Minutes of Meetings No.1566

- 1. IPP Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty garlanded President Rtn. Chandralekha Kayastha with the RCP Presidents' garland, and President Rtn. Chandralekha Kayastha called the meeting no. 1566 to order with 15 seconds of 'Silent Invocation' for Peace and Happiness.
- 2. Guests welcomed by the President: Rotaracts Peshal and Gaurav.
- 3. Installation of 2017-2018 Team
 - (i) Starting the installation of the new President, IPP Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty mentioned how pleased he was to welcome Rtn. Chandralekha Kayastha as the first female President of the RCP, especially since the couple Kayastha had introduced the couple Mallapaty to the RCP back in 2008. While the installation ceremony was not mandatory in Rotary, it is a wonderful occasion for the entire club to celebrate and welcome the new team. Noting that a summary report of his presidency was already presented last week, IPP Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty moved on to conduct the 'Oath of Office' of President Rtn. Chandralekha Kayastha, presented the RCP Charter Certificate and a file of permanent and important documents of the RCP, and requested her to continue to preside the meeting.
 - (ii) President Rtn. Chandralekha Kayastha made an opening statement thanking all the RCP members for electing her as the President for this year. She then congratulated and thanked IPP Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty and his team for the outstanding work during the last Rotary Year bringing the club to a new height of achievements.

For this year's RI President's Theme 'Rotary: Making a Difference', she reminded of three strategic priorities to achieve this goal: (i) Support and strengthen clubs, (ii) Focus and increase humanitarian service, and (iii) Enhance Rotary image and awareness.

She iterated that the strength of the club is its membership and through their support, the Rotary philosophy of 'fellowship' and 'service' can be prioritized. She appreciated great success in both areas with maximum participation of the RCP family. In terms of Rotary image, she mentioned that the RCP was already visible in the Rotary community and would work further with Rotaracts and Interacts in this regard.

President Rtn. Chandralekha Kayastha emphasized the importance of teamwork and related the current DG's theme of 'Unity' to make a difference in the communities around us. She concluded by, once again, appreciating the efficiency and professionalism of the Mallapaty couple and requested everyone's support to continue in this path during her Presidency.

An inspiring video spot on Rotary's efforts and successes to eradicate Polio was shown.

Continuing the Installation Programme, President Rtn. Chandralekha Kayastha conducted the 'Oath of Office' of her entire Team of fifteen (Club Officials, Chairpersons/Directors, and Board Members).

Sharma, Pushkar M. Shakya, Kedar B. Shrestha (also for good attendance 25+ and Kiran Shrestha's presence today, NRs. 600), Shiv P. Khemka (NRs. 500), Siba B. Rajbhandary (especially noting how he managed to bring her to join the RCP NRs. 500), Kiran Shrestha (NRs. 500), Lalita Thapa (also for her forthcoming consultancy in East Timor NRs. 1,000), Kiran Thapa (also for being the Chairperson of Club Administration, NRs. 500), and Matsyendra L. & Chandralekha Kayastha (for new President and for the IPP NRs. 4000).

- 6. Other Contributions:

- Rtn. Gabriele Mallapaty presented the names and amounts of 10 highest contributions to the RCP's sunshine funds during RY 2017-2018. They are: Rtn. Matsyendra L. Kayastha NRs. 17,900 (+5,000 as the highest contributor of previous year), Rtn. Dr. Prakash R. Regmi 15,900, Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty NRs. 13,850, Rtn. Shiv P. Khemka 13,200, Rtn. Gabriele Mallapaty 12,800, Rtn. Chandralekha Kayastha 11,300, Rtn. Nirmal Pradhanang 9,800, Rtn. Kedar B. Shrestha 9,300, Rtn. Santa K. Shrestha 8,700 and Rtn. Ganesh R. Shrestha 8,300). Following the tradition established by late Rtn. Kamalmani Dixit, Rtn. Rabendra R. Pandey (not present) had confirmed a contribution of NRs. 5,000 in the name of the highest contributor to this fund.
- President Rtn. Chandralekha Kayastha handed-over a contribution of NRs. 25,000 to the Club Service Fund

12th Joint Board Meeting of the RCP held on 30 June 2017

Rtn. Mahendra Thapa presented the following minutes/decisions of the 12th Joint Board Meeting hosted by President Bijaya Mallapaty and President Elect Chandralekha Kayastha, which were endorsed/approved by the 'House'.

- Decisions of the 11th Board Meeting were reviewed.
- 2. Information received on the Senior Citizen's Home was shared. Since the Home was handed over to the Kitini College, the Board decided to let the Kitini College take necessary decisions in this regard.
- 3. Board noted the planned change in Office Assistant from 1 October 2017 when Peshal Bhattarai will succeed Basant Ale Magar.
- 4. Board approved the opening of the Fixed Deposit Account in the name of Rotary Club of Patan for NRs. 203,800 from Club Service Fund at the Century Commercial Bank with any two among Rtns. Bharat N. Joshi, Bishwa B. Sharma and Bijayashwar Mallapaty as the signatories to open, close or operate the account.
- Treasurer Rtn. Bharat N. Joshi presented the financial status of the club as of 30 June 2017 together with detailed individual as well as a summary report. After due deliberations, Board passed a 'vote of thanks' to Rtn. Bharat N. Joshi for the comprehensive reporting.
- 6. Treasurer Rtn. Bharat N. Joshi also presented the proposed RCP budget for the Rotary Year 2017-2018 following initial discussions/suggestions of the last board meeting. After due deliberations, the total budget of NRs. 1,533,000 was agreed upon.
- 7. Lalitdhara Souvenir Coordinator Rtn. Mahendra Thapa briefed on the ongoing preparations to finalize the publication to go to press by 15 August 2017 and requested everyone's support.
- 8. President Elect Rtn. Chandralekha Kayastha updated on immediate key activities of the club, DG visit, Charter Day, and the final list of RCP committees/sub-committees. She also requested all the Chairpersons/Directors to review their respective presentation in the format prepared by Rtn. Gabriele Mallapaty and present it during the 2nd Club Assembly on 10 July 2017.
- 9. A committee was formed for the Charter Day arrangements with Rtn. Kedar B. Shrestha as its Coordinator and Rtns. Ganesh R. Shrestha & Shiva K. Pradhan as its members.
- 10. As per annual practice, the RCP representation to the Nepal Orthopaedic Hospital for the next Rotary Year was revised with Rtn. Piyush Bajracharya to continue and Rtn. Jeevan K. Shrestha to be succeeded by IPP Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty.
- 11. The following dates and hosts for the next two board meetings of RY 2017-2018 were agreed:
