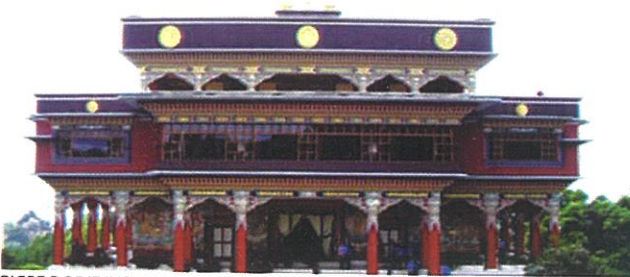

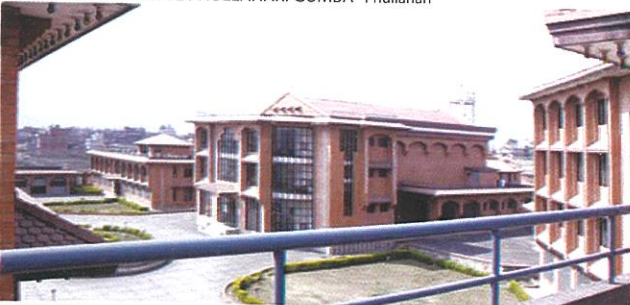

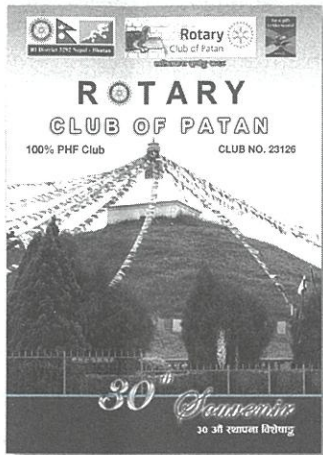

I would also like to express my appreciation as well as deep gratitude to all my colleagues in the editorial board for their continuous advice, valuable inputs and guidance.

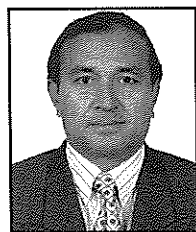

Club Leadership & Board Meetings

The Rotary Club of Patan is lead by a 15 Member Board. This year 14 regular and 2 emergency Board Meetings were held. The first emergency meeting was held due to the sudden illness of President Khruschev Shrestha on 4 August, necessitating a leadership change. Rtn. Matsyendra Lal Kayastha was unanimously elected to be the President ad interim (a.i.) that he kindly agreed. The second emergency meeting was held to plan RCP's response to the devastating earthquake that struck Nepal on the 25th of April 2015.



Club Administration

The Audit Report and Annual Budget were duly completed and finalized in July. The RCP Constitution and Bylaws were reviewed and revised in August based on RI's latest guidelines. All District and RI dues were paid on time as required. The Club Registration was duly renewed in early December 2014. All required documents were presented to the District Governor, Rtn. Rabindra Piya during his official visit to the club during the Charter Night Celebration on 29 August 2014. The RCP conducted five Club Assemblies during the RY.



Membership

The RCP started the Rotary Year with 39 members and completed the year with 44 members by adding 4 new members and reinstating one previous member. The RCP prides itself of having 5 couple members with 9 women as its members. Three RCP members received RI's sponsor recognition pin of the 'Blue Backer' (for bringing 1 new member) and one member received the 'Bronze Backer' (for bringing second new member).



Club Attendance

The average club meeting attendance for the Rotary Year 2014/15 was 65.5%. This is an above average attendance among clubs in the District, however efforts are being made to engage those members that have very low

attendance records, by involving them in club activities and fellowships.

Special Fellowships & Outing

A three-day 'Annual Family Outing' was organised at Gorkha Gaun Resort in Gorkha, with games, yoga and visit to the historic Gorkha Palace from 19 to 21 December 2014. The RCP has again organized three birthday group fellowship dinners with active participation of members and spouses. Board members hosted board meetings followed by fellowship dinners every month. The fellowships often included spouses and guests. A Past-Presidents Fellowship was organised and hosted by PP Rtn. Jamuna Tamrakar.



The 'Rotary Family Month' was celebrated on 29 December 2014 with a record 30 members attending to welcome RC President Khrushchev Shrestha to his first meeting after a long illness. Warm mulled wine and home baked Christmas cookies brought warmth to every heart.

Every 5th Monday meeting in a month when there are 5 Mondays, the RCP organizes a special Entertainment Programme where members share anecdotes and jokes to the entertainment of all present.

This year's Charter Day Celebration and District Governor's Official Visit on the 29th of August 2014 was marked with the installation of three new members, the pinning of ten additional PHF/MPHF members, and the traditional honoring of Charter Members and members with more than 25 years in the Club.

Public Relation and International Contacts

The RCP publishes the Lalitdhara Souvenir (Annual Club Magazine) every year for its Charter Day celebrations on the 29th of August. Every week the club publishes its weekly Lalitdhara Newsletter recording the event of

the weekly meeting and updates on current events. The bulletin is now also made available weekly on the RCP Facebook page.

The Facebook Page <https://www.facebook.com/RotaryClubPatan> is used to update on weekly events, project highlights, Rotary International news and events. The Page has reached over 360 likes and has reached more than 1000 post for some of the most popular posts.

The RCP has a tradition of a Weekly Club Salutations. Every week during the club meeting on Monday the club salutes one Rotary Club and an e-mail of "Greetings" is sent to the saluted club the following day.

Rtn. Dr. Shivaji B. Silwal exchanged club banners with the President, Bruce G. Kelley of the Rotary Club of Des Moines, Iowa, USA during his visit to Iowa on 17 July 2014. Past President Rabindra R. Pandey conveyed greetings from the RCP President and its members to President Jennifer Hara and the members of the RC Washington D.C. on 24 September 2014. Rtns. Kamala and Padam Lal Maharjan attended the meeting of the Rotary Club of Dubai and exchanged banners during a lunch meeting on 20 October 2014.

Several project events of the RCP have been covered in the local printed media and on local television. For its Global Grant Projects, the RCP has started to put up hoarding boards in public places.

Fundraising and The Rotary Foundation

During the RY 2014/15 the RCP made a total contribution of US\$ 3,930 to the Rotary Foundation Annual Fund and an additional US\$ 200 to the Polio Plus Fund. This brought the total per capita contribution to US\$ 96 which is higher than the average per capita contribution in the District 3292 of US\$ 59.





The RCP has raised additional NRs. 221,600 to the Club Trust Fund to bring the total funds in the Club Trust Fund to NRs. 1,021,600.

In the flagship programme of the Club, 'PEEF', the RCP raised contributions of NRs. 753,758 to the Trust Fund, NRs. 590,846 as one-time contributions to the Operational Fund, and NRs.103,498 as Annual Contributions. The PEEF Trust Fund reached NRs. 11,276,434 at the end of June 2015.

Two Global Grants were approved in the Rotary Year 2014/15. GG 1418219 for the Primary Prevention of Rheumatic Heart Disease in the amount of US\$ 31,000 and GG 1527136 for the Vocational Education of 110 'Kamlari' girls in Western Nepal in the amount of US\$ 54,099.

The RCP also completed a District Community Grant with RC Lakewood, USA for US\$ 13,456.

For Earthquake Disaster Relief, the RCP has started a separate Fundraising Effort with a goal of raising US\$ 50,000 (See separate report below).

In November during 'Rotary Foundation Month', the RC Patan organised a special session on 'The Rotary Foundation' coordinated by Rtn. Ganesh R. Shrestha, TRF Chairperson. Members were reminded about the programmes of the Rotary Foundation and encouraged to contribute to the Foundation.

It would be relevant here to Quote RI President Gary Huang: "Our Rotary friendships give light to our lives, and it is Rotary friendship – as well as service – that lets us Light Up Rotary."

Partners in Service and New Generation

The Rotary Club of Patan sponsors the Rotaract Club of Patan. The RCP supports the future leaders of the Rotaract Club through joint projects, financial and technical support. The annual blood donation camp was organised on 14 March with the Rotaract Club of Patan for which Rtn. Lalita Thapa contributes NRs 10,000 annually.

The RC Patan also sponsors three Interact Clubs: the Interact Club of Sunakothi, Lalitpur; the Interact Club of Pragati School, Kupandole; and the Interact Club of Chandi-Bhanjyang, Chitwan. During the Interact week in November 2014, the Interact Club of Pragati School President, Ms. Sumita Gurung, the Secretary Survi Karki, and Coordinator Mr. Jit Bikram Khadka were invited to the RCP club meeting. President Gurung introduced the

newly established Interact Club and its plans to actively work as a 'school based' programme with focus on skills development opportunities. They are starting a 'keep the school clean signature campaign', which should have a multiplier effect at students' homes & the community.

During the Interact week, the Interact Club at the Sunakothi, organised a cleaning campaign of the Baudha Jana Bihar Garden, the Balkumari Temple compound and the passage between the Bihar and the Temple. The Interactors were divided into three groups to clean the three places. Many of the members of the Interact Club are students who receive scholarship support from the RC Patan.

The Rotary Club of Patan has sponsored the first e-club of District 3292 that was chartered on 31 May 2013. The e-club encourages young professionals to join Rotary.

The Rotary Club of Patan has two Rotary Community Corps (RCC). The RCC of Sunakothi, Lalitpur was chartered in October 2013 and it has 25 members. The RCC Chair, Mr. Bijay Kumar Maharjan is a member of the District 3292 RCC Council.

The RCC of Chandi-Bhanjyang was chartered in December 2010 and it has 10 members. The RCC Chair of Chandi-Bhanjyang, Mr. Gopi Silwal is a member of the District Council. Mr. Silwal has assisted in the earthquake relief efforts of the RCP in Chandi-Bhanjyang.

Vocational Service

During the Rotary's 'Vocational Service Month' of October, the RCP "**Outstanding Service Award**" was given to Ms. Rita Thapa, founder of TEWA for outstanding social service, Ms. Dil Kumari Chaudhary for outstanding service in Women Empowerment through her work with 'Kamlari' girls, and Ms. Gita Banjara for outstanding humanitarian



service through service to psychiatric patients. The three awardees were honoured by President a.i. Matsyendra L. Kayastha, Assistant Governor Maheswor B. Shrestha and PP Rtn. Dr. Prakash R. Regmi respectively with 'Khada', a Certificate, and a token cheque of NRs. 5,000 each.

