Minutes of Meetings No.1585

Date: 4 Mangsir 2074 / 20 November 2017

- 1. President Rtn. Chandralekha Kayastha called the meeting no. 1585 to order with 15 seconds of 'Silent Invocation' for Peace and Happiness.
- 2. Guests welcomed by the President: Guest Speaker Ms. Jasmine Rajbhandary; spouse Mithila Rajbhandary; and Rotaracts President Rubina Shakya and Sajal Khadka.
- 3. The last meeting minutes were reviewed and adopted.
- 4. 'Happy News' Contributions:

Other Contributions:

- Rtn. Siba B. Rajbhandary handed over his contribution of NRs. 5,000 to the RCP's Club Service Fund, which was matched by Rtns. Matsyendra L. and Chandralekha Kayastha as pledged.
- Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty handed over a cheque of NRs. 10,71,117.12 (Rupees ten lacs seventy-one thousand one hundred seventeen and Paisa twelve only) received from M/S Kunda and Kanak Dixit in the name of their father late Rtn. - On the talk programme of Karna Shakya coordinated by RC Lalitpur Mid-Town, Rtn. Padam L. Maharjan gave a summary brief.

- Rtn. Siba B. Rajbhandary briefed on the District Grant Management Seminar hosted by RC Butwal where they remembered the RCP as their grandparent club.

- Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty briefed on the 83 bedside chairs/stools being provided by the RCP to the Kirtipur Hospital utilizing the NRs. 100,000 contributed by Rtn. Kamal Nyachhyon. A handover event is being planned for which maximum participation from the RCP is requested.
- President Rtn. Chandralekha Kayastha also briefed on meeting of Presidents of the Rotary Clubs in Lalitpur (10 out of 16 participating) to brainstorm on possible Rotary support to 'Road Safety, Cleaning and Maintaining Greenery' in Lalitpur as per details provided by Rtn. Nugal Vaidya shared earlier.

<u>Summary of Talk Programme by Guest Speaker Guest Speaker</u> *Ms. Jasmine Rajbhandary on Social Protection in Nepal*

Rtn. Padam L. Maharjan introduced Paul Harris Fellow Ms. Jasmine Rajbhandary, daughter of long-time friends Rtn. Siba B. and Mithila Rajbhandary. Ms. Jasmine Rajbhandary was born in Lesotho, and grew up and studied in several countries in Africa, U.K. and the USA. After getting her Master's Degree in Int'l Devt from American University in Washington D.C., she returned to Nepal in 1997. She is married to Mr. Girish Man Shrestha and has one son.

She has worked for human rights NGOs, Save the Children, DFID and since eight years with the World Bank in Kathmandu as a senior social protection specialist.

Ms. Jasmine Rajbhandary made a power-point presentation and talked comprehensively about the situation of social protection in Nepal. Defining the concept of social protection as insurance against risks, protection against poverty, and access to economic opportunity and human capital development, she elaborated on three key platforms for social protection:

- Pensions/Social insurance:
- Social safety nets/Social assistance for equity, and
- Labor market programmes and opportunities.

While Nepal compares relatively well with other South Asian countries in terms of social protection spending (3.76% of GDP in 2016-2017), Ms. Rajbhandary mentioned that the impact has been rather limited for a multitude of reasons such as safety nets not being shock responsive, limited monitoring and evaluation, and fragmentation and proliferation of programmes and policies. She also elaborated on the reforms needed and support underway from the World Bank with its current five-year programme of US \$150 million with the Government of Nepal.

After a lively Q/A session, on behalf of the RCP family, Rtn. Gabriele Mallapaty gave a 'Vote of Thanks' to Ms. Jasmine Rajbhandary for her excellent presentation. President Rtn. Chandralekha Kayastha concluded the session with the presentation of a 'Token of Appreciation' to Ms. Rajbhandary.
