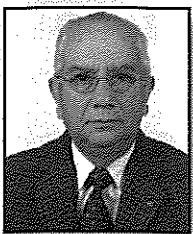
The good work done by the Rotaract Club of Patan and the Inner Wheel Club of Patan are also well reported in addition to several other good articles.

Let us Light Up Rotary.

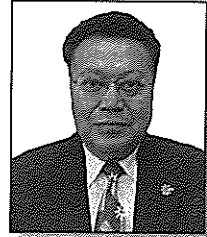

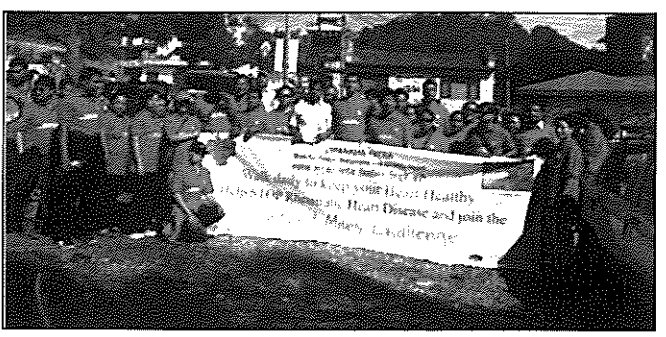


Highest contributor for 'sunshine' fund

Club Attendance

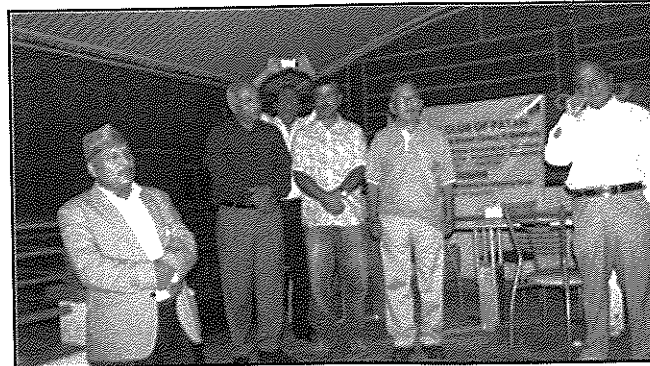
The club has been able to maintain an average of 70 % attendance in all its meetings. The RCP has given high priority to increase women membership with a wider classification.

Furniture to Schools

With the help of Rtn. Lochan Gyawali, some furniture donated by 'Health for Life' were given to three public schools at Badikhel, Dukuchhap & Harisiddhi and CBR, Patan with transportation cost borne by the RCP.

2. Club Membership

The RCP managed to induct two new members maintaining its membership level of 41 at the end of the rotary year. Efforts are underway to invite few more members with emphasis on ladies and youth with new classification.

3. The Rotary Foundation

The RCP is a 100 % PHF club. It has 39 PHF members of which four are Major Donors. The RCP has also been contributing to the Rotary Foundation Fund. In addition, the RCP has continuously participated in the Polio Plus programme.

4. Public Relations

The RCP has the practice to honor and greet one Rotary Club outside Nepal in its weekly meeting by acknowledging their status, location, memberships and charter date. This practice has helped to broaden the knowledge of our members about fellow clubs around the world.

The RCP is also conscious of the need to create greater awareness among the general public about Rotary, its projects and activities. It has maintained good relationship with all the Rotary clubs of Nepal by participating in ICMs, Joint Meetings and District Conference.

The PEEF scholarship programme alone received additional contributions of over NRs 1.3 million rupees to the Trust Fund and NRs 467,620 to the Operational Funds. In 2013-2014, the RC Patan contributed over NRs 1.2 million on community projects. In addition, the RC Patan currently manages International Projects (Matching Grants, District Community Grant and Global Grant close to US\$ 87,000.

Club-owned Community Service Projects

(Focus Area: Basic Education and Literacy)

Prajapati Education Endowment Fund (PEEF): PEEF Scholarships are given to over 600 students in 29 public schools of Lalitpur District. PEEF was established in 1991 and is supported solely through contributions raised by members of the RC Patan, their family and friends. During RY 2013/14, NRs 1 million were distributed. The RC Patan members, spouses and relatives, do the distribution trips to schools. The Trust Fund of the PEEF has now reached over 10.5 million Nepalese Rupees. Some schools received additional support of furniture donations.

Beneficiaries: >600 Students of Lalitpur Public Schools.

Kamal Mani Dixit Education Excellence Award (KMDEEA): The first 'KMDEEA' nominee was selected from among 3 pre-selected students of the 29 public schools where the RC Patan is providing scholarship through its 'PEEF' programme. The award was presented to Ms. Pratima Khadka from Shree Mahendragram Senior Secondary School, Tikathali, by Rtn. Kamal M. Dixit himself with a cash prize of NRs. 5,000 and a certificate on 16 December 2013. In the new RY the award is raised to NRs 10,000 for the 1st contestant and NRs 5,000 and NRs 3,000 respectively for the 2nd and 3rd contestants through additional commitments from Rtn. Ganesh R. Shrestha and PDG Tirtha M. Sakya.

Beneficiaries: 3 outstanding students of Lalitpur Public Schools.

Community Development Project with Heifer International Nepal in Chandibhanjyang:

(Focus Areas: Maternal and Child Health and Economic and Community Development)

The mid-day meal project at Devibhanjyang Rastriya Primary School in Chandibhanjyang was supported by RC Patan members and well-wishers since May 2009. This project is being completed at the end of 2014. The RC Patan is launching a collaboration with Heifer International, Nepal with a three-year agriculture and livestock project to provide more sustainable support to this Chepang and Gurung community. Efforts are underway to apply for a Global Grant Project. RC Patan has an Interact and an RCC in Chandibhanjyang.

Beneficiaries: 850 families of smallholder farmers.

International Sponsored Projects

(Focus Area: Disease Prevention)

Matching Grant 78847 Mammography Equipment: The grant allowed the purchase of a Mammography Machine and digitizing components for the Bhaktapur Cancer Hospital. Partners: RC Patan, District 3292; RC Grapevine, District 5790. Local Partner: Bhaktapur Cancer Hospital. Funding: US\$ 28,617. A hand-over ceremony took place on 27 December 2014. The project has been closed.

Beneficiaries: Hundreds of Women annually.

(Focus Area: Water and Sanitation)

Matching Grant 79081 Water and Sanitation Project in Mirge Village, Dolakha:

The grant provides a clean water supply system and bio-gas toilets to the remote Tamang village of Mirge in Dolakha. A monitoring visit by four RC Patan members was undertaken on 15 & 16 June 2014. Funding: US\$ 13,150. Partners: RC Patan, District 3292; RC Wallaton Park, District 1220. The project is close to completion.

Beneficiaries: 4000 inhabitants for water supply & 29 families for biogas toilets.