Classification Talks enables Rotarians to recognizing the worthiness to society of all occupations. RCP Members Rtn. Gautam Shakya; Rtn. Lochan Gyawali and Rtn. Nirmal Pradhanang gave Classification Talks during weekly meeting in Nov 2014, Feb 2015 and April 2015 respectively.

RCP Members Honored for Vocational Services: In June 2015, Rtn. Dr. Mukti N. Shrestha was awarded by the World Small Animal Veterinary Association (WSAVA) the Global Merit Award on the strength of his pioneering achievements and self sacrifice, both for the development of the veterinary profession and service to humankind.

In September 2014, the Nepal Heart Foundation recognized PP Rtn. Narayan G. Halwai for his contribution to managing the construction of the Rotary funded Blood Bank at Lalitpur.

Community Service

Members of the Rotary Club of Patan, their spouses and Rotaractors participated in the **Walk for Disability Awareness Walk** on 3 December 2014, which marks the International Day of People with Disability. The programme was organised by Nepal Orthopedic Hospital, an institution established through the effort of Rotarians and the Rotary Club of Patan. The RCP contributed NRs. 10,000 for the walk event.

In a special programme during the second regular meeting of the Rotary Club of Patan, President, Khruschev Shrestha gave one **Fruit Tree Sapling** to each member present to let the "Light of Rotary" shine in the kitchen garden of each Rotarian.

A Rotary Day was celebrated on 29 September 2014 with the motto: "Control your emotions but increase your donations". The function organized on World Heart Day 2014 advised a gathering of over 350 Rotarians and non-Rotarians to create a heart-healthy environment – the theme of this year's World Heart Day fits perfectly with the philosophy of Rotary. The 1.2 million Rotarians around the world join hands daily for common good, encourage fellowship and service above self. These are all 'Heart' choices NOT 'Hard' choices. All present were encouraged to "Light up Your Heart" - Join the global movement for

better heart-healthy choices and become a Rotarian and donate your time, skills and money towards social causes.

Service Projects

(Focus Area: Basic Education and Literacy)

The Prajapati Education Endowment Fund (PEEF): is the flagship, club-owned service project of the RCP that has provides scholarship to students since 1991. This year about 600 economically deprived students in 28 schools of Lalitpur benefited from the program distributing some NRs. 900,000. with a specific Trust Fund that has reached 11 million Rupees.

Kamal Mani Dixit Educational Excellence Awards

'KMDEEA': this year was presented to 1st Award Ms. Soni Maharjan from Balkumari School, Sunakothi; 2nd Award Ms. Kajal Shrestha from Adarsha Kanya Niketan H School, Mangal Bazar; and 3rd Award Mr. Pujan Bhandari from Tri Padma Vidyashram H.S. School, Pulchowk. Annually, the best-scoring student at the final examination of grade IX from 3 different schools supported by PEEF are selected by a Committee. The three students are rated as 1st, 2nd and 3rd for best achievements. First student receives NRs. 10,000, 2nd NRs. 5,000 and 3rd NRs. 3,000.

International Sponsored Projects

(Focus Area: Disease Prevention and Treatment)

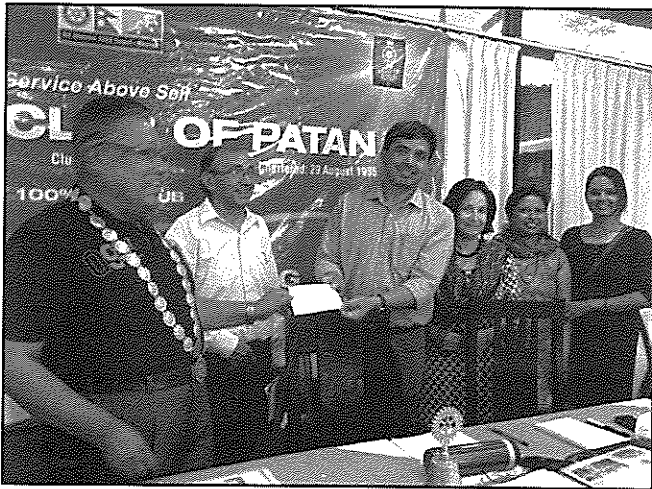
GG 1418219 for the Primary Prevention of Rheumatic Heart Disease in the amount of US\$ 31,000. This grant was made possible through contributions from D-3292 \$4000; D-3690 \$10000; RC Patan \$1900; RC Delhi Chanakyapuri \$100; WF Match \$15000. The key objectives of the project are: to treat bacterial throat infection with oral antibiotics to children of school going age (5 - 16 years) through health posts and sub-health posts and school based clinics; to conduct epidemiological studies on streptococcal infection, rheumatic fever and RHD; and to develop a national strategy for primary prevention of Acute Rheumatic Fever in Nepal. The Project implementation started in September 2014 with the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding by the Lalitpur District Public Health Office of the Government of Nepal, the Nepal Heart Foundation and the Rotary Club of Patan.



(Focus Area: Economic and Community Development)

The RCP successfully completed a District Community Grant #01 with RC Lakewood, USA to provide technical skills training to mental health professionals at the NGO KOSHISH, Nepal and vocational skills training to clients of KOSHISH for a US\$ 13,456 project.

GG 1527136 for the Vocational Education of 110 'Kamlari' girls in Western Nepal in the amount of US\$ 54,099. This project officially started on 25 May 2015 and was made possible through generous support of the Rotary Clubs of Mississauga-Dixie; Mississauga; Mississauga Streetsville; -City Centre; -Lakeshore; -West; -Credit Valley A.M.; -Meadowvale; -Airport; District 7080 and the Rotary Foundation.



(Focus Area: Water and Sanitation)

MG 79081 for a Water & Sanitation Project at Mirge Village in Dolakha was completed. The project was completed in collaboration with the RC Wallaton Park, District 1220 and RC Chandigarh Midtown, District 3080 and the Rotary Foundation in the amount of US\$ 13,150. The grant provided a clean water supply system and biogas toilets to the remote Tamang village of Mirge in Dolakha.

Earthquake Emergency Relief Efforts

Immediately after the 7.8 magnitude earthquake that hit Nepal on Saturday, 25 April 2015 the club leadership met for an emergency meeting to plan its relief efforts and fundraising strategy. To date, the RCP has distributed immediate relief supplies worth NPR 327,935 (US\$ 3,312), as well as 110 tarpaulins and 98 blankets received

through District 3292 Nepal and Bhutan. The supplies have included essential food items, tarpaulins, mattresses, beds, blankets, kitchen utensils, sewing machines, clothes and toys. These donations have reached an estimated 550 families and 90 children.



The focus of RCP's support has been in the district of Lalitpur, including remote areas such as Jolkhu in Dukuchhap, and Bulakichaur and Satkanya in Bhattedanda, where the RCP were the first relief teams to arrive. In Jolkhu, RCP members assisted the local community to establish a Disaster Relief Coordination Committee and inform the local authorities about the situation in the village.

The RCP has also supported Panga village and surrounding areas in Kirtipur, Kathmandu district, as well as villages in the more distant districts of Chitwan, Sindupalchock and Rasuwa. We have also coordinated with Rotarians supporting current and previous RCP project sites in the Chepel village in Solokhumbu district and Bhumithan village in Dolakha district.

The RCP started a fundraising campaign among its members, friends and well-wishers. As of 31 July 2015, the RCP has received donations of over NPR 4,000,000 (approximately US\$ 40,000). Our target is to raise up to US\$ 50,000 in direct donations and raise additional funding through Rotary Global Grant Projects.

