an advantage from the club or fellow Rotarians. We feel upset, even offended, if expectations are not fulfilled. I,

being a psychiatrist, take it as a common and casual part of human behavior. If we continue to be Rotarians, one day this "self above all" will be replaced by 'Service above Self'.

Lastly, I would like to mention the challenges the Rotary is facing today. In my understanding, the first challenge is the dwindling membership. Our size in global scale is stuck around 1.2 Million. Maybe we have to change our approach according to the changed time of globalization and information technology. The second challenge is its traditional image outside of Rotary. Now, time has come to go to the society with a mission to convert it into a mainstream movement in social change.



In 1988, there was not a single facility for the medical rehabilitation of physically handicapped people in Nepal, and so the Nepal Disabled Association (NDA) developed a proposal for a 32 bed hospital, and started looking for funds. As a result of this search, the Rotary Club of Patan, under the Rtn. Late Nanda Ram Bhakta Mathema became the key partner for NDA. In 1989, Rtn Mathema, who was also the Assistant Secretary General of the NDA, presented the proposal to Rotarian Jim Sinclair, who was visiting RC Patan, for a make up. Rotary Club of Amherst South, NY RI district 7090, home club of Past President Rt James Sinclair, the RID 7090, adopted the Orthopaedic Hospital as a World Community Service (WCS) project. Rtn Jim Sinclair has credited the late Rtn Nanda Ram Bhakta Mathema "for his gentle, effective and persuasive nature in convincing the Rotary clubs of RI District 7090 of the need for the hospital".

was laid on 2 June 1993 and the building was completed in June 1994. Due to financial constraints, the project was scaled down to a 16 bed facility for a total fund of \$225,000 (contributed by more than 50 Rotary Clubs in RID 7090). Although RCP and NDA had negotiated a MOU with a German NGO for providing equipment and technical assistance for four years to run the hospital, this did not materialize. Thus, without the essential equipment and financial support, the hospital complex remained unutilized.

It was at this critical juncture (in 1998) that two champions, Dr. Anil Bahadur Shrestha, who later became a rotarian, and Rtn Luc Salens of RC Maldegem, Belgium, appeared on the scene. Rtn Luc played a very catalytic role and procured donation from RI District 1620 and friends in Belgium worth \$ 40,000 that helped meet the cost of basic equipment to run the hospital. It was followed by a Matching Grant from RC Patan with \$12,800 to procure





twenty new beds and office furniture. Dr. Anil accepted the challenge to run the hospital, with the motto of "quality service at an affordable price" and it started functioning from 17 August 1998, with 20 beds. Five beds were added in 2001 (bringing the total to 25 beds). Soon after that, Rtn Luc Salens again provided a forty- foot container full of hospital accessories; however, these accessories could not be put to good use due to lack of space.

In view of the growing community demand of services at the hospital, its management decided that a second phase expansion of the hospital was needed. This expansion would make it a 75 bed hospital by adding 50 new beds. Consequently, with the support of the rotarians of Nepal, international partner rotary clubs, international donors, German-Nepal Help Association, Foundation Help for Nepal-Holland, Association-Fennes D'Europe and many others, the expansion was completed and became operational in April 2004. It was inaugurated by the then king Gyanendra on 16 April, 2004. The excellent reputation and credibility of the hospital has attracted more and more patients. The general ward being generally full so that even some poor patients were compelled to stay in expensive private wards, hence a 25 bed general ward has been added with financial support of national and international donors; and furniture and equipment procured under a Matching Grant from RC Patan. This "Sagarmatha" general ward was inaugurated by the President of the Republic of Nepal, HE Dr. Ram Baran Yadav, on 3 December, 2011.

A new Intensive Care Unit (ICU) with three ventilators which was the only missing link to have the NOH recognized as the Centre of Excellence, is now being established, for which a Matching Grant from RC Patan and rotary clubs of RI District 1620 has recently been approved.

NOH Today

Following the first decade of its history under the successful leadership of Dr. Anil, the first Medical Director, NOH is now under the dynamic leadership of Dr Saju Pradhan. The hospital complex is owned by the Nepal Disabled Association and operated under the Nepal Orthopaedic Hospital Management Committee of 8 members, representing the following organizations:-4 from NDA, 2 from RC Patan, 1 from RC Kasthamandap and

Hospital Medical Director, who also serves as the Member Secretary of the Management Board.