(Focus Area: Economic and Community Development)

District Community Grant with RC Lakewood, District 5020: Skills training to mental health professionals and income generating skills to clients: The project has two main components: 1) Professional Skills training to mental health professionals and 2) Income generating, vocational skills training to about 10 clients at the transit home of KOSHISH, a non-governmental organization in Nepal that is recognized as the National Mental Health Self-Help Organization. The empowerment training for sixteen mental health self-advocates was successfully conducted by KOSHISH, during 7 to 9 June 2014. The participants were made aware of the rights, policies and laws. The training enhanced their skills, boosting their confidence level and building their self-esteem. The training made participants realize their competencies in income generating activities. Two-day refresher training has also been completed in July 2014. Funding: about US\$ 13,000. Partners: RC Lakewood, District 5020; RC Patan, District 3292 and KOSHISH. Plus US\$ 1,000 to Fund an Empowerment training for mental health self-advocates.

Beneficiaries: 16 people suffering from mental illness and 15 staff at KOSHISH.

(Focus Area: Disease Prevention and Treatment)

Global Grant: Primary Prevention of Acute Rheumatic Fever and Rheumatic Heart Disease: The objectives for this global grant are: i) treat bacterial throat infection with oral antibiotics to needy children of school going age (5- 16 years) through health posts and sub-health posts and school based clinics; ii) to conduct epidemiological studies on streptococcal infection, rheumatic fever and RHD; and iii) to develop a national strategy for primary prevention of Acute Rheumatic Fever in Nepal. The direct beneficiaries will be a population of about 150,000, 5 to 16 years of age in the Lalitpur district. The indirect beneficiaries will be all 5-16 year olds once the National Strategy has been developed. The Grant is for US\$ 31,000. Partners: RC Delhi Chanakyapuri, District 3292, District 3690 South Korea, RC Patan and Nepal Heart Foundation. The global grant was approved on the 4th of August 2014.

Beneficiaries: about 150,000 children age 5-16 years of age and health professionals in Lalitpur

Vocational Services

Vocational Award: This year RC Patan provided its Vocational Award to Mr. Dharma Govinda Maharjan, former headmaster of the Harisiddhi Higher Secondary School in honour of his dedicated service and immense contribution to uplift the school and educational standard of the children of the area. The award ceremony took place on the 2nd of December 2013. The Awards carries a Certificate and NRs 5000.

Beneficiaries: 1 outstanding individual.

Youth Services

Sponsoring of first E-Club: The Rotary Club of Patan has sponsored the first E-Club of District 3292 that was chartered on 31 May 2013. The e-club encourages young professionals to join Rotary. The Charter Presentation Ceremony of Rotary E-Club of District 3292 (Nepal and Bhutan) took place on 13 July 2013.

Rotaract Club: Members of the Rotaract Club of Patan attend RC Patan's meetings regularly. RC Patan President Jeevan Shrestha released the Souvenir of Rotaract Club of Patan during the meeting and President Elect Khruschev Shrestha gave 'Dashain' wishes at a function on 11 October 2013. RC Patan contributed NRs. 20,000 to the Rotaract Club of Patan to support a health camp during the Dipankha Yatra.

Interact Clubs: (i) The Interact Club at the Balkumari Secondary school in Sunakothe - Members of the Interact Club participated in the awareness raising and cleaning campaign of the Sunakothe area on 11 January 2014. Rtn. Tulsi Maharjan from USA distributed school bags and stationary to Interactors during a programme organised at the school in January. (ii) The Interact Club at the Devibhanjyang Rastriya Primary School in Chandibhanjyang - This interact club has established a revolving fund.

Rotary Community Corps

RCC Sunakoti: The charter certificate was handed over on 10 October 2013. The RCC has 25 members and the RCC Chair is Mr. Bijaya K. Maharjan. In the village of Sunakothe, Lalitpur RC Patan has already supported two Matching Grant Projects (Dietician Training I and II); it provides scholarships to the public school of Sunakothe and has an ICC at the school. The RCC Sunakoti is active in community development activities, particularly in nutrition education and awareness, village sanitation and



cleanliness awareness raising, and health education. The Rotary Club of Patan joined the RCC Sunakothi, the Village Development Council, Srijanshil Environmental Protection Centre, and several NGOs and schools of Sunakothi area in the awareness raising and cleaning campaign of the Sunakothi area on 11 January 2014. A personal contribution of NRs 2000 by the RC Patan RCC coordinator was made to the RCC. The RC Patan's RCC Sunakoti Coordinator, Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty presided as the Chief Guest during a sports day function supported by the RCC Sunakothi at the Nava Suryodaya Secondary School on 2 March 2014. The RCC Chair, Mr. Bijay Kumar Maharjan and the Secretary of RCC Sunakoti attended the RCC District Training on 28 June. The RCC Conference concluded by forming a 14 member District Council, Mr. Maharjan is a member of the Council.

RCC Chandibhanjyang: The charter certificate was handed over on 7 December 2010. The RCC has 10 members and the RCC Chair is Mr. Gopi Silwal. The RCC Chair at Chandibhanjyang participated in the planning mission of the community development project with Heifer International, Nepal. The RCC Chair of Chandibhanjyang, Mr. Gopi Silwal attended the RCC District Training on 28 June 2014. The RCC Conference concluded by forming a 14 member District Council, Mr. Silwal is a member of the Council.

Health Services Related Community Services

Walk for Peace, Happiness and Healthy Heart: Members of the Rotary Club of Patan joined the Walk for Peace, Happiness and Healthy Heart organised by the Nepal Heart Foundation during the 'Dipankha Yatra' on 18 October 2013. The World Heart Federation has launched a global walking campaign entitled 'Ground Miles Challenge'. This initiative encouraged people around the world to walk 5 million miles (8 million kilometres) by the end of 2013.

Health Camp: The Rotary Club of Patan together with other hosts including the Nepal Heart Foundation, Sinchahiti Cooperatives, and the local Youth Club organised a Health Camp at Kanibahal in Patan on the second day of the 'Dipankha Yatra' on 19 October 2013. RC Patan contributed NRs 15,000 for this event.

Walk for Disability Awareness: Members of the Rotary Club of Patan participated in "Walk for Disability Awareness" on the International Day of Persons with Disabilities on 3 December 2003, which was organised by the Nepal Orthopaedic Hospital. RC Patan contributed NRs 15,000 to this event.

Polio Plus Programme: Members of the Rotaract Club of Patan and the President Nominee, Rtn. Piyush B. Bajracharya participated in the 15th National Immunization Day on 21 December 2013.

Health Camp in Palpa, Tansen: A health camp was conducted on 16-17 April 2014 at the Palpa District Hospital in Tansen where about 500 patients were examined and 150 Echocardiography tests done. Free medicines worth NRs 30,000 were distributed. Three doctors, four technicians and three nurses participated. Rtn. Dr. Prakash R. Regmi and Rtn. Ganesh Shrestha from RC Patan also participated in this event.

Beneficiaries: direct about 1000 people plus indirect community benefits.