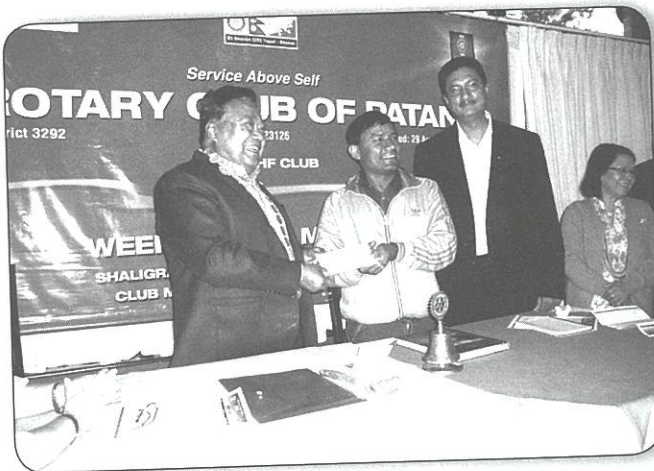

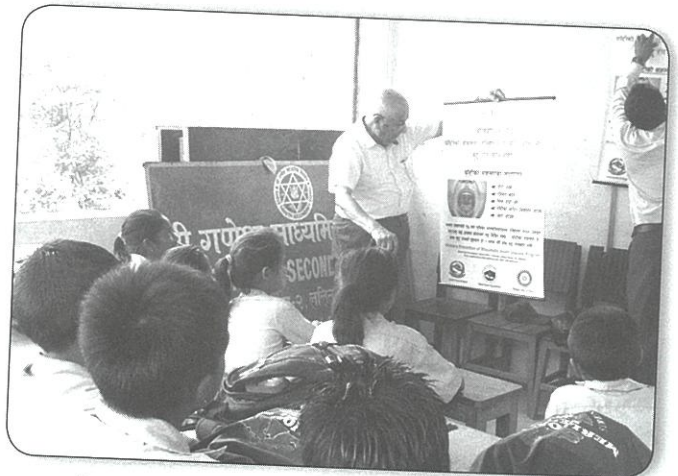

विष्णुप्रसाद धिताल र म 'क्लास फ्रेन्ड' । दरबार स्कूल र त्रिचन्द्र कलेजमा गरी सात वर्ष हामीले एकै साथ एउटै कक्षामा सँगसँगै बसेर पढ्यौं । त्यसपछि हाम्रो बाटो छुट्टियो । तर दश वर्षपछि भने हामी फेरि छिमेकी भएर सँगै जसो भयौं । उनै विष्णुप्रसाद धितालले हो मलाई रोटरीबारे बताएको । उनी सरकारी जागिरमा पसेर सिंहदरबार छिरेका थिए । म श्रीदरबारमा रानी जगदम्बाको सेवामा थिएँ । नियमित जस्तै हाम्रो भेटघाट हुन्थ्यो । उनले मलाई एक दिन भने 'कमलबाबु, हामी रोटरी ज्वाइन गरौं ।' मलाई रोटरी भन्ने कुन चराको नाम हो पत्तो थिएन, उनले भने रोटरीको मर्म बुझिसकेका रहेछन् । उनले मलाई रोटरी बारे सबै कुरा बताए । हामीले रोटरीमा पस्ने निधो गर्नुभयो । तर त्यसैबीच कसैले सेक्सन अफिसर बनेका विष्णुलाई सतर्क गराईदिएछ- 'धितालजी, तपाईं हामी जस्ता कतै टेक्ने र समाउने हाँगो नभएका जागीरदारहरूले रोटरीमा गरिखान सक्दैनौं । त्यहाँ कैलेकैले सरकारको आलोचना पनि हुन्छ, आफूले पनि चित्त नबुझेका कुरो बोलिन्छ । छयाफ्छयाप्ती हुन्छन् त्यहाँ 'सुल्सुलेहरू' । कुन चाहिले केरो 'माथि' पुन्याइदिन्छ अनि फसाद पर्छ । त्यसैले मैले त एक फेरा 'ज्वाइन' गरेर पनि छाडें रोटरी' । यति सुनेपछि होला विष्णुले रोटरी प्रवेश गर्ने विचार त्यागे । अनि मैले पनि रोटरीलाई बिर्सिदिँ ।

धेरै पछि सन् १९७० तिर फेरि कसले हो मलाई रोटरीमा ध्यान आकर्षण गरायो । जनरल अर्जुनशमशेरले हो कि जस्तो लाग्छ, किनभने मेरो 'बोस' रानी जगदम्बाका भतिजा भएकाले उहाँ 'मुमाको दर्शन' गर्न बराबर श्रीदरबार आउनुहुन्थ्यो । उहाँले नै भनिदिएकाले मलाई रोटरी प्रवेश गर्न गान्हो भएन । नत्र त म 'रोटरियन' हुनै नपाउने । किनभने मैले कलकत्ताको आफ्नो प्रेसको काम छाडी आएर रानी जगदम्बाको 'सर्भिस' मा पस्दा नै म वचनबद्ध भएको थिएँ । उहाँको 'पर्मिसन' नलिई मैले अन्त कतै कुनै पार्टी या संस्थामा संलग्न हुन मिल्दैनथ्यो । नेपालको एक मात्र क्लब थियो काठमाण्डू रोटरी क्लब । त्यस क्लबका पास्ट प्रेसिडेन्ट हुनुहुन्थ्यो जनरल अर्जुन, ऐलेका 'डिजीई' रो. जया शाहका पिता । म रोटरीमा 'इन्डक्ट' हुँदा मेरो 'इन्ट्रोडक्सन' जनरल अर्जुनले नै दिनुभएको हो । मलाई 'रोटरी पिन्' पनि उहाँले नै लगाई दिनुभएको थियो । शुरूमा मलाई

'लिटरेचर' भन्ने 'क्लासिफिकेसन' दिइएको थियो । सम्झन्छु त्यसको अर्को वर्ष, १९७२ मा कलकत्ताबाट 'डिजी भिजिट' मा आएका गभर्नर पी.एन. मुखर्जीले मेरो क्लासिफिकेसन फेरेर 'बेल लेत्र' बनाइदिएका हुन् । उनले भनेका थिए: "कमल, तिम्रो क्लासिफिकेसन राम्रो सुनिएन, त्यसको फ्रेन्च पर्यावाची शब्द हो 'बेल लेत्र' । हाम्रो डिस्ट्रिक्टमा ऐलेसम्म कसैको क्लासिफिकेसन पनि फ्रेन्च भाषामा दिएको छैन, म तिम्रीलाई दिन्छु, फ्रेन्च क्लासिफिकेसन 'बेल लेत्र' भन्ने ।" अनि, ऐले 'सिनियर याक्टिभ' भैसक्दा पनि मेरो त्यही छ क्लासिफिकेसन रोटरीमा ।

म १९७१-७२ काठमाण्डू रोटरी क्लबमा मेम्बर हुँदा त्यहाँ प्रेसिडेन्ट थिए ग्रीक नागरिक, स्कर्डियालिस अनि सेक्रेटरी थिए डा. रबर्ट फ्लेमिड (सिनियर) । उनी सके सेक्रेटरी दोस्रो पटक काम गर्दै थिए र सकेसम्म चाँडै त्यो पदबाट मुक्त हुन चाहन्थे । त्यसै हुँदा म रोटरियन भएको महिना दिनभित्रै मलाई क्लब सेक्रेटरीको कार्यभार थमाइहालियो । त्यस बेला मात्र होइन, तेह्र चौध वर्ष रहँदा मैले ४ पटक क्लब सेक्रेटरीको जिम्मेवारी बोक्नुपरेको थियो । त्यो म सारै दक्ष र राम्रो सचिव भएर होइन, सेक्रेटरीको अभिभारा बोक्न क्लबमा कोही तयार नभएर हुनुपर्छ । अर्को के पनि हुन सक्छ भने क्लबमा पटक पटक प्रेसिडेन्ट हुन आग्रह गर्दा पनि मैले मानिन । अनि मेरो मेख मार्न 'लौ त, प्रेसिडेन्ट नहुने हो भने एक बाजी फेरी सेक्रेटरी नै बन्' भनेर मलाई वाध्य पारिएको हो । त्यो जे भए पनि काठमाण्डू रोटरी क्लबमा चारपटक म सेक्रेटरी भएको पक्कै हुँ र त्यो 'रेकर्ड' ऐलेसम्म कायमै छ रे! र यो ४६ वर्षको मेरो रोटरी जीवनमा म कतै पनि प्रेसिडेन्ट बनेको छैन । हो, दुईतिरका क्लबमा गरी ४० भन्दा बढी वर्ष मैले क्लबको बुलेटिनको भने जिम्मा लिएर बसेको हुँ । काठमाण्डू क्लबको 'चौरीको घन्टी' को र पाटनको 'ललितधारा' को एडिटर थिएँ म । 'चौरीको घन्टी' को नाम पैले 'याक बेल' थियो । क्लबको अनुमति लिएर मैले त्यस नाममा अलिकति फेरफार गरेको थिएँ 'याक बेल' का साथै मैले त्यहाँ 'चौरीको घन्टी' भन्ने पनि जोडेको थिएँ । अनि प्रत्येक अंकमा एक या दुई वाक्य नेपालीका पनि घुसाउँथे म त्यो बुलेटिनमा । यता पाटनमा त 'ललितधारा' चलाउन थाल्दा नै मैले 'हाम्रो बुलेटिन नेपालीमा निक्लन्छ' भनेर घोषणा गरिदिएको

थिएँ । १५-१६ वर्ष 'ललितधारा' नेपालीमै निस्कन्थ्यो, म एडिटर भैरहँदासम्म ।

मैले आफूखुसी 'रोटरी क्लब अफ काठमाण्डू' छाडेर आएको होइन । मलाई त्यस क्लबले नै खटाएर पठायो यहाँ । पैल त पाटनमा यौटा क्लब खोलनुपर्यो भनेर मलाई 'जीएसआर' बनाइयो । अनि क्लब खोल्न आरआईले स्वीकृति दिनासाथ भनियो- 'अब तिमी त्यहाँ नै जाऊ र त्यस क्लबलाई राम्ररी चलाएर देखाऊ' रे। क्लबको आदेश त मैले मान्ने पर्यो र म यता सरै तर मैले पाटनको क्लबको पनि प्रेसिडेन्ट हुन चाहिँ मानिन । पुराना रोटेरियन सुरेन्द्रराज शर्मालाई खोजेर ल्याइयो यहाँ र उहाँलाई मनाएर संस्थापक प्रेसिडेन्ट बनाइयो । सुरेन्द्रराजजीले हाम्रो क्लबलाई शुरूमै राम्रो लीकमा बसाएर लैजानुभयो । श्री ५ को सरकारको सचिव भैसकेको मान्छे, उहाँको कार्यशैली एकदम चुस्तदुरुस्त थियो । सबैलाई मिलाएर लैजान खप्पीस हुनुहुन्थ्यो उहाँ । हाम्रो पत्रिका 'ललितधारा' को पहिलो सम्पादक पनि सुरेन्द्रराजजी नै हुनुभएको हो । तर त्यस बेला 'ललितारा' नियमित हुन सकेन अनि उहाँले नै मलाई सम्पादक हुन आग्रह गर्नुभयो र म बनेको हुँ ।

माथि मैले भनेको- मलाई रोटरीको बारेमा सर्वप्रथम बताउने मेरो साथी, विष्णुप्रसाद धिताल ३० वर्ष जति यूएनको

सेवामा रोममा बिताएर नेपाल फर्केपछि, रोटरीमा पस्न चाहे अनि मैले उनलाई "हाम्रै क्लबमा आऊ" भनेर निम्त्याएँ । उनी मेम्बर भैहाले । 'तुरुन्त फलप्राप्ति' भनेभैँ त्यसको अर्को वर्ष नै उनी हाम्रो क्लबको प्रेसिडेन्ट समेत बनिहाले । विष्णुप्रसाद प्रेसिडेन्ट भएपछि उनले मलाई 'ललितधारा' मा मैले हप्तैहप्ता लेख्ने गरेको 'एउटा ठट्टा'हरू समेटेर एउटा किताबै प्रकाशित गर्न उक्साए । अनि २०५४ सालमा मेरो "१९९-यौटा ठट्टा" प्रकाशित भयो । त्यसलाई पाटन रोटरी क्लबले प्रकाशित गर्नु र त्यसमा प्रकाशकीय पनि क्लबको प्रेसिडेन्ट भएका नाताले विष्णुले नै लेखेका छन् । त्यस प्रकाशकीयमा उनले मेरो निकै प्रशंसा पनि गरेका थिए ।

