- Rtn. Kedar B. Shrestha informed about the first 'Birthday Fellowship' of RCP on Nov. 12, 2016, Saturday.

Summary of talk programme by Guest Speaker Dr. Nirendra D. Maskey, Geo-Science Expert related to Earthquakes

Rtn. Kedar B. Shrestha introduced Dr. Nirendra D. Maskey. Dr. Maskey is a Geo-Science expert, a retired Senior Divisional Geologist, former President of Nepal Geological Society and President of East-West Centre Association, Nepal Chapter, Kathmandu. His work experience includes geotechnical investigation for dam sites, reservoirs, core drilling, Luzean test, adit mapping, construction material survey, installation of 4 micro seismic stations and preparation of geotechnical maps, cross section and writing geotechnical reports.

Dr. Maskey talked about the Mega Earthquake of April 25, 2015 of magnitude 7.8 causing 9,000 dead, 23,000 injured and 800,000 houses collapsed. He also talked about 441 aftershocks above magnitude 4.0. Dr. Maskey talked about the past Earthquakes of 1833 and 1934 on Geological and Technical map of Nepal.

As the whole of Kathmandu valley was once a lake, most of the areas in the valley consist of black cotton soil, which is considered unsuitable for construction, as indicated in Engineering and Environmental Geological Map of Kathmandu valley. For the preparation of Engineering and Environmental Geological Map of Kathmandu valley, research is being done by drilling work. The drilling research is done by TU/Geological Department, and a Japanese companies. There is also a risk of liquefaction during earthquakes which can cause buildings to tilt. Dr. Maskey recommended soil testing before erecting any tall structures and to design the foundation of buildings as per the soil test report.

On behalf of the RCP family, Rtn. Matsyendra L. Kayastha gave 'Vote of Thanks' to Dr. Nirendra D. Maskey for the presentation related to earthquakes and for his suggestion of soil test for design of foundation of buildings; and Vice President Rtn. Lalita Thapa presented 'Lalitdhara Souvenir' and 'Rotary Ka Kura' as a 'Token of Appreciation'.