RC Patan Members on Oversight Bodies of Rotary Initiated Projects

Nepal Orthopaedic Hospital (NOH): RC Patan initially sponsored NOH about 14 years ago, which now receives support from over 120 Rotary Clubs worldwide. Hospital Management Board Members include Rtn. Krishna B. Basnyat and Rtn. Jamuna K. Tamrakar from RC Patan.

Bhaktapur Cancer Hospital: RC Patan and 4 other clubs in Kathmandu were instrumental in establishing the hospital. The Cancer Relief Society is the oversight body; Rtn. Mani Dhoj Joshi (Kath Mid-Town) and Rtn Siba Bhakta Rajbandhary of the RC Patan are currently serving on its board.

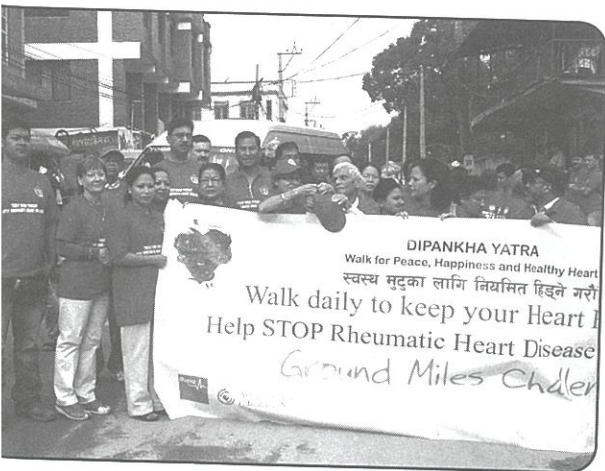

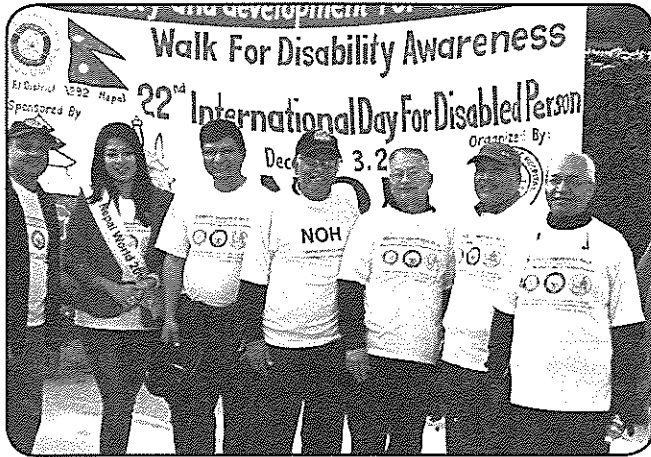

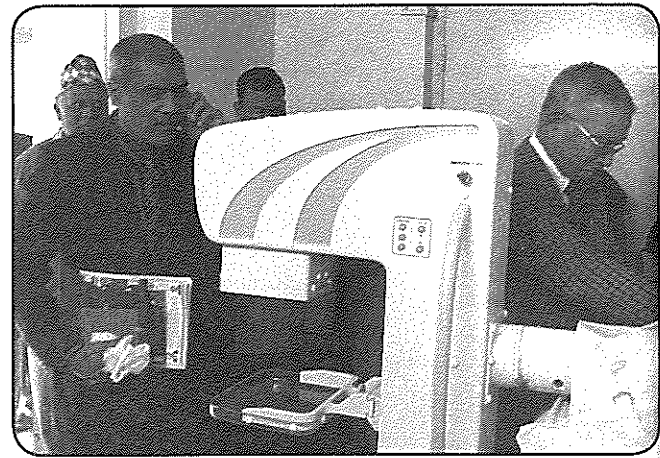

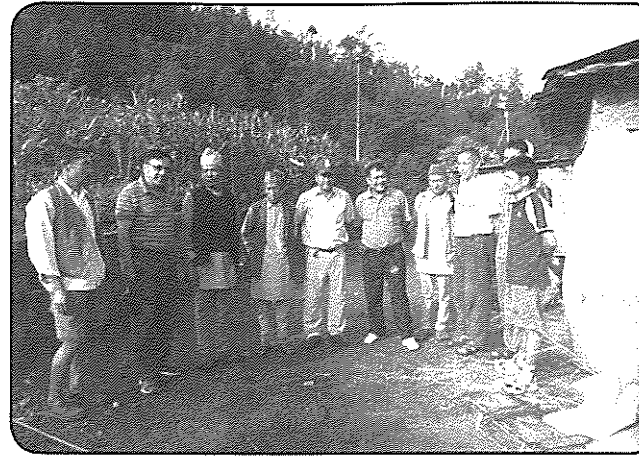

MID-DAY MEAL TO CHEPANG CHILDREN

(Project of RC Patan to feed the undernourished Chepang Children)

Five Years Review

(2009- 2014)

Mid-Day Meal at Devibhanjyang School

Rotary Club of Patan has initiated a feeding program (mid-day meal program) to Chepang children studying in Devi Bhanjyang Rastriya Primary School located in Chandibhanjyang village which is about 3km from Mugling, about 110 km from Kathmandu on Kathmandu-Pokhara-Narayanghat Highway, along the bank of Kali Khola (river), a tributary of Trisuli river. Chandibhanjyang village is approached by 20 minutes walk along steep uphill. Devi Bhanjyang school enrolls about 170 students; however, less than 50% attend school regularly as their parents keep them at home to look after smaller children while parents are away either in agriculture field or in forest cutting down trees. The school going children are highly undernourished and unclean. They are infected with diseases related to undernourishment.

The mid day meal project was started on 3rd June 2009 (26th Jesth 2066). In the first year children were given meal in school hour twice a week. From second year they were given mid day meal thrice a week. The meal menu consisted of Chiura (bitten rice), egg, seasonal fruit, beans, potato, dhindo of sarbottam pitho (super flour) etc. It was expected that providing mid day meal would improve the nutritional status as well as school attendance of the children.

Five Years Review (June 2009 to May 2014)

Mid day meal program has completed five years service to the undernourished Chepang students. Rotary club of Patan has contributed NRs 514718 (US\$ 5400) to this program in 4 years (NRs. 71,328; Nrs. 1,09,910, NRs 1,34,280, NRs. 1,03,900 and NRs. 95,300 in first, second, third, fourth and fifth year respectively). Around 50% of the club members have participated in this program. Their generous financial contribution has made this program highly successful in the achievement of its objectives. As a result the following achievements have been made:

1. Attendance of the students has improved by 20%
2. Drop out rate from school has decreased by 35%
3. Overall nutritional status of the children has improved. Anemia in children has significantly decreased.



Monitoring and Evaluation

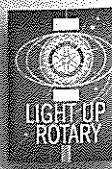
Monitoring was done through the RCC. Few visits were made by the RC Patan members during the Rotary year 2013-14. It was felt that direct monitoring by the club members was difficult due to the remote locality of the village. Nevertheless attempts were made to keep in regular touch with the RCC and made field visits whenever possible.