Service includes surgery (6 days a week) in 3 operation theatres. A total of 2707 surgeries were done in 2011 in 3 operation theatres; of these 480 were charity patients, exceeding Rs. 21 lakh in charity. Orthopaedic camps are also conducted in remote districts. Currently, the hospital is manned by 140 dedicated staff including 18 surgeons and medical doctors. Starting with nearly 80% external dependency in the initial years, the hospital is now self reliant, with fees generated from the services to the patients and through fund raising events.

NOH has thus evolved from a small service provider to a major service provider "with one brick at a time" in the care of Nepal's trauma and orthopaedic needs. The hospital is very well maintained, with cleanliness at par with the best private hospitals in the country.

Initiated by Rotary club of Patan, NOH is truly a Rotary hospital. It has received support from more than 112 rotary clubs, from 9 RI Districts, in three continents. Support under 9 Matching Grants is approximately \$500,000. Rotary Club of Patan is privileged to have supported the hospital with 5 of the 9 MGs that include the first MG to provide equipment to start the hospital, the fourth MG to supply beds and furniture for the "Sagarmatha" ward and the fifth MG to procure Ventilators for the ICU, and thus, make it a full fledged hospital. During his visit in 2008 the RI President DK Lee was highly impressed with the progress made by the hospital. All Rotarians, especially those from RC Patan, will find a visit to the hospital, a well worth investment of time and feel proud of the service that rotary has provided to the community.

MID-DAY MEAL PROGRAMME

(Project of Rotary Club of Patan to feed the undernourished Chepang Children)

Three Years Review (2009- 2012)

Background

Chepang is the commonly used name given to an indigenous ethnic group living in central and southern Nepal. The Chepangs inhabit in the remote districts of Makwanpur, Chitwan, Gorkha and Dhading. They are one of the economically underprivileged and deprived communities in the country with literacy rate far below than national average. They are normally settled in hill slopes along the river banks and cultivate marginal land of hill slopes. The agriculture produce that they have is adequate for just about 6 months and they have to earn for living cutting down trees, selling fodder or working as seasonal laborers. They are forced to remain hungry including their children for several months in a year. Thus, the children develop high degree of malnutrition and vitamin deficiency.

Mid-Day Meal at Devibhanjyang School

Rotary Club of Patan has initiated a feeding program (Mid-Day Meal Program) to Chepang children studying in Devi Bhanjyang Rastriya Primary School located in Chandibhanjyang village. It is about 3 km from Mugling, about 110 km from Kathmandu, along the river bank of Kali Khola - a tributary of Trisuli river. Chandibhanjyang village can be approached by 20 minutes of walk along a steep uphill. Devi Bhanjyang School has about 170 students. However, less than 50% of students attend the school regularly as their parents make them stay at home to look after smaller children while they are away either in the paddy fields or in the forest - cutting down trees. The children are highly undernourished and unclean; they are infested with diseases related to undernourishment.

The mid day meal project was started on 3rd June 2009 (26th Jesth, 2066). In the first year of the programme, the children were given the mid-day meal twice a week during school hours. From the second year, they were given mid day meal thrice a week. The meal menu consisted of Chiura (bitten rice), egg, seasonal fruits, beans, potato, dhindo

of sarbottam pitho (super flour) etc. It has been expected that providing mid day meal would improve the nutritional status as well as school attendance of the children.

Committee for Meal Management

A committee comprised of five members has been formed for the mid-day meal scheme. The committee includes the Chairman of the school management committee Mr. Bhupendra Chepang as the Chairman and the headmaster as the Member Secretary. It has been made clear that there will be no misuse of resources provided by the club to the school for this purpose.

A Rotary Community Corps (RCC) was also established in Chandibhanjyang. The Chairperson of RCC, Mr. Gopi Silwal has been supervising the Mid Day Meal Program.

Three Years Review (June 2009 to May 2012)

The Mid-Day Meal Program has completed three years of its services to the undernourished Chepang students. Rotary Club of Patan has contributed NRs 3, 15,518.00 to this program in 3 years (NRs 71,328, NRs 1,09,910 and NRs 1,34,280 for the first, second and third year respectively) Around 40% of the club members have participated in this program. Their generous financial contribution has made this program highly successful. As a result the following achievements have been made:

- 1. Attendance of the students has improved by 30%
- 2. Drop out rate from school has decreased by 35%
- 3. Overall nutritional status of the children has improved; anemia in children has been decreased significantly.