शुरूका चौध वर्ष म काठमाण्डू रोटरी क्लबमा मेम्बर थिएँ । त्यसपछि, सन् १९८५ देखि ३० वर्ष म यही 'रोटरी क्लब अफ पाटन'मा कायम छु । अब त मलाई क्लबका प्रत्येक मीटिङमा उपस्थित हुन कर पनि छैन । तर म आइरहेछु, धाइरहेछु । सोमबारका दिन बेलुकी क्लबमा नपुगी मनै मान्दैन । क्लबमा सबभन्दा जेठो पनि म नै छु कि क्या । सबैले मलाई "गुरूजी" भन्न थालेका छन् । यसै पनि 'बाहुनको बच्चो' भएकाले मेरो हक पनि छ क्यारे 'गुरूजी' भनिने ।

२०७२ साल बैशाख १२, १३ र २९ गतेका दिन नेपालमा आएको महाभूकम्प पश्चात् डर र त्रासले भारी भएको मनलाई हलुङ्गो बनाउँदै यसपटक रोटरी क्लव पाटनबाट पूर्व डिस्ट्रिक्ट गभर्नर तीर्थमान शाक्य, नानीशोभा शाक्य, म र बिजय लक्ष्मी श्रेष्ठ तथा अध्यक्ष मनोनित विजय मल्लपति र सेक्रेटरी ग्रावियल मल्लपति सहित तीन परिवार २०७२ साल जेष्ठ २० गते तदनुसार जुन ०३, २०१५ का दिन काठमाण्डौबाट/दोहा हुँदै साउ पाउलो (Sao Paulo) तर्फ उड्यौं। कतार एयरवेजले दोहामा ओरालि दियो। नौ घण्टाको ट्रान्जिटमा भएको होटल सुविधा लिँदा होटल आउँजाउँ गर्दै भोलिपल्ट दोहाबाट साढे चौध घण्टाको हवाई उडान गर्दै जुन ०४, २०१५ को साँभ ब्राजिलको साउ पाउलो विमानस्थलमा पुग्यौं। एयरपोर्टबाट सिधै होटलमा गई थकाई मान्यौं।

भोलिपल्ट बिहान रोटरीयनहरूको लागि संचालन गरिएको दसवटा सटल बसका (Shuttle Bus) रूटहरूबाट कन्भेन्सन हल, अन्हेम्बी (Convention Hall, Anhembi) सम्म जाने आठ नम्बर रूटको बसबाट सजिलैसंग हल पुग्यौं। रजिष्ट्रेशन गर्ने ठाउँ व्यवस्थित भएकोले रजिष्ट्रेशन गर्न र किट ब्याग लिन कुनै कठिनाई भएन। रजिष्ट्रेशनको लागि खुट्याएको समय बचेको हुँदा आधा दिन साउ पाउलो मजाले घुम्न पाइयो।

जुन ०६ देखि ०९ सम्म चल्ने उक्त कन्भेन्सन हल विश्वभरका पन्ध्र हजार जति रोटरीयनहरूले भरिभराउ थियो। त्यस कन्भेन्सनमा नेपालको उपस्थित संख्या यति नै थियो भनेर यकिन गर्न सकिएन। तैपनि नेपालबाट जाने २७ जनाले उद्घाटन समारोहमा सदस्य देशहरूको झण्डा परेडमा एकै ठाउँबाट ताली बजाएको थियो। परिचय-पत्रलाई स्क्यान गरेर मात्र कन्भेन्सन हल भित्र पस्न पाउने नियम कडाईसाथ पालन गरेको थियो तर आठ/दश ओटा ढोका खुल्ला भएकोले हल भित्र आफ्नो र साथीको स्थान सुरक्षित गर्न हामीलाई गाह्रो भएन।

यसपालिको रोटरी कन्भेन्सनमा तिता र मिठा दुवै किसिमका अनुभूति भए। ईन्टरनेशनल रोटरी कन्भेन्सनमा सायद यो पहिलो चोटी होला नेपालको चर्चा रोटरी ईन्टरनेशनल प्रेसिडेन्टले

आफ्नो भाषणमा गर्नुभएको। नेपालमा गएको महाभूकम्पलाई महत्त्व दिन केही भिडियो क्लिपहरू समेत देखाइएको साथै त्यहाँ उपस्थित केही नेपाली रोटरीयनहरूको मन्तव्य खिचेको भिडियो क्लिपसमेत प्रसारित गरिएको। त्यसरी भिडियोहरू देखाइनु आर. आई. प्रेसिडेन्ट ग्यारी सि. के. ह्वाङ्गको (RI President Gary C.K. Huang) नेपाल प्रतिको विशेष सद्भावना थियो। त्यस भिडियोले विश्वसामु नेपाल चिनाएको थियो। नेपालको अवस्था थाहा नहुने त्यहाँ उपस्थित रोटरीयनहरूलाई पनि हाम्रो अवस्था थाहा भयो। कार्यक्रम सकिएपछि रोटरीयनहरूसंगको भेटघाटमा धेरैजसोले कुराकानीको अन्तमा "विचराहरू" र "कठैबरा" भन्दा हामीलाई दुःख लाग्थ्यो। अरूको दयापात्र हुनुपर्दा भने हामीलाई केही तित्तता महसूस हुन्थ्यो। तर दोस्रो सत्रको अन्तमा ल्याटिन अमेरिकन संगितको (Latin American) मनोरञ्जनात्मक कार्यक्रमले त्यो दुःख बिर्साइ दिएको थियो।

कन्भेन्सनको रोचक र मिठो पक्ष भनेको विशेष व्यक्तिहरूको वक्तव्य थियो। स-साना नानीहरूले पनि आफ्नो वक्तृत्व कलाले वयष्कहरूलाई समेत मन्त्रमुग्ध पार्न सक्ने क्षमता देखाएको यस कन्भेन्सनमा देखियो। दोस्रो दिन "You are never too young to change the world" भन्ने विषयमा अर्जेन्टिनाकी १० वर्षकी बालिका लुसिया गोमेज गार्सिया (Lucia Gomez Garcia) ले बोलेर सबैलाई चकित पारिदिइन्। कोष्टारिकाकी (Costa Rica) पूर्व राष्ट्रपति र नोवल प्राइजबाट सम्मानित र अरू विशिष्ट व्यक्तिहरूको वक्तव्य सुन्न पायौं। मुख्य हलको कार्यक्रम बाहेक अरू स-साना हलहरूमा अरू सत्रहरू (Breakout sessions) पनि एकै समयमा हुने गरेकोले कुन कार्यक्रममा बस्ने भनेर हामी जस्तै अन्यौलमा पर्नेहरू पनि धेरै भेटिए। तर हामीले चाहि २०१४/१५ का आर.आई. प्रेसिडेन्ट ग्यारी सि.के. ह्वाङ्गको साथै २०१५/१६ का आर.आई. प्रेसिडेन्ट के. आर. रविन्द्रन (RI President K. R. Ravindran) को मन्तव्य सुन्न पूरा समय हल भित्रै बितायौं। दुवै आर.आई. अध्यक्षहरूले आफ्नो परिवारका सदस्यहरूलाई स्टेजमा बोलाई परिचय गराउने परम्परालाई कायमै राखे। कार्यक्रमको अन्तिम दिनमा २०१५/१६ को इन्टरनेशनल रोटरी कन्भेन्सनको आतिथ्य गर्ने देश साउथ कोरियाले मे २९ देखि जुन ०१, २०१६ मा सिउल, साउथ कोरियामा (Seoul, South Korea) हुने



जानकारी दिए । साथै सबै रोटरीयनहरूलाई त्यसमा भाग लिन आग्रह गरे ।

त्यसो त ल्याटिन अमेरिकनहरूले आफ्नो प्रख्यात तथा परम्परागत सांस्कृतिक झलक कारनीभल परेड प्रदर्शन (Carnival Parade) को कार्यक्रम त राख्ने नै भयो । तर रंगशालाको क्षमता भन्दा बढी र महँगो टिकट (ब्राजिल लिरा १००) लिएर गरेको रातिको कार्यक्रममा बस्ने ठाउँ नभएर यताउता दगुर्नु पर्‍यो । त्यो दुःख पाएको बिर्सन नपाउँदै भोलिपल्ट त्यही परेड कार्यक्रम सडकमा पनि भएको देख्दा हामीलाई सितैमा त्यत्रो पैसा खर्च गरेछौं जस्तो लाग्यो ।

जुन १०, २०१५ को दिन नेपाल रोटरीले एक महत्वपूर्ण अवसर पायो । त्यस दिन नेपालमा गएको भूकम्प पीडित सहायताको लागि आर. आई. बोर्ड डाइरेक्टरस्/टि.आर.एफ.ट्रस्टिज (RI Board Directors/TRF Trustees) को संयुक्त बैठक बसेको थियो । त्यस बैठकमा नेपालको तर्फबाट पिडिजि तिर्थमान शाक्य, डिजिई केशव कुँवर, डिजिएन जया शाहको महत्वपूर्ण सहभागिता भएको थियो ।

Rotary Club of Patan (RCP) PRAJAPATI EDUCATION ENDOWMENT FUND (PEEF) MANAGEMENT & FINANCIAL REPORT AS OF 30 JUNE 2015

Since its establishment in 1991, the RCP's flagship PEEF has successfully expanded into a relatively large trust fund with permanent contributions crossing the 11 million Nepalese Rupees (NRs.) mark. In the Rotary Year 2014-2015, some 600 public school students of lower-income families in 28 schools of Lalitpur District received scholarships to support their education from grade 6 to 10.

