 - President a.i. Matsyendra L. Kayastha informed that Rtn. Pushkar M. Shakya and spouse were injured while on a trip to distribute relief supplies to the recent earthquake victims.
 - Rtn. Siba B. Rajbhandary informed that all the three postponed district events (District Training Assembly, District Membership Seminar and District Grant Management Seminar) are planned to be held during 13 to 14 June 2015.
 - The four monthly 'Birthday Fellowship' of the Rotary Club of Patan: Following consultations, the Fellowship Coordinator, Rtn. Kedar B. Shrestha's suggested to have it on Saturday, 30 May 2015 as afternoon tea/snacks at 5:00 p.m. at the Shaligram Hotel. It was also suggested that full amount of NRs. 4,000 each be collected from the members of this group, and after subtracting the tea/snacks cost, the difference be donated to the RCP's earthquake relief fund. This was agreed.
 - A cheque of NRs. 900,000 being advance for this year's PEEF scholarships was handed over by the President a.i. to Rtn. Ganesh R. Shrestha, Distribution Manager of the PEEF.
 - Rtn. Dr. Prakash R. Regmi informed about a Health Camp by a Team of 5, being held in Lalitpur District on this Thursday and Friday, 28-29 May - 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., as part of the RCP funded project 'Primary Prevention of Rheumatic Fever and Rheumatic Heart Disease in children'. - 9. Before the closure of the meeting by the President a.i. the Secretary announced: contributions to the 'Sunshine' Fund NRs. 7,250, attendance 3 guests, 27 members & 5 make-ups.

RCP's Global Grant GG1527136 (Int'l Partner: Group of Mississauga Rotary Clubs, Canada): Vocational Training of 'Kamlaris' through the Nepal Youth Foundation - Presentations and Handing-over of 1st instalment of funding of NRs. 1,000,000

Before the formal handover of a cheque of NRs. 1,000,000 by the President a.i. Matsyendra L. Kayastha to the Nepal Youth Foundation, two presentations were made. First, by the project's 'Primary Contract' from the RCP Rtn. Mahendra Thapa and second by Mr. Raju Dhamala, Executive Director of the Nepal Youth Foundation (NYF).

Rtn. Mahendra Thapa briefed on the project to provide vocational training of 110 Kamlaris through the NYF. The training is geared towards making the participants self-sufficient by empowering them with income generating skills in areas such as tailoring, vegetable farming, pig and goat farming, community livestock, house wiring, and mobile repair. It is expected to reduce poverty by increasing their average annual income. Rtn. Thapa also shared a proposed hoarding board with a summary of the project, which should inform the public and raise Rotary's image. (Rtn. Dr. Aruna Uprety and Rtn. Kamala Maharjan are the two secondary contacts from the RCP for this Project).

Mr. Raju Dhamala presented the details of the project in summary and also briefed on the Nepal Youth Foundation's management structure and programme coverage with activities in the areas of Shelter/Children's Homes, Freedom/Empowerment, Education and Health/Nutrition. The NYF has been working in Nepal since 1992 and has been collaborating with the RCP with several projects. While NYF's programmes are spread throughout the country, the Kamlaris, former indentured girls of Tharu tribe, come from 5 districts of Nepal, i.e. Kanchanpur, Kailali, Bardia, Banke and Dang. Mr. Dhamala elaborated on the activities of the project with a detailed work-plan.
