Minutes of Meetings No.1584

Date: 27 Kartik 2074 / 13 November 2017

- (iv) Heart Screening of all children of Primary School (over 100)
- (v) Reviving of the RCC and the Interact Club
- (vi) Plan new support to further improve the Goat sheds in Chepang area, and
- (vii) Plan new support to improve the toilets (in extremely poor condition) for students of the Primary school.

Summary of Talk Programme by Guest Speaker Dr. Sudan R. Panthi from WHO on 'Seven Flags Approach of Total Sanitation' (7FATS) in Schools

Rtn. Gabriele Mallapaty introduced Dr. Sudan R. Panthi from WHO who is the initiator of the 'Seven Flags Approach of Total Sanitation' (7FATS) in Schools, which is now the WHO standard. WHO has agreed to collaborate with the RCP to provide technical expertise and guidance for the planned global grant project for the improvement of WASH in the RCP's PEEF supported schools. This Project is planned with our Rotary International Partner Club - RC Vignola Castelfranco and local partner Prabhav (Splash Nepal).

Dr. Sudan R. Panthi explained how the 'Seven Flags Approach of Total Sanitation' (7FATS) was introduced by WHO following presentation of his paper on this subject in the South Asian Conference on Sanitation - SACOSAN VI in 2016.

Dr. Panthi gave the details of 7FATS approach with seven indicators and seven sustainability steps as follows:

Seven Indicators:

- i. Use of Toilet,
- ii. Hand Washing and Hygiene
- iii. Menstrual Hygiene
- iv. Equity in WASH
- v. Safe Water
- vi. Safe Food, and
- vii. Clean Environment

Seven Sustainability Steps:

- i. Team Formation
- ii. Situation Analysis
- iii. Sanitation Conference at School
- iv. Promotional Activities
- v. Fund-Raising Activities
- vi. Reward & Recognition, &
- vii. Declaration of 7FATS

Dr. Panthi elaborated on the indicators and steps with sub-indicators, and how to implement them in schools. His power-point presentation with details including photographs of actual success stories is being shared separately.

After a lively Q/A session, Rtn. Mahendra S. Rawal gave a 'Vote of Thanks' to Dr. Sudan R. Panthi for his excellent presentation on behalf of the RCP family. President Rtn. Chandralekha Kayastha concluded the session with the presentation of 'Token of Appreciation' to Dr. Panthi, as well as to the District Education Officer and visiting Rotarian guests.