Phasing out of the Mid-Day Meal Project and Initiation of Village Development Project

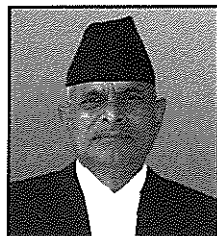
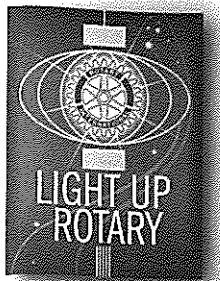
Due to difficulty in monitoring, RCP decided to phase out the mid day meal project. The project will end from January 2015. Although all members of RCP wholeheartedly supported the endeavor to feed the malnourished children it was felt that some more works to be initiated in the village to uplift the socio-economic status of the inhabitants. This could be done by initiating village development projects in this community. RCP in collaboration with Heifer International has already initiated Chandibhanjyang village development project. We hope to see all children of this village attending school with sound health and smiling face in the days to come.

MANAGEMENT & FINANCIAL REPORT AS OF 30 JUNE 2014

1. Since its establishment in 1991, the RCP's flagship PEEF has successfully expanded into a relatively large trust fund with permanent contributions crossing the 10 million Nepalese Rupees mark. Through the PEEF, over 600 public school students of lower-income families in 29 schools of Lalitpur District are currently receiving scholarships to support them from grade 6 to 10.
2. With the project running commendably for the last 23 years, the RCP went through a major review of its management and operation in 2013-2014. This Management and Financial Report captures key actions taken during the reporting year and provides a comprehensive summary, together with an attachment showing all PEEF contributors and contributions.
3. Following the RCP Constitution and By-Laws, a 'Management and Operational Policies' (PEEF MOPs) was approved by the RCP Board and the RCP House, which separates the PEEF Trust Fund from the PEEF Operational Fund and outlines the policies and procedures of its management, criteria for support, investments and financial management mechanisms, and administrative responsibilities.
4. A Committee established by the RCP Board and endorsed by the RCP House is responsible for the day-to-day management of the PEEF. This committee has the following membership for the Rotary Year 2014-2015:

5. In the Rotary Year 2013-2014, NRs. 1,329,532 were contributed to the PEEF Trust Fund, bringing it to NRs. 10,522,648.50. In addition, NRs. 337,500 were contributed as one-time contributions to the Operational Fund based on a special appeal (see below), and NRs.130,120 were contributed specifically for the Rotary Year 2013-2014. The contributors and contributions list in the following pages captures all of these contributions.
6. The PEEF Trust Fund initially set a standard contribution amount of NRs. 10,000 in the perpetual support of one student based on estimates from bank interests at that time. The need to increase this amount emerged in order to take inflation into account. Therefore, over the years, the permanent contribution amount was progressively raised to NRs. 15,000 and then to NRs. 20,000 per student.
7. This year, the PEEF was affected by two major issues — first, the very rapid diminishing of bank interest rates and second, the challenge of maintaining our commitments to perpetual support. Today, interest income from a deposit of NRs. 10,000 is only around NRs. 650, whereas the scholarship amount is NRs. 1,500, and for students with 'distinction grades' it is NRs. 2,000. The RCP does not wish to reduce these amounts. Therefore, the permanent contribution amount has been raised to NRs. 30,000 or US \$350.00, with effect from 1 June 2014.
8. The RCP is also committed to continuing the perpetual support of students from all sponsors, including those who had contributed less than Rs 30,000 per student. In this context, the RCP has taken several fundraising measures. One such measure is to approach our sponsors for a one-time voluntary contribution to reduce the shortfall. We are requesting our sponsors to consider contributing the difference between NRs. 30,000 and the actual amount originally contributed for the perpetual support of a student. Together with this, the PEEF Committee is also reviewing long-term plans for better investment management and establishing reserves in the Operational Fund to cover fluctuations in the interest incomes from the Trust Fund.
9. The one-time contribution of NRs. 337,500 mentioned in paragraph 5 above was a result of the special appeal made to the RCP members before approaching the larger base of sponsors.

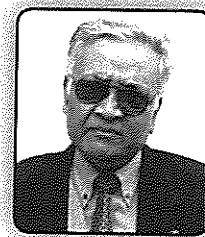

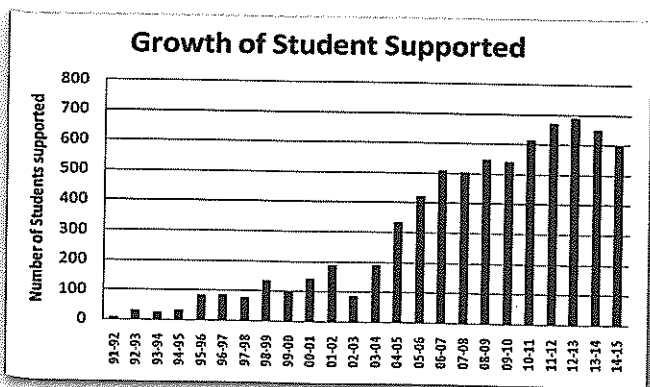

1. Achievement Till date

Prajapati Education Endowment Fund (PEEF) – Scholarship Program was initiated in 1991. Since then it had provided support for education to 2307 students (57% girls) from economically deprived families till date. Out of this 827 students had completed Grade 10. The following table summarizes the students supported by scholarship program in schools - start of the program, total student supported and students completing Grade 10.

Each student is normally supported from Grade 6 to 10 unless any drop out or fails or program is discontinued in school. Students at Grade 6 are selected on the basis of economic need rather than academic excellence. Support to 4 new students in Grade 6 are provided in almost all programme schools.

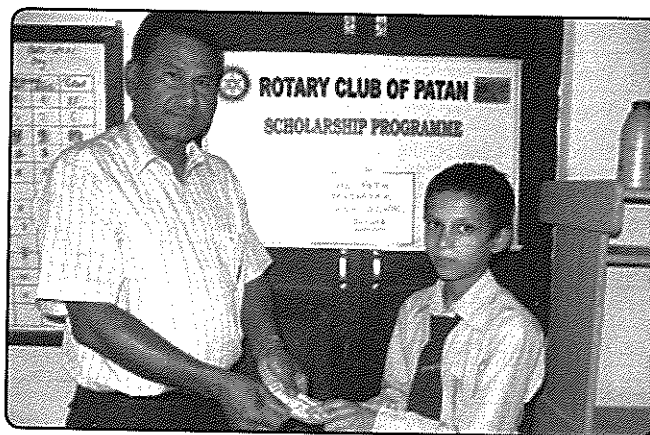
The growth of students supported since 1991 to date is presented in the Chart shown below. Accordingly to the PEEF Policy, since 2013-14, any new student will be selected in place of students who were dropped out or failed/discontinued if funds are available. Decline in number of students supported in recent years is noted.



