8. Briefing on RI Convention in Atlanta, USA: PDG Rtn. Tirtha M. Sakya, Rtn. Gabriele and Bijaya Mallapaty who have returned from Atlanta, briefed on this year's RI Convention. RCP family was represented by ten participants, including spouses, to this year's mega event with a participation of 42,100 persons from 174 countries around the world. Nepal was very well represented.

A major achievement was the announcement of pledges of US \$1.2 billion to Rotary over the coming 3 years for Polio Eradication. This was great news in meeting the gap of US 1.5 billion for this flagship programme of

Rotary compared to US \$1.7 billion that Rotary has managed to raise since 1985. Major contributions were also noted from two still endemic countries - Pakistan and Nigeria. The 3<sup>rd</sup> endemic country is Afghanistan making only 3 remaining countries for a total eradication of Polio from earth.

There were impressive speakers including Bill Gates, Andrew Young, WHO's next Executive Director and many others in the rich convention facility of Atlanta. At the Rotary Foundation's centennial party, we also wrote in Nepali happy 100<sup>th</sup> birthday wishes on the huge display cards on behalf of the Rotary Club of Patan.

Perhaps because of the grand facility, we did not see as much mobilization of the whole city as in some other RI Convention sites we had visited in the past.

We also managed to meet three of our Global Grant/District Grant contacts as follows during the convention: Ms. Cyndie Berg, SPLASH Director for Business Devt., Seattle (for planned GG); Ms. Debra C. Newman, our int'l partner – District Grant for 'KOSISH' (District Grant recently closed); and Ms. Lesley Barmania, our international partner from Canada for 3 ongoing Global Grants (for former Kamlaris & two earthquake related). All of them greatly appreciated the meetings.

Members were encouraged to visit the RI Convention, Atlanta page in the Rotary International website for details with photographs and video clips etc.

 Before the closure of the meeting by the President, the Joint Secretary announced: Contribution NRs. 7,000 (NRs. 2,400 for attendance, and NRs. 4,600 including President's top-up of NRs. 200 for Sunshine Funds); attendance: 23 members, 1 spouse, and 7 make-ups.