Monitoring and Evaluation

Monitoring has been done through the RCC. Two visits were made by the RC Patan members during the Rotary year 2011-12. It has been felt that direct monitoring by the club members has been a problem due to the difficult



locality of the village. Nevertheless attempts were made to keep in regular touch with the RCC and to make field visits whenever possible.

Sustainability of the Scheme

There has been a debate in the RC Patan about the sustainability of this project. This is a fully club-owned project. The project can continue only if the contribution from the club members is sufficient. Some members have expressed their commitment to contribute every year to this project. If all the members give some commitments then the program can continue. Feeding is the only way to support the children who have no food to eat. It would be good if this humanitarian project continue till the socio economic status of the inhabitants of Chandibhanjyang village improves. This can be done by initiating village development projects in this community. Till the time comes when the villagers become capable to feed their children themselves - in the name of humanity and service above self - someone should take care of the children who are dying from hunger. In this context Rotary Club of Patan is proud to be involved in such a humanitarian project.

Mid Day Meal Cost and Call for Contribution

The project cost estimated at Rs 10 per meal/student for an average of 140 students for 100 meal days is NRs 140000 (US\$ 1900) per year. This much of fund is needed each year. Till now this project is fully funded by contributions from the members of Rotary Club of Patan. Rotarians from RC Patan have contributed to this project of hunger, humanity and health. The project lacks sufficient funds, the members of the project team appeal to all the members of RC Patan to make generous contributions to feed the undernourished children. Your small contribution can make a huge difference. You can save many lives by participating in this project.

IMPROVE IMMUNITY AND BE HEALTHY

It is important to keep our Immune System performing well. Our immune system is our self-defense system and is responsible in keeping our whole body healthy, free from illness and infection.

The strength of our immune system is what makes the difference between who gets sick and who does not. Weak immune system can lead to many infections, allergies, cancers and also some immunodeficiency disorders. Environment toxins, stress and even wrong diets can contribute to the down fall of the immune system.

We encounter millions of bacteria, fungi and parasites on a daily basis. So, it is very essential for us to boost our immune system in order to avoid adverse health conditions. It is easy to boost our immune system with improvement in healthy diet, exercise and certain changes in lifestyle.

DIET

Foods high in Vitamins A, B, C, E, Zinc and Omega 3 Fatty acids helps to boost immune system. Adequate, even abundant, nutrients strengthen the body's immune system and even prevent cancer.

Green Tea:

It is a powerful antioxidant and helps the immune system fight infections.

Lemon:

It is an ideal source for acid- alkaline balance in your body. Vitamin C strengthens your immune system by stimulating antibodies and cells in the immune system. It takes the offensive line against germs.

Garlic.

It has active allicin which fights infection and at least 30 types of bacteria, virus, parasite and fungi. Besides

boosting immunity it helps maintain healthy digestive bacteria. It acts like an antibiotic, helps blood pressure and maintain a healthy heart.

Ginger:

It has warming effect on the body, helps circulation problems and builds the immune system.

Onions:

Onions and garlic share many of the same powerful sulfur bearing compounds that work effectively as anti-viral and anti-bacterial agents.

Mushrooms:

It increases the production and activity of white blood cells making them more aggressive.

Sweet Potatoes:

It contents beta-carotene which our body turns into Vitamin A. Vitamin A is the defensive line of the immune system.

Yogurt:

Probiotics or the "live culture" found in yogurt are healthy to bacteria that keep the gut and intestinal tract free of disease causing germs.

Fish:

The Omega 3 (good fat) in fatty fish such as salmon, tuna, mackerels, trout, catfish etc. act as immune booster by increasing the activity of the white blood cells that eat up bacteria.

Wheat Grass Juice:

It is a very healthy juice rich in vitamins and helps detoxify the body.

SOME OTHER IMMUNE BOOSTING FOODS

Oranges, Strawberries, Potatoes, Sweet Potatoes, Tomatoes, Broccoli, Cauliflower, Carrots, Spinach, Chillies,



Red Peppers, Green Peppers, Legumes, Lentils, Honey, Low fat milk, Whole grain bread, Nuts, Seeds, Eggs, etc.