2. Activities in Current Year 2014-2015

As of August 18, 2014, distribution of scholarship in this year (2014-2015) had been completed in 26 schools out of 29 schools including at Sankhu. Support is provided to 600+ students in this year which also includes new students at Grade 6. Number of students supported in each school is also listed in Table 1.

There is a large participation of Rotarians in this program - 17 Rotarians, 2 spouses and 4 others. They visited schools in selecting new students by interviewing students recommended by school administration and personally handed over scholarship amount to students. Some Rotarians have made multiple visits to supported schools. Some representative photographs of activities of scholarship distribution are presented at left of this text.



Financial management of PEEF fund and issues are presented separately by Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty, Financial Manager, PEEF Committee.

It is planned to activate reporting to the sponsors in this year along with a pledge for additional contribution.

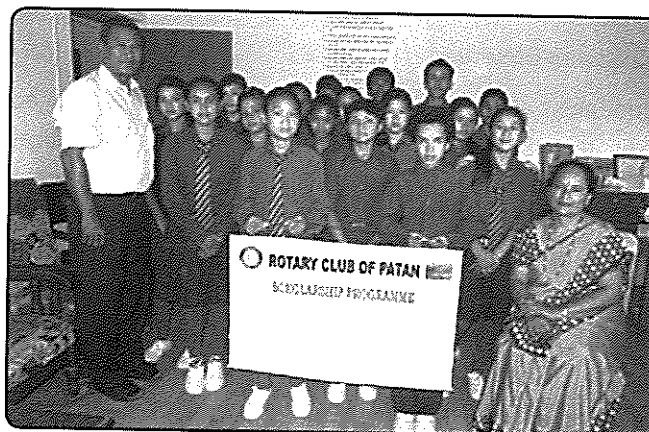

3. Issues Observed

Enrollment of students in school has remarkably changed over recent time. Previously the children from local permanent residents used to enroll in governmental schools, whereas in recent years they have switched to private schools. As such majority of students now belong to temporary residents who migrated from outside the valley for livelihood. When the migrant residents move to another place, they take their children along with them resulting in increased number of students drop outs.

“सन् १९७० मा नेपालमा २५ वर्षको उमेरमा आएकि थिएँ । मलाई त्यो बेलामा मेरो देशमा कसैले पनि पोलियो खोप लिनुपर्छ भनेर भनेनन् । म विवाह गरेर नेपालमा मधुमास मनाउन आएकि थिएँ । काठमाडौँबाट पोखरा पनि गएकि थिएँ । ४-५ दिन पोखरामा बसेपछि मलाई वेस्सरी ज्वरो आयो । हात खुट्टा कमजोर जस्तै भयो । त्यहाँबाट मलाई काठमाडौँ ल्याए । पाटन अस्पतालमा (शान्त भवन) केही दिन राखे र धेरै उपचार भयो । पछि मलाई जाँच गर्ने डाक्टरले मलाई भन्नु भएको थियो । तपाईंलाई पोलियो भएको थियो । यति ठूलो भइसके पछि पोलियो हुनु अपवाद नै हो, तर नेपालमा आउँदा पोलियो खोप लिएर आउनु भएको भए, तपाईंको जिन्दगीमा यस्तो हुँदैनथ्यो । अब तपाईंको खुट्टाहरूले हिँड्नमा साथ दिने छैनन् । धन्य तपाईंको ज्यान बच्यो, त्यही ठूलो कुरा हो ।” ७० वर्षकि अन्नाले मलाई भनेकि थिइन् । उनी ह्विलचियरमा बसेर कथा सुनाउँदै गर्दा, आँखा रसाएको थियो श्रीमान्को आँखामा पनि आँसु थियो रे । उनको श्रीमान्ले उनको हात सुमसुम्याइरहेका थिए । बालबालिकाको रोग मानिए पनि पोलियो कहिलेकाहीं ठूलालाई पनि आक्रमण गर्छ भन्ने कुरा पढेको मात्र थिए, अन्नालाई भेटेपछि मैले त्यो देखे पनि ।

उनको कथा सुनेपछि मनमा लाग्यो नेदरल्याण्डबाट नेपाल घुम्न आएकि अन्नालाई यदि उनले पोलियो थोपा खाएकि भए, अपाङ्गताबाट बचाउँथ्यो तर अपशोच उनी मधुमास मनाउन आएको बेला पोलियोबाट ग्रस्त भइन ।

अन्नासँग मैले १४ वर्ष अघि भेटेको थिए । उनीसँग भेटेपछि म संसारका विभिन्न देशमा अफगानिस्तान, सुडान, लाओस आदि ठाउँमा काम गर्न जाँदा जहिले पनि पोलियो थोपा चाँहि खाएर नै ती ठाउँहरूमा जान्थे । किनभने कतै मलाई पनि ती देशमा जाँदा कतै पोलियोले आक्रमण गर्नु भन्ने के गर्ने भन्ने डर लाग्थ्यो ।

२०-२५ वर्ष अघि नेपालका गाउँघरमा जाँदा त्यहाँ ज्वरो आएर र खुट्टा लुलो भएर कति जना बालबालिकाको

मृत्यु भएकै कुरा गाउँमा सुनाउँथे । बेस्सरी ज्वरो आएपछि मानसिक अपाङ्गता भएका बालबालिकालाई देखाएर आमाबाबुको “यो त मरेको भए हुन्थ्यो । यस्तो अवस्था छ, हामी मरेपछि यसको स्याहार कसले गर्ला । आफ्नो अघि गए मनमा शान्ति हुन्थ्यो । आफू नभए पछि त यस्तोलाई कसले खान देला र ?” दुःखी मनले भनेका कति सुनिन्थ्यो ।

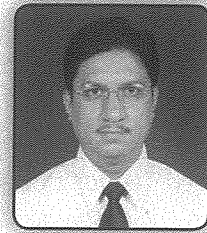

Tips for Rotarians to enjoy rotary and fellowship

ONLY HEALTHY ROTARIANS CAN ENJOY ROTARY

Are you a Rotarian? If yes, you need to take care of your health more than other people in the society. You can ask me why? It is because you are in Rotary not just to be a Rotarian and wear a Rotary pin. You are here to serve the society and to ENJOY ROTARY. These are two clear cut objectives to become a Rotarian. You should be well prepared to meet these objectives. Health, wealth and wisdom are the three important factors that can drive you successfully around the ROTARY WORLD.

Health in my opinion is more important than the other two factors. If your health is poor you can neither serve the society nor enjoy rotary. You all know for sure what means serve the society. In rotary words it is doing service projects. We all Rotarians frequently repeat the MOTO of Rotary SERVICE ABOVE SELF. Serving the society is putting service projects on your shoulders. Your body should be able to bear the load of the service projects. For this you need to have strong shoulders, healthy heart and other organs and of course very strong two legs. Otherwise you will be crashed by the service projects and land up in ICU of nearby hospital. Do you wish to suffer this condition? Of course not. So why don't you think about keeping yourself in a good health?