Following the RCP Constitution and By-Laws, a 'Management and Operational Policies' (PEEF MOPs) was established by the RCP Board and approved by the RCP House in December 2013. The PEEF MOPs separates the PEEF Trust Fund from the PEEF Operational Fund and outlines the policies and procedures of its management, criteria for support, investments and financial management mechanisms, and administrative responsibilities.

One of the keys to the continued success of this flagship programme of the RCP is that all members of the RCP take ownership of it. In addition to a dedicated committee managing this programme, the entire RCP family volunteers its valuable time and resources during the annual students' selection and funds distribution in the assisted schools throughout Lalitpur District.

This 'Management and Financial Report' captures key actions taken during the reporting year ending 30 June 2015, and provides a summary, together with an attachment, showing all PEEF contributors and contributions.

In the Rotary Year 2014-2015, contributions of NRs. 753,758 to the PEEF Trust Fund, NRs. 590,846 as one-time contributions to the Operational Fund, and NRs. 103,498 for Annual scholarships were received. The PEEF Trust Fund reached an amount of NRs. 11,276,434 at the end of June 2015.

The PEEF Trust Fund initially set a contribution amount of NRs. 10,000 for perpetual support of one student called a 'permanent contribution' based on estimates from bank interests at the time. Over the years, the permanent contribution amount has been progressively raised. The current rate since 1 June 2014 is NRs. 30,000 or US \$350 (taking into account bank charges) per student.

Last year, the PEEF was affected by two major issues: first, the very rapid diminishing of bank interest rates and second, the challenge of maintaining our commitments to donors of perpetual support. Today, interest income from a deposit of NRs. 10,000 is only around NRs. 650, whereas the scholarship amount is NRs. 1,500, and for students obtaining marks of 75% or higher, it is NRs. 2,000.

The RCP is committed to continuing the perpetual

support of students from all sponsors, including those who had earlier contributed less than NRs. 30,000 per student. In this context, the RCP initiated several fundraising activities. One such campaign was to approach our sponsors for a one-time voluntary contribution to reduce the shortfall. We requested our sponsors to consider contributing the difference between NRs. 30,000 and the actual amount originally contributed for the perpetual support of a student.

Through personal contacts of several members, we have received substantial additional contributions both for the Trust Fund and for the one-time Operational Fund. We are pleased to note here the highest single contributor was Dr. Prabhu Prabhakar from the USA through contacts of Rtn. Siba B. Rajbhandary and his daughter Rosy Rajbhandary in the USA.

Among other measures, we have obtained special consideration from our contact banks for higher than regular interest rates with longer fixed-term deposits. To manage the expenditures, we have not increased the scholarship amounts given to each student and we have not replaced students who drop out of schools.

In 2014-2015, total income from interests in the Trust Fund and Annual Contributions was NRs. 690,817.57, whereas total expenditure was NRs. 942,030, which brought a shortfall of NRs. 251,212.43. Funds raised for the one-time Operational Fund were used to cover this shortfall. As of 30 June 2015, we have a balance of NRs. 482,065 in the Operational Fund. From the Trust Fund, we can only use the interest earned, therefore we need to continue fundraising to increase the Operational Fund to meet annual requirements.

A committee established by the RCP Board and endorsed by the RCP House is responsible for the day-to-day management of the PEEF. For the Rotary Year 2015-2016, this committee has been revised with the following membership:

पाटन रोटरी क्लब छात्रवृत्ति कार्यक्रम एक विवेचना

सन् १९९१ मा ७ जना विद्यार्थीहरूलाई छात्रवृत्ति दिएर यो कार्यक्रम शुरु भएको थियो । अक्षयकोषमा यस क्लबका सदस्य, परिवार र अन्य हितैषीहरूबाट प्राप्त भएको सहयोग रकम क्रमशः जम्मा हुँदै गयो र त्यस अनुरूप छात्रवृत्ति दिइने विद्यालय र विद्यार्थी संख्यामा पनि वृद्धि हुँदै गयो । सेप्टेम्बर ६, १९९९ मा यस अक्षयकोषलाई प्रजापति शिक्षा कोष नामाकरण गरियो । यस वर्ष २०१५ सम्ममा अक्षयकोषमा एक करोड भन्दा बढि रकम जम्म भइसकेको छ, ललितपुर जिल्लाका २८ वटा सरकारी विद्यालयहरूमा वार्षिक लगभग ६०० जना विद्यार्थीहरूलाई छात्रवृत्तिको लागि भण्डै रु. ९ लाख वितरण गर्दैछौं । धेरै रोटेरियन साथीहरू यस कार्यक्रममा सहभागी हुन्छन् । यस कार्यक्रम कसरी शुरु भयो, यसको स्थायित्व कसरी स्थापित हुन सक्यो, यसको कमि कमजोरीहरू के-के देखिएका छन् भन्ने जानकारी हाम्रा जम्मै क्लब सदस्यहरूलाई दिनु यस विवेचनाको मुख्य उद्देश्य रहेको छ ।

शुरुका वर्ष १९८९-१९९० तिर क्लब मिटिङ्गमा सधैँजसो लामो अवधिसम्म चल्ने, आफ्नै पैसाले र आफैँले संचालन गर्न सक्ने कार्यक्रम बनाउनु पन्थो भन्ने विषयमा छलफल भइरहन्थ्यो । गरिब विद्यार्थीहरूलाई छात्रवृत्ति दिने कार्यक्रम एउटा विकल्प थियो । त्यसैताका पूर्व अध्यक्ष मत्स्येन्द्रलाल कायस्थज्यू आफ्नो कामको सिलसिलामा दूर्गम गाउँहरूमा भ्रमण गर्न जाँदा रोटेरियन डा. तुल्सि मजर्हन, रोटरी क्लब ब्रान्चवर्ग, अमेरिका पनि संगै जानु भएको थियो । बाटोमा खेलिरहेका साना केटाकेटीहरूलाई "तिमीहरू विद्यालयमा पढ्न जानु पर्दैन" भनि सोध्दा विद्यालयमा फिस तिर्न पैसा नभएकोले पढ्न जान नसकेको भनेछन् । उनीहरूले महिनामा एकसय रुपैयाँ पाएमा विद्यालयमा पढ्न सक्ने भनेका रहेछन् । तत्पश्चात् क्लबको नियमित बैठक (मिति जुलाई २०, १९९०) मा छात्रवृत्ति कोष खडा गर्न डा. तुल्सि महर्जनज्यूले Seed money को लागि रु. १०,००० दिनुभएको समेत गरी जम्मा रु. २३,००० उठेको रेकर्डमा छ । तर पूर्व अध्यक्ष मत्स्येन्द्रलाल कायस्थज्यूले रु. ५,००० आफूले दिनुभएको र डा. तुल्सि महर्जनज्यूले ५ हजार मात्र दिनुभएको भन्नु हुन्छ । मुख्य उपलब्धि त छात्रवृत्ति कोष खडा भयो । महिनाको रु. एक सय छात्रवृत्ति दिने निर्णय

भयो । कसरी गर्ने, कस्तोलाई दिने र कहिले दिने भन्ने बारे ठोस नियम बनाउने भन्ने छलफल भयो ।

समय बित्दै गयो तर नियम बनाउन कसैको चासो देखिएन । आउँदो इन्स्टेलेसन कार्यक्रममा छात्रवृत्ति दिनु पर्छ, समय धेरै छैन, आफूले चिने जानेका कोही केटाकेटी छन् भने सिफारिस गर्नुस् भन्ने कुरा भयो । मैले यसरी आफूले चिनेका केटाकेटीलाई छात्रवृत्ति दिने हो भने यस कार्यक्रमको स्थायित्व हुँदैन हामीले ठोस नियम बनाएर त्यस अनुसार पारदर्शि ढंगले विद्यार्थी छनौट गरेर मात्र छात्रवृत्ति दिनुपर्छ भनि सल्लाह दिएँ । अनि 'हँ भन्नेले ढोका खोल्नु पर्छ' भन्ने भैं मलाई नै नियम बनाउने जिम्मा दिइयो ।

सल्लाहको लागि अर्को बिहानै म मेरो ठूलो दाई नन्दगोविन्द राजकर्णिकार (उहाँ तिसौं वर्षदेखि मंगलबजार स्थित आदर्श कन्या निकेतन मा.वि.मा प्रधानाध्यापक हुनुहुन्थ्यो) को घरमा पुगे । दाइले दिनुभएको सल्लाह अनुसार छात्रवृत्ति कार्यक्रमको नियम यस अनुसार बनेको थियो:-

- १) सरकारी विद्यालयमा मात्र लागू गर्ने,
- २) ५ कक्षासम्म निःशुल्क हुँदा ६ कक्षाको विद्यार्थीलाई छात्रवृत्ति दिने,
- ३) कक्षामा छात्रवृत्ति पाएकै विद्यार्थीले १० कक्षासम्म नै हरेक वर्ष छात्रवृत्ति पाउने,
- ४) जाँचमा पहिलो, दोस्रो हुनेलाई छानेर छात्रवृत्ति दिने होइन तर आर्थिक अवस्था कमजोर भएका विद्यार्थीलाई छनौट गरी दिने,
- ५) प्रत्येक ६ महिनामा रु. ६०० छात्रवृत्ति दिने ।

यस अनुसार छात्रवृत्ति दिने काम शुरु भयो । तर केही वर्ष पछि नै विकृति शुरु भयो । प्रधानाध्यापकको सिफारिसमा छात्रवृत्ति दिने विराटनगर, चितवन आदि ठाउँमा चिने जानेका लाई दिने, प्राथमिक स्तरलाई पनि छात्रवृत्ति दिने, प्रधानाध्यापकले पैसा बुफेर लैजाने र विद्यार्थीलाई नदिने आदि ।

रोटेरियन बिहारीकृष्ण श्रेष्ठ कोअर्डिनेटर हुनुहुँदा हाम्रो छात्रवृत्ति कार्यक्रमको अवस्था बुझ्न हामीहरू धेरै विद्यालयहरूमा पुग्यौं । कुनै विद्यार्थीले त आफूले छात्रवृत्ति पाइरहेको छ भन्ने नै

