## Minutes of Meeting No. 1755

Date: 3 Jestha 2078 / 17 May 2021

- 1. President Rtn. Nirmal K. Pradhanang called the virtual meeting No. 1755, to order with 15 seconds of 'Silent Invocation' for Nepal & world peace, health, and happiness.
- 2. The last meeting minutes were reviewed and adopted.
- 3. Pledges of 'Happy News/Sunshine' contribution and to the Operational Fund marked as 'OF':
  - Rtns. Bijaya and Gabriele Mallapaty for 'Happy Wedding Anniversary' and handover of the disinfectant container to the MoHP (NRs. 2,000).
  - Rtn. Khadak S. Bisht for handover of the disinfectant container to the MoHP (NRs. 500).
  - Rtn. Nirmal K. Pradhanang (NRs. 500), Rtn. Shiv P. Khemka (NRs. 500), Rtns. Matsyendra L. and Chandralekha Kayastha (NRs. 2,000), Rtn. Rabendra R. Pandey (NRs. 1,000), and Rtn. Ramesh L. Maskay (NRs. 500) – for handover of the disinfectant container to the MoHP, and oxygen cylinders to the isolation centre established by the NYF in collaboration with Lalitpur Municipality.
  - Rtn. Mahendra B. Thapa for the above, and for beginning the preparatory work of Rotary Year 2021-2022 at the District level (NRs. 500).
  - Rtn. Maheswari Bisht Rawal for the excellent collaboration between Lalitpur Municipality and the RCP on providing the oxygen cylinders to the isolation centre at NYF, and conducting women's group virtual meetings (7:30 to 10 p.m.) on issues of their concern (NRs. 500).

#### 4. Rotary News/Information:

- President Rtn. Nirmal K. Pradhanang:
  - Informed about the next week's interesting talk programme on 'Tigers of Nepal' and requested for good participation including those of spouses.
  - Updated on the Anandakuti school reconstruction project, which has been stopped temporarily due to current COVID-19 restrictions.
- Rtn. Mahendra B. Thapa, President-Elect, informed on the District level preparatory work for the next Rotary Year – 2021-2022. This included planned District Training Assembly during 28 to 31 May 2021 in which he request all the RCP Committee Directors/Club officials to participate. Detailed information on the venue/timing to follow.
- Handover of a container load of disinfectants from Italian Rotarians to the MoHP: Detailed briefing was done by President Nirmal K. Pradhanang, Rtn. Shiv P. Khemka and Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty on this successful support provided by Italian Rotarians through the Rotary Club of Patan. Monitoring of the distribution is ongoing with some press release published in the MoHP site and some media including the RCP's Facebook page. Efforts to further publicise it for RCP/Rotary image was suggested.
- RCP's support to the current wave of COVID-19 pandemic:
  - (i) President Nirmal K. Pradhanang & Rtn. Maheswari Bisht Rawal briefed on the successful provision of oxygen cylinders to support the isolation centre with 50 beds established by Nepal Youth Foundation at their nutrition rehabilitation centre at Sunakothi with excellent collaboration with the Lalitpur Municipality. The isolation centre will support poor people who do not have the facility to isolate themselves at home. The RCP's funding for this project was NRs. 200,000.

- (ii) NRCL is planning to support another isolation centre being managed by 'Jyapu Samaj' for which the RCP's support is also requested.
- (iii) Additional immediate support to frontline healthcare workers at Bir Hospital: During this tragic time of the renewed COVID-19 pandemic, the RCP family wanted to encourage and support the frontline healthcare workers who have been devoting their time and service. Rtn. Prakash R. Regmi proposed to support them with PPEs, various masks, face shields as well as some encouragement gifts. This was very much welcomed by the entire RCP family. A fund-raising effort was suggested for this immediate support as early as possible. In view of the urgency, more details on this will be exchanged and decided via viber/email within this week.
