Graduate Studies Scholarship Award Programme

Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty conducted the Rotary Club of Patan's first Graduate Studies Scholarship Award (GSSA) programme (2021-2022) with its introduction as a complimentary programme to the RCP's flagship PEEF scholarship support programme to the public-school students in Lalitpur District. Following the Kamalmani Educational Excellence Award (KEEA) to merit students, Rtn. Matsyendra L. Kayastha initiated the GSSA in RY 2018-2019 for the best student receiving PEEF scholarship support based upon grade 11 results. Rtn. Prakash R. Regmi supported this programme with the addition of another best student. The two awards (of NRs. 14,000 every year) will be given to two students for studies up to master's level. Therefore, in six years, it is planned that the RCP would be supporting 12 students sponsored by Rtns. Kayastha and Regmi. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, grade 12 completion had delayed and, therefore, this is the first time the Awards are given.

The recipient students are Mr. Bir Dhoj Tamang from Shree Mahendra Adarsha HSS, Imadol and Ms. Priti Pandey from Shree Bal Kumari HSS, Sunakothi. Bir Dhoj is also a recipient of KEEA 1st Award in 2018. Both Bir Dhoj and Priti had excelled in their 11th grade examinations obtaining a grade point average of 3.8 each.

Bir Dhoj is taking a special course of 'Diploma in Civil Engineering' – a three-year course and plans to continue further studies in this field. The fee for this three-year course is NRs. 250,000 of which NRs. 125,000 has been sponsored by the school. Therefore, Rtn. Matsyendra L. Kayastha added his sponsorship to NRs. 42,000 per year to cover the full fee.

Priti Pandey has been admitted to Patan Campus for Bachelor of Business Studies (BBS) and plans to continue further studies in this field.

Sponsors Rtn. Matsyendra L. Kayastha and Prakash R. Regmi spoke briefly. The RCP's PEEF programme has been of great support to encourage needy students to pursue their educational dreams. They were very pleased to have started this programme to support the best students with further opportunity of advanced studies. They wished the students the best for their success and appreciated that the RCP has provided them with this opportunity.

Awards were handed over to the students together with certificates and honouring them by 'Khada' by President Rtn. Mahendra B. Thapa, PDG Rtn. Tirtha M. Sakya, Rtn. Kedar B. Shrestha and sponsors Rtn. Matsyendra L. Kayastha and Rtn. Prakash R. Regmi.