ENJOY ROTARY- do you really know what does this mean? You can enjoy rotary through FELLOWSHIP and SERVICE. About service I have already given you some thoughts. Now let's talk about FELLOWSHIP. This is a rotary word which means meeting with friends, talking on different issues, eating, drinking, laughing and enjoying life. It is thought that idea and means for service can be generated during healthy fellowship. So rotary came up with the famous words SERVICE THROUGH FELLOWSHIP. Do you know what you need for having good fellowship? Again it is good health. If you are having uncontrolled blood pressure, blood sugar, Cholesterol, uric acid, stomach problems and so on, then you are gone! You cannot enjoy

the fellowship at all. These days most of the Rotarians are having high blood pressure, Diabetes, high cholesterol, high uric acid and heart problems. So what to do? Stay without fellowship? Then what's the charm of being a Rotarian without participating in fellowship programs?

Diseases come with age, unhealthy lifestyles, heredity, infections etc. More than 80% of the world's populations have one or more diseases. We Rotarians are also not exceptions. Many of us have several health problems. Some of us have serious heart problems- heart attacks, Bypass, stents, pacemakers, strokes and so on. So how can we enjoy rotary? How can we enjoy fellowship? I can give you some tips for getting out of these problems. Following these tips you can enjoy fellowship even if you are a heart patient with diseases like high blood pressure, diabetes, high cholesterol etc. But these advices are not free of cost! Do you know why? There is nothing free in rotary. You have to pay for it. I also think that free advice does not work. You promise me to donate NRs 1000 to the sunshine fund then continue reading the following lines.

TIPS for Rotarians to stay healthy and enjoy rotary

1. Don't smoke cigarettes or use any tobacco products. Tobacco is considered to be the world's top health hazard and killer number one who kills 50% of its users.
2. Eat a healthy diet with at least five servings of fruits and vegetables per day. (One serving equals to a medium sized fruit like apple, banana a handful of grapes, berry, a slice of melon, papaya, a small plate of green salad, cooked vegetable etc.)
3. Develop a healthy eating habit. Do not skip breakfast. Have a good breakfast, medium lunch and small dinner. DO NOT OVEREAT. Avoid high carbohydrate diet, high saturated fats. Avoid junk foods. They contain high trans fats, sugar and salt.



4. Exercise daily or walk briskly 30 minutes daily. Or practice yoga daily.
5. Keep your bad cholesterol (LDL cholesterol) below 100mg/dl. Take cholesterol lowering medicine if your LDL level does not come down with diet and exercise. Don't be afraid of taking these drugs. They save your life and keep you fit to enjoy fellowship. High cholesterol can be easily controlled by medicines. You can easily prevent possible heart attack and stroke by keeping your LDL level below 100. Please remember all those with diabetes above 40 years age **MUST TAKE CHOLESTEROL LOWERING DRUG** to prevent heart attack and stroke. Enjoy eating lean meat and fish even if you have high cholesterol. Don't worry, just enjoy. But don't forget to check your cholesterol level regularly.
6. Keep your blood pressure (BP) below 140/90mmHg. Check you BP regularly. Have a BP measuring instrument at home for self use. If your BP is above 140/90 you are always at risk for developing stroke. At this condition even a PEG of WHISKEY may rapidly raise your BP causing stroke. In 50% of people with high BP the cause of stroke is alcohol. Stroke may cause death. If you want to enjoy whiskey then you need to keep your BP below 140/90 by any means. The best way is to take BP lowering pills regularly. Don't be afraid of these pills. They save your life.
7. Keep fasting blood sugar below 100 mg/dl and two hours postprandial below 140mg/dl. If your blood sugar level is under control then you can enjoy potato, rice, cheese cake and even ice cream and sweets. But don't forget to walk daily for one hour if you are a diabetic. You should also take your pills regularly. Taking proper care of your health you can enjoy fellowship.
8. Alcohol is medicine in low dose but poison in high dose. Over drinking is very harmful. If your doctor has given green signal then you can enjoy up to 60 ml of good whiskey 5 days a week. Yes 60 ml 5 days a week for adult males. Don't get surprised! This is exactly what the scientists say. You can enjoy healthy snacks with your drink. Don't take deep fried items and junk foods. Enjoy salads, fruits and grilled, steamed, roasted items. They are delicious. Enjoy the taste of snacks not the drink in high dose. Don't dilute the whiskey with soda. This doubles the harmful effect of alcohol. Taste your whiskey with ice cubes as whiskey lovers say **WHISKEY ON ROCKS**. Drink slowly sip by sip. Enjoy the taste. 10. Annual health check up is compulsory. Fix the date of your annual check up and do it without any delay. Non Communicable diseases like heart diseases, diabetes; high BP, high cholesterol, cancer etc have no symptoms at all. Don't wait till you develop symptoms. When you have symptoms it's already late. You need to treat these conditions before you develop any symptoms. This is what the wise Rotarians do. "I have no symptoms, I feel great so why should I go for health check up and why should I take treatment?" This is foolishness. Yes I call it foolishness. This is the cause of heart attacks, strokes and sudden deaths which could be easily prevented. This foolish attitude to health should come to an end in rotary. Wake up Rotarians. Light up rotary with the wisdom of heart healthy choices which are in your own hands.
11. Control your emotion but increase your donation. Emotion causes rapid raise in BP causing stroke. Emotion is responsible for heart attack and sudden death. Say **NO TO EMOTION**. On the contrary donation decreases BP, blood sugar and even blood cholesterol. Donating habit can decrease your stress level causing positive impact on your overall health. So develop your habit of donating to rotary foundation and other causes. Those who donate more live more and enjoy more. Don't you believe? Just try and feel the joy. **ENJOY ROTARY ENJOY FELLOWSHIP**. For this **STAY HEALTHY**. Rotary needs healthy Rotarians. Rotary needs you.

Rotary District's Efforts for Total Literacy by 2017 in Nepal

Introduction:

To address the issue of **illiteracy**: the root causes of poverty, unemployment, lack of hygiene and also eventually peace; especially in South Asia a Rotary South Asia Conference on Literacy was organized by the Rotary International and hosted by RI District 3292, at Kathmandu, Nepal; between 1st – 3rd March 2012. With the co-operation of the Ministry of Education, Govt. of Nepal (MoE/GoN); and with the active roles of UNICEF and UNESCO; besides other Corporate institutions; the aim was to address the issue of attaining the commitment of **Total Literacy by 2017 in South Asia**, with a focus on:

1. Child Development,
2. School Development, and
3. Total Literacy Mission

The Strategy:

With the above commitment; Rotary International District 3292 formed the National Co-ordination Committee: with a Steering Committee with working committees, mainly focusing on planning, advocacy, developing partnership and policy making functions for the Rotary District; and supported by active Working Committees, on:

- Water & Sanitation (focus on school toilets),
- Infrastructure Development in Schools (focus on equipment/computers etc., library/books, furniture and construction/renovation less toilets),
- Scholarship, and
- Non Formal and HRD

Collaboration:

With such a huge responsibility, the Rotary District 3292, realized that partnership and co-operation of the Government, the UNICEF and UNESCO, besides other agencies working and contributing in the sector; was necessary. Corporate and Financial institutions will also be partners to create proper CSR approaches/commitments.

