Summary of Rtn. Lochan Gyawali's presentation on 'Tea'

Rtn. Lochan Gyawali made a scholarly presentation on the origins of 'Tea', its usage worldwide, and situation of tea production in Nepal. The power point presentation included very nice and relevant pictures on the subject. A few highlights:

- Originated in China's Yunan Province that produces some 260 out of 380 types of tea;
- Legend has it that 'The Cradle of Tea' in China started in BC 2737 during Emperor Shennong's time, with recorded history of tea culture there since some 3000 years.
- Buddhism also spread Tea culture and the 'Tea culture' also helped the development of fine Ceramics; and
- Tea culture spread to Japan in 805 A.D. during Heian Jidai period.
- In Nepal, tea was introduced by Col. Gajraj Thapa in 1861;
- First factory in Nepal was none other than a 'Tea Factory' established in 1878;
- Total output of Tea in Nepal was 20 million kgs. in 2012-13, which is a growth of 400% within a period of 12 years, with an export of 10,709 tons worth over 2 billion Rupees;
- Rtn. Gyawali's family Tea industry is called 'Jun Chiyabari' that was established in 2000 in Nigale, Hile, Dhankutta with a plantation area of 75 Hectares, and produces about 25,000 kgs. of Tea per year, primarily for export.
- He also explained a 8 step process that goes through the production of Tea for consumption, from the time it is harvested and brought to the Factory: Plucking > Withering > Rolling > Oxidisation (except for green Tea) > Drying > Sorting > Packing > Sending tea samples to potential buyers.
- Rtn. Gyawali also highlighted that all different types of 'Tea' come from same trees, but the production process separates its variety. He also explained some of the reasons for 'Tea' drinking culture Health, Social and Relaxation, which has the blessing of all 'Deities'.