थाहा रहेनछ, छात्रवृत्तिको रकम अन्यले नै बुझ्ने र विद्यार्थीलाई नदिने । बिवाह भएर विद्यालय छोडि सकेकी विद्यार्थीको नाममा अन्यले रकम बुझ्ने लैजाने । यस अनुभवबाट हामीले विद्यालयमा हामी आफै गएर विद्यार्थी छनौट गर्ने र छात्रवृत्ति रकम पनि हामी आफैले विद्यार्थीको हातमा दिने निर्णय गर्‍यौं । हामी जान नसक्ने विद्यालयमा चालु रहेका कार्यक्रमहरू पनि बन्द गर्‍यौं ।

हाम्रो कार्यक्रम विद्यालय स्तरमा मात्र थियो । गाविसका सम्पूर्ण जनसंख्यालाई शिक्षित गर्ने जस्तो उपलब्धिमूलक ठोस कार्यक्रम लिएर समुदाय स्तरमा जाने, विद्यार्थीबिच प्रतियोगिताको भावना जगाउने र विशाल समुदायको उपस्थितिमा छात्रवृत्ति वितरण गर्ने कार्यक्रम गर्न पाए राम्रो हुने सोच बन्थो । यस कार्यक्रम छम्ची गाविसमा Pilot कार्यक्रमको रूपमा लागू गरियो । स्थानिय विद्यालयका शिक्षकद्वारा वडाको प्रत्येक परिवारको आर्थिक अवस्थाको सर्वेक्षण गरियो जस अनुसार वर्षभरि खान, लाउन र जगेडा आम्दानी समेत भएको परिवारलाई 'क' वर्ग, केही महिनालाई खान नपुग्ने परिवारलाई 'ख' वर्ग र भण्डै वर्षभरि खान काम खोज्नु पर्ने परिवारलाई 'ग' वर्गमा छुट्याएका थियौं । यस पाइलट कार्यक्रममा 'ख' र 'ग' वर्गले मात्र भाग लिन पाउने गरेका थियौं । पहिलो वर्ष (२०००-०१) मा वडा १ र ७ मा र दोस्रो वर्ष (२००१-०२) मा १ देखि ८ वडामा लागू गरियो । पहिलो वर्षमा ६५ वटा र दोस्रो वर्षमा १४५ वटा छात्रवृत्ति मेरिटका आधारमा छानेर दिइएको थियो । छात्रवृत्ति पाउने विद्यार्थीहरूको विश्लेषणबाट प्राथमिक कक्षामा पढिरहेका र उच्च घरानाका विद्यार्थीहरू बढि छानिएका थिए जुन हाम्रो छात्रवृत्ति दिने नियमसंग बाँझिएको देखियो । साथै श्री विहारीज्यूले पनि क्लब छोड्नु भएकोले यस पाइलट प्रोजेक्टले निरन्तरता पाएन ।

२००२-०३ देखि यस कार्यक्रम निरन्तर 'छात्रवृत्ति स्विकृत नियम' अनुसार संचालनमा आइरहेको छ । प्रत्येक वर्ष प्रत्येक विद्यालयको कक्षा ४ का ४ जना नयाँ विद्यार्थीहरूलाई छनौट गरी आएको छ । अरू कक्षा ७ देखि १० सम्मका पहिले छात्रवृत्ति पाएका पुराना विद्यार्थीहरूले स्वतः छात्रवृत्ति पाउने गरी आएको छ । शुरुमा छात्रवृत्ति पाइरहेका कुनै विद्यार्थीले विद्यालय छोडेमा त्यसको सट्टामा कक्षा ६ मा थप विद्यार्थीलाई छनौट गरी छात्रवृत्ति दिने गरिन्थ्यो तर पछिल्ला वर्षहरूमा आर्थिक संकटले गर्दा यस्ता सट्टा विद्यार्थीको नियम बन्द गरियो । छात्रवृत्ति रकम वार्षिक रु. २००० (अघिल्लो जाँचमा ७५% र बढि लब्धाङ्क पाउने लाई) र अन्यलाई रु. १५०० दिने गरिन्छ । शुरुमा हरेक ६ महिनामा गरी दुईपल्ट छात्रवृत्ति दिइन्थ्यो तर पछि हरेक वर्षमा एकपल्ट मात्र दिने गरियो । कामको अत्यधिक बोझले गर्दा आर्थिक पक्षको नियमन र प्रगति विवरण गर्ने काममा कमि

देखियो । गत दुई वर्षदेखि नयाँ 'छात्रवृत्ति समिति' गठन भएको छ र कामको बाँडफाँड भए अनुसार कार्यक्रम र फाइनान्स म्यानेजमेन्टमा चनाखो देखिएका छन् ।

यस कार्यक्रम डिस्ट्रिक्टकै उत्कृष्ट गनिएको छ, विराटनगरमा भएको चौथो District Conference र काठमाडौंमा भएको South Asia Literacy Conference मा यस कार्यक्रमबारे presentation गरिएका थियो । यस कार्यक्रमबाट छात्रवृत्ति पाउने विद्यार्थी संख्या २४३३ जना (त्यसमध्ये १३८१ जना छात्रा) पुगेको छ र ९२४ जना कक्षा १० उत्तिर्ण भएका छन् । कति जनाले एस.एल.सि., आइ.ए., बि.ए. वा सो सरह उत्तिर्ण गरेका छन्, उनीहरू के गर्दै छन्, कति जना शिक्षक, नर्स, डाक्टर, व्यापारी भए आदिको तथ्याङ्क हामीले संकलन गर्न नपाएकोले थाहा छैन । हामीले यस कार्यक्रमको measurable output र specific achievement बारे जानकारी दिन सकिरहेको छैन । यस बारे के गर्ने भन्ने छलफल भइरहेको छ ।

बैकले मुद्दति खातामा व्याज घटाउँदै गएकोले छात्रवृत्ति दिन financial management जटिल भइरहेको छ । धेरै जनाले एक विद्यार्थीको लागि रु. १५,००० अक्षयकोषको लागि रकम दिएका छन्, यसबाट वार्षिक रु. ९०० जति व्याज आउँछ तर खर्च प्रत्येक विद्यार्थीलाई रु. १६०० चाहिन्छ । छात्रवृत्ति रकम सान्हा न्यूनः भयो, यसलाई बढाउनु पन्थो भन्ने गुनासा पनि छन् । तसर्थ, आयोजकलाई थप contribution को लागि अनुरोध गर्दछौं । आयोजकको नामबाट विद्यार्थीलाई छात्रवृत्ति दिन नपर्ने गरी कोषमा contribute गर्नु हुन पनि अनुरोध गर्दछौं । पहिलेको सोच १००० जना विद्यार्थीलाई छात्रवृत्ति दिने थियो, यस अनुरूप भण्डै ८०० लाई छात्रवृत्ति दिएका थियौं । तर व्याज कम पाउने भएकोले austerity measure (विद्यालय छोडेर जानेको सट्टा नयाँ विद्यार्थीलाई दिने बन्द गरिएको) अनुरूप विद्यार्थी संख्या घटाउँदैछौं ।

यस कार्यक्रमलाई थप टेवा दिन छात्रवृत्ति पाएका विद्यार्थीहरूमध्ये कक्षा ९ को जाँचमा सबभन्दा बढि नम्बर ल्याउने तिन जनालाई छानेर उनीहरूलाई अन्तर्वार्ता लिई पहिलो हुनेलाई कमलमणिज्यूबाट रु. १०,०००, दोस्रो हुनेलाई गणेशराजज्यूबाट रु. ५,००० र तेस्रो हुनेलाई तिर्थमानज्यूबाट रु. ३,००० इनाम दिइने गरेको छ ।

यस कार्यक्रमको आर्थिक पक्षबारे रोटेरियन विजय मल्लपतिज्यू, President Elect., Coordinator र Financial Manager, PEEF Committee बाट बेग्लै write up पेश हुनेछ ।

यस कार्यक्रमको निरन्तरता रहोस् भनि कामना गर्दछु ।



THE JOB OF SERGEANT-AT-ARMS AS I SEE AND PRACTICE IT

I have been holding the post of the Sergeant-at-Arms of the Rotary Club of Patan for a number of years now and have immensely enjoyed serving the club in that capacity. It reminds me of my first job as a protocol officer when I joined the Foreign Ministry way back in 1964. I continued to hold the protocol job on and off during my career including a stint as acting Chief of Protocol. This experience inculcated in me the habit of discipline, punctuality and meticulousness even in my every day life up to now.

It is said that the job of a protocol officer is a most thankless one. If everything goes smoothly nobody bothers to thank him. But heaven forbid and things go astray like light out during a dinner or reception, malfunctioning of a microphone, getting caught in a traffic jam, a flat tyre, untimely or unexpected rain during an outdoor program or endless other cases of possible mishaps, everyone starts pointing fingers at the protocol official.

However, protocol job can be very rewarding and satisfying too. It is a highly visible job being in the forefront at all major events - greeting and mingling with dignitaries both national and foreign. In the process, the officer becomes the centre of envy not only of outside officials but even among the ministry colleagues.

The role and duties of a Sergeant-at-Arms in Rotary is very similar to that of a protocol officer. When I took over the position of our club as Sergeant -at- Arms, I had thought of serving in that capacity for a couple of years. Now it has been almost six years and I am still in the post. Colleagues wouldn't let me get out of the job and I also kind of developed a liking for it. In my case, I also have the position of Fellowship Coordinator in the club and as both of these posts are in many cases inter-related, it has become easier for me to carry out my duties.

What exactly are the duties and responsibilities of Sergeant-at-Arms? The Club Secretary's Manual states them as follows:

- a) to help maintain an orderly, dignified and effective Rotary Club meeting, one that will make the right kind of impression on visitors and guests;
- b) to be constantly on the alert to prevent any occurrence that might detract from the dignity and prestige associated with Rotary clubs;
- c) to handle the physical preparations for, and the mechanical part of a meeting, and unobtrusively, to guide its general conduct;

The Sergeant-at-Arms plays an important role in the success of the weekly club meeting. Because of the duties he performs, it becomes easier for the President to concentrate on the conduct of the meeting. Prior to each meeting, he should consult with the Chairperson of the Programme Committee regarding any special equipment such as podium for the speaker, mike, lighting, projector, screens, etc. He should also consult with the Fellowship Coordinator on ideas for improving the camaraderie at the club meetings.

