- 8. Before the closure of the meeting by the President, the Secretary announced: Contribution NRs. 19,000 (NRs. 3,300 for attendance, and NRs. 15,700 including President's top-up of NRs. 200 for Sunshine Funds); attendance: 1 visiting Rotarian, 9 Rotaracts, 33 members, and 4 make-ups.

## <u>Final Regular Weekly Meeting of 2016-2017 President</u> <u>with presentation of his annual summary report</u>

Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty presented his final summary report for the Rotary Year 2016-2017 starting with a summary of the SWOC (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Challenges) analysis done at the beginning of the year. Based on this analysis, the goals and targets for the year were set. In summary, while a lot has been achieved, it was noted that continuous work is needed. Details of the SOWC analysis in a power point format is posted in the Rotary Club of Patan Facebook page.

Based on the SOWC, Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty had mentioned two most important aspects for Rotary work, i.e. 'Service' and 'Fellowship' like two sides of a coin and often overlapping like 'Yin & Yang'. If we do well in these two, other Rotary priorities such as increase in membership and contributions to the Rotary Foundation would follow. He then went on to present what has been achieved with the statistics as summarized below:

In **Service**: (i) With external support: G8 Global Grants (6 ongoing & 2 closed); 1 Global Grant under preparation, 1 District Grant closed and 1 In-Kind donation with a total funding of US \$ 739,262.

- (ii) Club owned flagship 'PEEF' programme with KEEA: Balance in Trust Fund and Operating Fund NRs. 11,617,357 and NRs. 508,080 respectively with an annual distribution of NRs. 900,000. Late Rtns. Narayan G. Halwai and Kamalmani Dixit were specifically remembered for their contributions to this programme.
- (iii) Earthquake support: Total funding NRs. 5,373,409.
- (iv) The Rotary Foundation: Highest total contribution of US \$23,485 of which US \$6,688 to the annual fund, percapita member contribution of US \$176 (district average US \$93), one major Donor and one Paul Harris Society member added, and the balance of club foundation recognition point is US \$11,747.
- (v) Club Service Fund reached NRs. 1,484,763 which is an increase of NRs. 256,112 in addition to covering NRs. 135,806 in PEEF programme.

In **Fellowship:** With a wider and holistic sense of fellowship, it was summarized under four headings – (i) Family Inclusion, (ii) Networking and Communication, (iii) Public Relation, and (iv) Club Administration.

Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty concluded his presentation mentioning how humbled and honoured he has been with the opportunity to serve as the RCP President for 2016-2017. He believed that together we have made the club stronger and apologized for any weaknesses and shortcomings. He thanked all the RCP family present including those unable to join today, and urged all to continue to serve in the year with the slogan "Rotary: Making a Difference" under the leadership of incoming President Rtn. Chandralekha Kayastha.

AG Rtn. Surya M. Shakya thanked Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty for a very successful year of the RCP and mentioned how much he enjoyed being part of the RCP as the Assistant Governor.