A Workshop on Literacy Development in Nepal was held on 11th -12th January 2013; as a follow up of the previous South Asia Summit, and to further consolidate the partnership especially between the Government, the UNICEF and UNESCO, with Rotary.

Developments:

The National Coordination Committee has along with the various Working Committees held a series of meetings and discussions both with the Government of Nepal, multi national donor agencies and few corporate houses. At the March 2012 Conference; agreements were also signed between

- Water Aid & Rotary: Where a Rotary National Fund for Sanitation will be established, with special emphasis for making toilets.
- HISSAN/PABSON & Rotary – for scholarships and school development

MOU with the Ministry of Education, Government of Nepal:

On 25th of September 2013, and under the aegis and in the presence of Hon. Madhav Prasad Paudel, Minister for Education; a Memorandum of Understanding was signed between Ministry of Education, Government of Nepal and the Rotary International District 3292; with the following Action Plan:

- 1) RID 3292 would encourage each of it's Rotary Clubs to participate in school adoption program, with the following actions:
 - Create/Renovate toilets, especially for the girl child in school.
 - Provide clean drinking water, mid day meals, scholarships including uniform/textbooks, school furniture, equipment/computer and sports and recreational facilities in schools.



- Create or update libraries
 - Organize teacher training programs
 - Conduct adult literacy to non literate adults in the selected VDCs and wards of Municipalities.
- 2) Involve in advocacy for literacy with partners towards the goal and also agree to fight against child labor.
- 3) To harness information technology on comprehensive basis to achieve 'Total Literacy by 2017', by adopting distance learning projects; or developing the Rota Slate for providing literacy and education and or using other innovative methods.

Rotary South Asia:

In Rotary's continued effort, a Rotary South Asia Literacy Summit was held at New Delhi, India on the 14th-15th December 2013; where **Total Literacy & Quality Education** was introduced as an aggressive goal to meet the deadline of 2017; by rolling out the Total Literacy Mission Plan with the adoption of a Program, so comparable to the one pursued in RID 3292:

- T for Teach
- E for E-learning
- A for Adult Literacy
- C for Child Development, and
- H for Happy Schools.

The proposed TEACH program is quite similar to the proposed Working Committees of the **National Co-ordination Committee- Total Literacy by 2017** for the single District 3292 – WISH for (W) Water & Sanitation/ (I) Infrastructure/ (S) Scholarship/ (H) Human Resource Development & Non Formal Education.

Rotary District 3292 in Educational projects:

Nepal, the fifth poorest country in the world, has one of the highest illiteracy rates. It's literacy is 45.2% and is the world's 15th Illiterate country. More than half the total population of Nepal can not read and write. Female literacy is less than the half of the literacy of males.

Nepal Literacy Facts

- There are 26277 government schools in Nepal with 6018806 students
- On average a school has about 230 students
- On average a school has about 5 teachers, a teacher has 50 students
- About 200,000 students are studying in 473 colleges in Nepal.

The Rotary International District 3292 has 89 Clubs with its nearly 2800 Rotarians selflessly contributing in serving humanity. Rotary Clubs strength also lie in their partners in service: Rotaract Clubs, Interact Clubs and even the Rotary Ann (or Spouse) Groups; or the Rotary Community Corps.

Since the arrival of Rotary in Nepal, in the late 50s, Rotary Clubs have undertaken a number of projects: such as supporting construction or rebuilding/refurbishing schools, infrastructure, toilets especially for girls, drinking water supply, girl child education, scholarships, provision of school materials, school benches/desks adult education, providing computers and establish libraries, providing uniforms and mid day meals, running CLE programs; the list goes on.

Basic Education & Literacy, one of Rotary's six areas of focus, reflects a widespread humanitarian need to improve education and literacy for youth and adults. From the beginning of the Rotary movement in Nepal over 151 projects (totaling US\$ 3,005,749.50) and 76 projects (of US\$ 1,777,255.50) since 1 July 2008 when RID 3292 was officially effective; have been successfully implemented. Overall around 30% of the projects are in the area of education. In 1991 a US\$ 54,000.00 project in providing school fees, books, educational materials and uniforms for 200 Nepalese children for five years was one of the first projects in this sector. Again in 1997 another project of US\$ 25,300 was in providing materials and training in literacy and various vocations to poor adults and children through community learning centers located in the few villages.

Presently, following the MOU with the MoE/GoN Rotary in Nepal has been trying to work on formats to assist the government in meeting it's target on 100% literacy by 2015. The Non Formal Education Center/MoE which is probably more responsible in this area, has requested RID 3292 to partner in this area. In turn Rotary is looking at possibility of associating in the government's program in the Nepal Districts, through the local District Education Offices.

Rotary Clubs in Lalitpur together with the DEO are helping the remaining individuals (nearly 4210) in the 15 VDCs and 1 Ward of the Municipality of Lalitpur District; to become literate. Initial steps are taken in the VDCs of Goddamchaur, Nallu, Devichaur and Nallu – where RCs in Lalitpur have made commitments/contributions to donations for books/stationary, monitoring, volunteers for training and inspection/evaluation.

In Chitwan the target is to make the District literate by 2014 itself. Thus, a working committee including the Presidents of each Rotary Club alongwith the AGs (2013-14 and 2014-15); the Co-ordinator of the CLC Network in Chitwan, and being chaired by the District Education Officer, Chitwan. Immediately support has been made by Clubs in providing:

- Advocacy of the 100% Literacy program through hoarding boards at strategic locations;
- Providing 10 solar lights by each club for the program;
- Providing 2 feet x 3 feet black boards by each club for the program;
- Advocacy of the 100% Literacy program through a press meet;
- To make the program successful advocacy of the 100% Literacy program through "radio jingles" in local FM stations, to be co-ordinated by RC Narayangarh; and
- Advocacy of the 100% Literacy program through folk songs, to be co-ordinated by RC Ratnanagar.

Similar efforts have been also initiated by Rotary in Rupandehi and Kaski, and surrounding/adjacent Districts. The joint effort of the Director General and Under Secretaries from NFEC including the respected Kaski CA member; besides so many DEOs and other government officials; have also participated in supporting the commitment and effort.

In advocating towards Total Literacy, RID 3292 targets all school going children, especially girls, and also elders beyond the age of 60; additionally complimenting the


government's program for ages 15-60, only. A proposal for a pilot global grant project has been prepared where Rotaractors/Interactors or even school going children having a break after the SLC exam; would be the volunteers in making literate their families and communities in the country. In fact a suggestion is made to the MoE/GoN to allocate some additional marks to every school student having made literate a family or their community member. The government's Non Formal Education Center has proposed many schemes in this area, and RID 3292 is trying to work in fitting to the strategies.