One cardinal rule that a Sergeant-at-Arms must follow is to arrive 20-25 minutes prior to a meeting to ensure :

- that the tables and chairs are properly arranged;
- that the gable, gong and banners are at hand;
- that the sound system is operating at the correct level;
- that the lighting, temperature and ventilation are correctly regulated and
- that everything is in place for showing audiovisuals.

Some of the other typical assignment that Sergeant-at-Arms handles are:

- 1) Be at the door to welcome guests if no else has been assigned to do so. Ensure that everybody is inside the room by meeting time.



- 2) make sure that everybody is properly seated - no empty seat between members, not seating with same person week in and week out
- 3) to ensure that meals are promptly served - this applies also in cases where meals are served prior to the meeting
- 4) to call attention to, in a humorous way, to late arrivals so that they improve their habits in the next meetings
- 5) to check if everyone is wearing the Rotary pin and if not to impose and raise fines as per club rules
- 6) to maintain order, in a diplomatic manner, and see that members pay attention to the President's gavel and no one annoys the speaker by talking
- 7) keep an eye on eat-and-run and other early departing Rotarians and calling their attention

to the habit, in a tactical way, to discourage the practice, which can be a discourtesy to the speakers and

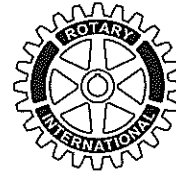
- 8) to properly thank and bid farewell to the guests and speakers.

There may be many other practices that Sergeant-at-Arms may have to resort to according to a given situation. He may have to improvise on his own to meet the need of any situation or of an unforeseen circumstance. The main thing is to maintain the dignity and prestige of the Rotary club at its meetings.

As our club's Sergeant-at-Arms, I may not have literally followed the above points. But to the best of my knowledge and ability, I have tried to help maintain decorum and dignity of our meetings and enhance the image of our club in the eyes of the visitors and guests.

High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

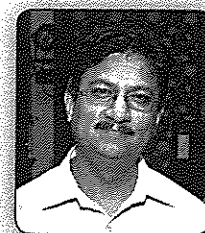
Third

WHAT TO DO WHEN HEART STOPS BEATING?

Ideally, everyone should know what to do if someone has a heart attack or cardiac arrest. Cardiac arrest is a condition when heart stops beating. About three in every four cardiac arrests happen away from hospital and there may be nobody else around to help.

If someone has a heart attack

1. Get help immediately.
2. Get the person to sit back in a comfortable position.
3. Call an ambulance and transfer the patient to the hospital.

If a person seems to be unconscious

- Approach with care. To find out if the person is conscious, gently shake him or her, and shout loudly, 'Are you all right?'
- If there is no response, shout for help.
- You will need to assess the casualty and take suitable action.

Remember A, B, C-Airway, Breathing, Circulation.

Airway

Open the person's airway by tilting the head back and lifting the head back and lifting the chin.

Breathing

Check

Look, listen and feel for signs of breathing for up to 10 seconds.

Action: Rescue breathing

If the person is unconscious and not breathing, call an ambulance.

Put the person face upwards on the floor.

Open the airway again and give two of your own breaths to the person. This is called 'rescue breathing'.

Close the person's nostrils with your fingers and thumb and blow into the mouth. Make sure that no air can leak out and the chest rises and falls.

Circulation

Check

Check for signs of circulation. This means checking for signs of normal breathing, coughing or movement. Take no more than 10 seconds doing this.

Action: Chest compression

If there are no signs of a circulation, or if you are at all unsure, start chest compression.

Find the notch at the bottom of the breastbone. Measure two fingers width above this. Place the heel of one hand there. Place your other hand on top. Press down firmly and soothingly 15 times. Do this at a rate of about 100 times a minute- that's faster than one second.

Repeat 2 rescue breaths and then 15 chest compressions. Keep doing the 2 rescue breaths followed by 15 chest compressions until:

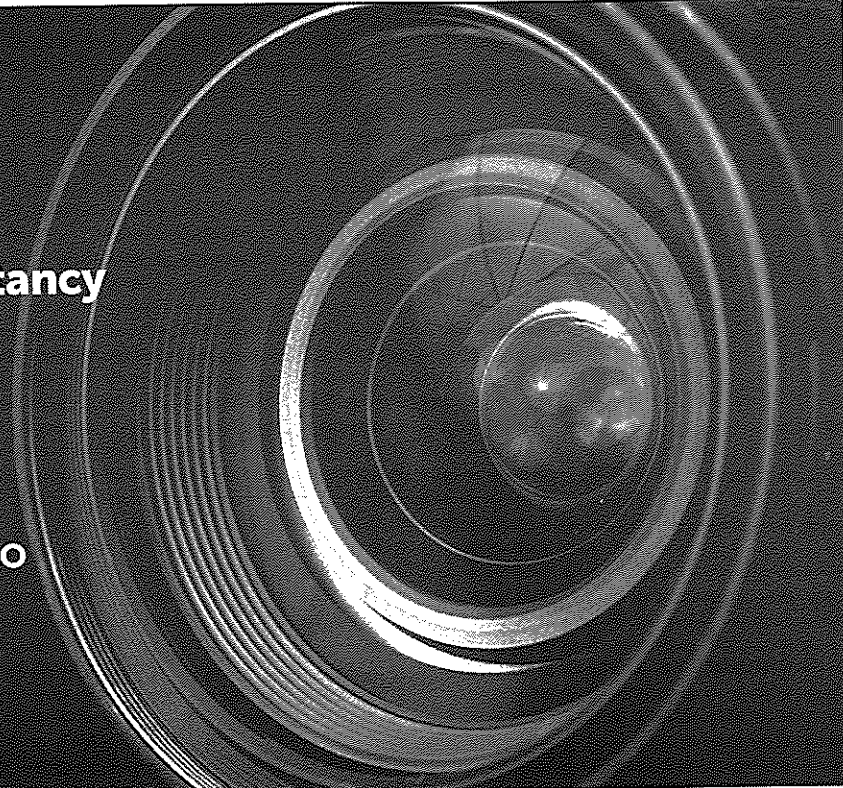
- The casualty shows signs of life, or
- Professional help arrives, or
- You become exhausted.

Many Rotarians have experienced at least once in his life very unusual situation among non-Rotarians. Most common comments are like "group of lazy nouveau riche", "nothing-to-do business people with lot of money to spend", and many more comments like this with a sense of alienation and skepticism.

Just after I became a member of Rotary Club, one of my friends, who knew nothing about the Rotary, made a comment that as if finally I have reached the state of affluence and luxury. Though he commented as a joke, it expressed his views about the Rotary. The reason was simple. He thought that only rich people, who do not know how to spend their time and money, become Rotarians to kill their time and waste their money.

So much is written about this misconception in rotary related press, that to improve our image in the public is one of the main goals of RI. It is obvious that it is very difficult to convince people in our noble and lofty goals and objectives to a person who is ignorant of us and skeptic to our work.

The simple message we have to give to such friends and to the public at large is that Rotarians do the same thing what the good people do in the society but we do differently. We do the same thing with zero overhead cost and in many an occasions we spend our own money to do the social services. Of course Rotarians enjoy and do willingly the fellowships and enjoyable gatherings among themselves and with friends only on their own cost. Many of our non-Rotarian friends may not know that Rotary International stands top among the non-corrupt organizations in the list of Transparency International.

So a true Rotarian should not be upset by such comments. Rather a true Rotarian has to be consistent and stand firm in his believes of Rotary values and peruse the 4 way tests in day-to-day life. That may invite many skeptics and adversaries, who, as Mahatma Gandhi said, will first ignore you, then mock and laugh at you, then again fight you, but finally you will win as a true Rotarian.

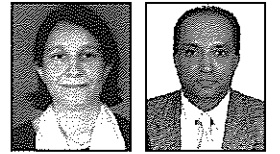

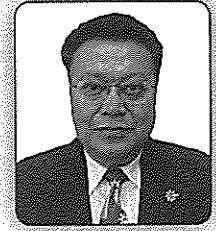

PROMOTING EARTHQUAKE SAFE BUILDINGS IN NEPAL

A powerful earthquake measuring 7.8 magnitude shook Nepal on 25 April 2015 Saturday at 11:56 AM NST. The earthquake (known as the Gorkha quake) and its many aftershocks (54 above 5 magnitude till 2 July 2015), including a major aftershock measuring 6.9 on 12 May 2015 Tuesday at 12.50 PM, caused massive destruction and resulted in immense loss of life (almost 9000 dead and 23000 injured), loss of lots of property and cultural heritage of the Nepalese people.

The earthquake, the most powerful to hit Nepal in 82 years, affected mostly 14 districts of Nepal including Kathmandu, Lalitpur, Bhaktapur, Sindhupalchowk, Dolakha, Gorkha, Rasuwa, Langtang and Dhading. Centuries-old temples and historic landmarks were destroyed in the Kathmandu Valley including Dharahara tower, Kaasthamandap temple, Basantapur Durbar, Changu Narayan temple and Nuwakot Durbar. Kathmandu and Patan Durbar Squares suffered severe damages as several pagoda-style temples collapsed. Some of these structures pancaked straight down while others merely shook and cracked.

Hundreds of thousands of private houses and community buildings (schools, hospitals) in Nepal got destroyed by the earthquake. According to a recent survey, 500,000 homes have been completely destroyed by the earthquake while 250,000 homes have been partially damaged. Besides residential properties, around 8000 schools and more than 300 hospitals also suffered major damages.

The risk of a big or major earthquake was well known beforehand. Seismologists and Earthquake Engineers had been predicting that an earthquake of 8 or more magnitude was long overdue because of the accumulated energy in the Himalayan plate. UNDP has ranked Nepal 11th in the world in terms of earthquake risk. A comparative study of 21 cities in the seismic belt had identified Kathmandu

as the most at-risk city in terms of casualty due to earthquakes.

