## Minutes of Meeting No. 1781

Date: 13 Mangshir 2078 / 29 November 2021

## Joint meeting with the Rotaract Club of Patan

Pradhanang, Pushkar M. Shakya and Mahendra S Rawal. As the project is nearing completion, an inauguration programme is being planned tentatively for Saturday, 8 January 2021.

#### 8. Donation of 450 tiffin boxes:

PDG Rtn. Tirtha M. Sakya briefed on the donation of 450 tiffin boxes (with biscuits inside) to the RCP adopted school children. A total of 1,000 tiffin boxes were donated through him by PP Rtn. Man Kazi Pradhan of RC Kavre-Banepa during their installation ceremony in Banepa. He also introduced Rtn. Man Kazi Pradhan as a philanthropist who had been quietly donating through Rotary, and thanked Rtn. Pradhan for this kind gesture through him.

PP of RC Kavre-Banepa also spoke about Rtn. Man Kazi Pradhan and his social service and support to schools in the past four years. He also spoke briefly about the activities of RC Kavre-Banepa.

Regmi commented, including on possible support areas from the RCP.