Eat lots of fruits and vegetables each day. Remember variety is the spice of life and eat a wide variety of foods.

IN THE KITCHEN

Use safe cooking methods like steaming, boiling, stir frying or roasting with good fat. Avoid as far as possible deep frying.

Water:

The single most important nutrient, helps your cells to properly communicate the healing messages, critical for an effective detox, vital for all body systems to function correctly to boost immune system, helps maintain healthy energy. Dehydration promotes cancer cell growth. Therefore, boost your immune system by drinking sufficient water. Drink 1/2 your weight in ounces of pure water (33 ml. per kg of body weight). Best time for drinking water is first thing in the morning, 1/2 hour before and 1-2 hour after meals.

FOODS TO AVOID OR MINIMIZE

Sugar, Chocolates, Processed Foods and Alcohol:

The changes in behavior that come about under the influence of alcohol, such as difficulty controlling muscles for walking and talking, may be influenced by immune cells in the brain. Excessive alcohol can damage the immune system because the alcohol will prevent nutrients from feeding your immune system. Taking one or two drinks a night is not likely to harm your immune system much. Three or more drinks a night is a significantly different story.

LIFESTYLE

The choices we make in our daily routine will determine our health. These factors are crucial for boosting immune system:

Wash Your Hands:

Many micro-organisms are passed via skin contact with infected individuals or objects. Washing your hands before touching your face (rubbing your eyes, contacting your mouth or ears) can greatly reduce your exposure to harmful microbes in the environment; this lessens your

chance of getting sick and of stressing your internal immune system.

Sleep:

The time when the body does the most repairing. The amount of sleep is directly related to the amount of energy we have the next day. For best immunity we should sleep average eight hours per night. Enjoy the powers of sleep.

Exercise:

Top immune booster for oxygenating the body (low oxygen levels breed cancer cells). Discover the wonders of workout. Get moving 30 minutes a day.

Relaxing increases antibody levels by reducing effects of stress which is vital for boosting immune system (stress is the most dominant factor over everything that affects our immune system). Learn to relax.

2. Donation of Tables and Benches:



- Identify and focus on fund raising activities which are relevant to the Club's community of interest;
- 4. Provide sufficient funds, in a timely manner, to meet the needs of the ongoing Club, District and International Projects, agreed by the Board.

Goal V : Balance Activities in all 5 Avenues of Service

 a) Vocational Service: Encourage Club Members to serve others through their vocations and to practice high ethical standards.

Action Steps:

- Sponsor Vocation month by recognizing, with an award, one person/institution that has worked hard to enhance image of the vocation;
- Establish a committee for vocational activities including preparation of criteria for the vocational award grant;
- 3. Contribute to district level vocational fund;
- Organize one programme each year to help students understand various vocations- career counseling.
- b) Community Service: Undertake projects and activities to improve life in our community.

Action Steps:

- I. Ensure national level continuity of the Disability Awareness 3H Grant Project;
- Raise additional funds and provide administrative support towards reaching scholarship support to 1000 students from the Prajapati Education Endowment Fund (PEEF);
- 3. Initiate health education programme in the scholarship programme schools;
- 4. Provide the remaining scholarship programme schools with IT support under the 'Digital Divide' project;

- Provide water and sanitation facility in the remaining scholarship programme schools;
- Raise fund and explore new avenues for service projects e.g. orphan students in scholarship schools, or support to school feeding;
- 7. Explore new avenues for other service projects;
- 8. Have pipeline projects, ready for submission to prospective donors.
- c) New Generation: Enhance Youth Activities:
 - I. Host Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA);
 - 2. Nominate candidates for RYLA;
 - 3. Actively support Rotaract and Interact programmes.

Goal VI: Increase the Club's International Outreach

Action Steps:

I. Encourage members to attend club meetings whenever they are abroad and search additional ways the Club can generate funds for service projects.

Goal VII: Promote the Rotary Foundation (TRF) Action Steps:

- Increase the level of understanding of Club Members about TRF;
- Support the Rotary Foundation through Club and individual contribution (5 Major Donors and 75% members as MPHF), participation in Group Study Exchange (GSE) programmes and education programmes.