Even though the risk of a major earthquake was a known fact, the country and its people were ill-prepared. Many reasons persist including poverty, rapid population growth, lack of awareness of earthquake risk, poor construction methods and prevalence of non-engineered buildings. Due to this many buildings performed poorly during the recent earthquake and either collapsed or were severely damaged.

There are several reasons why buildings in Nepal could not withstand during the Gorkha quake. One key reason being that most of the buildings that failed were non-engineered meaning that they were not designed or supervised by professional Architects / Engineers who have the knowledge and expertise related to earthquake-resistant design. In fact most of the buildings were constructed by the owners following the advice of local craftsmen and mason-leaders who are not technically trained to construct earthquake-resistant buildings. Hence, the main reasons for poor performance of buildings during the quake were negligence towards earthquake-safety design, construction and low level of earthquake awareness among the building owners/ builders. Old and neglected buildings and heritages also collapsed during the earthquake because of lack of timely repair and renovation.

However, the scale of damages and loss of lives was less than what had been predicted. A study had indicated that if an earthquake like that of 1934 were to repeat, as much as 60 percent of buildings in Kathmandu Valley would be damaged beyond repair and 75 percent of buildings in Bhaktapur would be heavily damaged. In addition to building damage, it was estimated that deaths and injury numbers would be significantly high (40,000 deaths,



95,000 injuries) and that 600,000 to 900,000 would be homeless. We have been fortunate that the earthquake occurred in the afternoon on a Saturday when schools and offices were closed, farmers were working in the fields. As such the loss of lives were much less than anticipated.

It is worthy to note that buildings which were designed properly by Architects and Engineers by implementing the necessary Municipality bye-laws and Building Codes for seismic design in the country have withstood the effects of the Gorkha Quake. Very few casualties have been reported in these buildings and even though many have suffered some or many cosmetic damages (i.e. cracks in walls, plastered surfaces, etc.), they have not resulted in Structural damages and total collapse.

As the country moves forward into the reconstruction and rebuilding phase, several challenges lie ahead as Nepal continues to remain vulnerable to deadly earthquakes due to its geology and urbanization patterns and building without technical knowledge. The Kathmandu Valley, in particular, falls in one of the most active tectonic zones of the Himalayan belt and has to be always prepared. However this earthquake has raised consciousness among the Nepalese people. Hopefully there will be a lot of improvements in building earthquake safe buildings.

In order to minimize the effects of destructive earthquakes in the future, promoting safer building construction has become a necessity in Nepal. Constructing earthquake-resistant buildings is possible if an owner or builder consults an Architectural/ Engineering Firm for design and construction supervision of the building. This is true for all types of buildings: residences, hospitals, schools/ institutional buildings, office buildings, commercial buildings, etc.

By consulting an Architectural/ Engineering Firm, an owner or builder can be assured that the building is designed and constructed for earthquake safety by qualified Architects and Engineers who are aware of safer building practices. In a building project, the Architect ensures that the design and construction fulfills the needs and aspirations of the owner while also taking into account earthquake-safety measures such as implementation of relevant building codes for seismic-resistant buildings. For this, the structure of the building is analyzed and designed by

the Structural or Civil Engineer according to the bearing capacity of the soil as per Soil tests done, as well as the size and complexity of the project while meeting the standards for earthquake-resistant buildings. Likewise, for the building to be functional and well designed, a team of professionals of the Firm or Associates are responsible for various aspects of the building project. The plumbing and sanitary system of the building is designed by Sanitary Engineer while the design of the electrical systems is done by an Electrical Engineer. Similarly, the Civil Engineers, Quantity Surveyors and Architects are involved in the preparation of documents, namely specifications, cost estimates, project schedules, bid documents, etc. which are necessary for quality control of construction. The drawings and documents prepared by the Architectural/ Engineering firm are means to ensure that proper techniques and processes are followed during the construction of the building. Following the design of the building the work of the contractor or builder has to be supervised for quality of materials and construction for increasing the safety of the building. Through this rigorous process of design and supervision of construction, the Architectural/ Engineering firm makes sure that the building is functional, aesthetic as well as durable and earthquake-safe.

All buildings mainly small residences and in remote areas cannot be designed by even Junior Architects or Engineers. As such Government, Municipals and Private parties should train masons and carpenters about constructing earthquake safe buildings following Building Codes; prepare and publish typical safe designs with details. Settlements in risky areas with poor soil conditions and landslide areas should not be allowed and resettled.

Natural disasters such as earthquakes cannot be predicted. However, we can minimize our vulnerability to earthquakes by ensuring all private and public buildings are earthquake-safe. We can also learn from other quake-prone countries such as New Zealand, Japan and Chile where proper implementation of building codes, new technologies and investments have limited the impact of earthquakes.



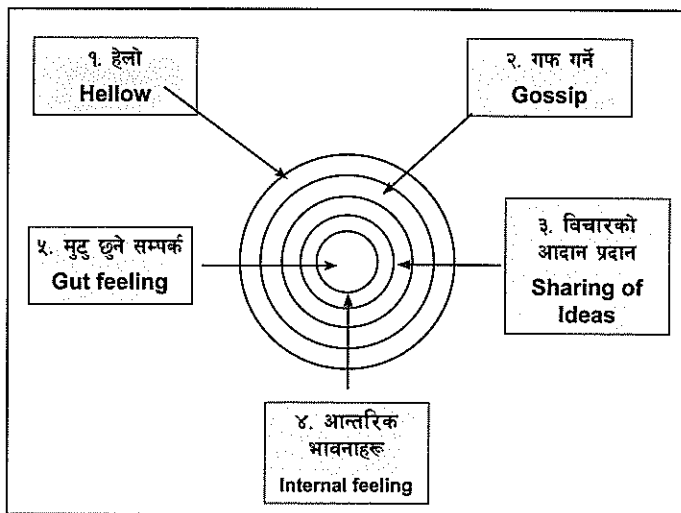

2. Inner Wheel of Patan also organized a small fund raiser where one of our members, Mrs. Shanta Shrestha donated Rs. 10,000. We thank

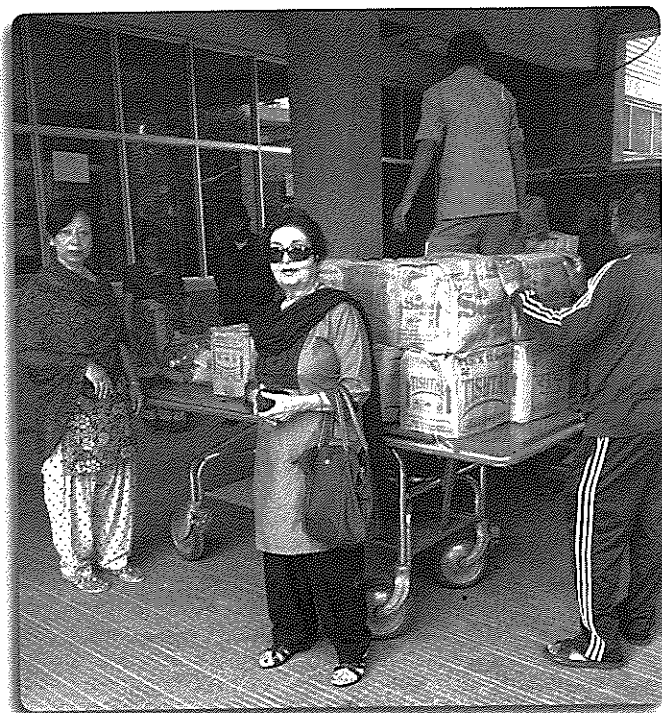
her for her generosity. (Donated by Jahar Devi Shrestha).

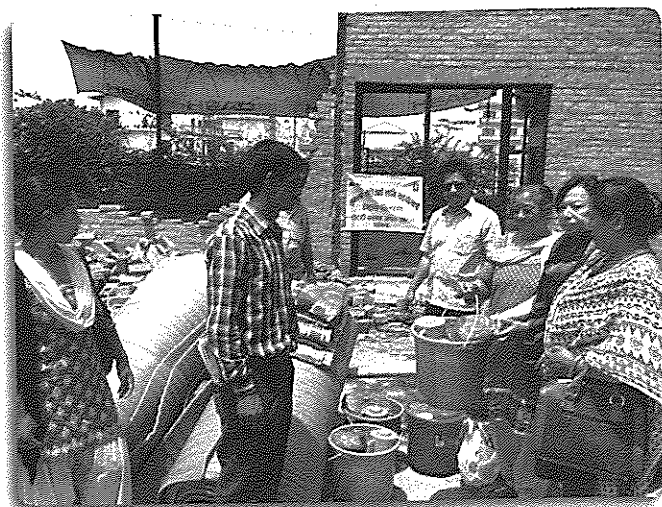
Eye camp at imadole

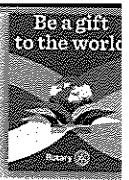
World Rotaract Week Celebration

Purpose:

Objectives:

- To ensure effective functioning of the Club.
- To maintain a motivated club membership, with leadership potential
- To enhance visibility of Rotary Club of Patan.
- To maintain good financial health of the Club.
- To balance activities in all five Avenues of service
- To increase the Club's international outreach.
- To educate members about the Club, Rotary International and The Rotary Foundation.

Goals / Strategies:

On the basis of the above objectives, the following goals and key activities have been proposed for the year 2015-2016

Goal 1 : Effective Club Functioning

Key Actions:

1. Timely payment of RI and district dues (before end of July)
2. Ensure visibility of the role of Sergeant-at-Arms for effective club administration;

4. Have at least three club members mentor a Rotaractor or Interactor;

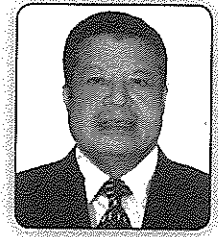
Goal VII: Promote the Rotary Foundation (TRF)