Having said this the efforts of UNICEF in the OOSC (Out of School Children) or GATE (Girls' Access to Education) projects could also be promoted and participated by the Rotary Clubs. And the efforts of UNESCO in advocacy and promotion of Literacy through the local CLCs (Community Learning Centers) could also be supported by the Rotary Clubs, for activities including all possible age groups. The use of the CLCs could be further optimized with a number health/hygiene, vocational, capacity building, revenue earning, self and community development programs/activities that Rotary is so involved in. Complimenting and partnering with one another has always been a Rotary forte, and we look forward to materialize the commitments through the same, too.

8th September is World Literacy Day. The NFEC of the GoN has plans to make the event a success with awareness programs, the same day, to achieve the target of Total Literacy in Nepal by 2015. As partners with GoN, RI District 3292 is expected to actively participate, in the same.

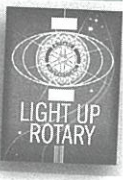

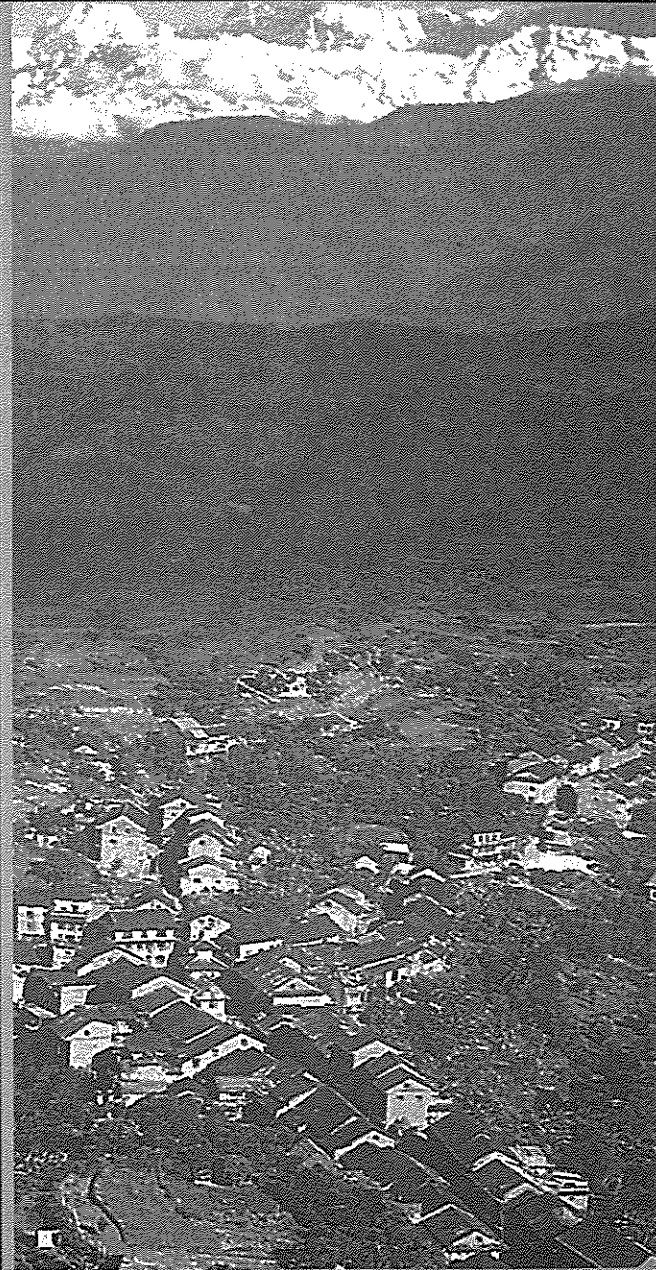

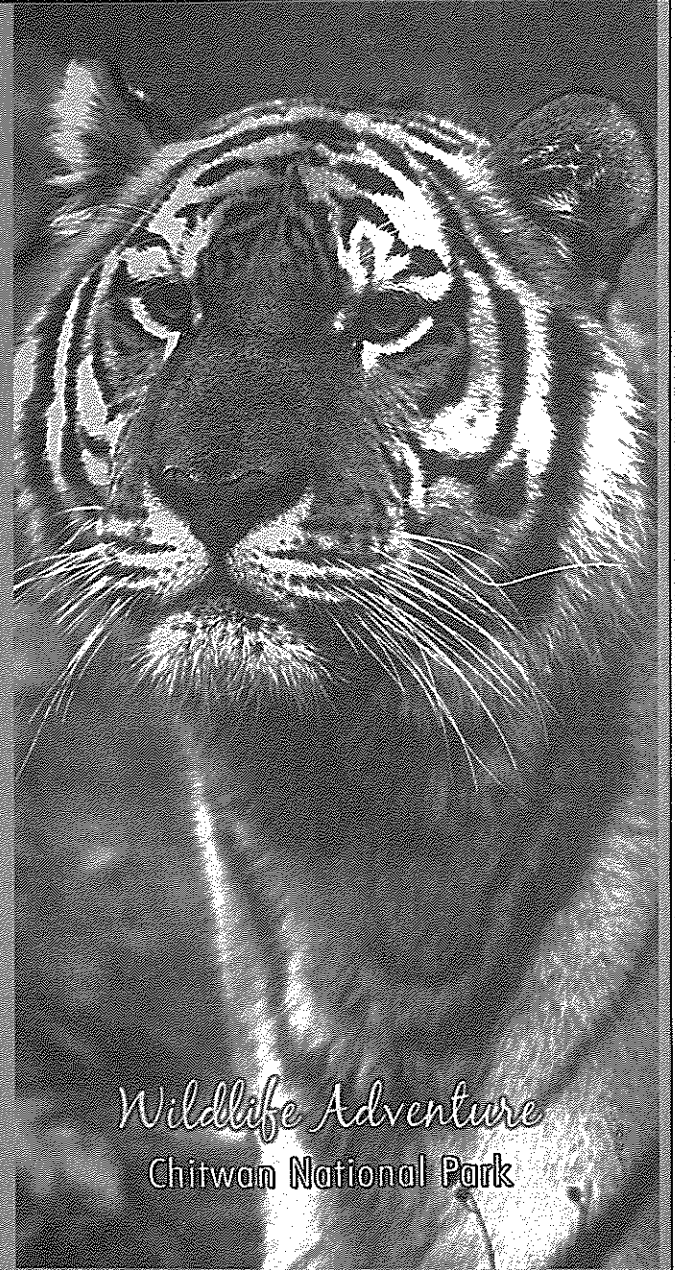

Action Steps:

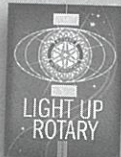
