Summary of Rotary Club of Patan's 2nd Graduate Studies Scholarship Award (GSSA) and 10th Kamalmani Educational Excellence (KEEA) Programmes

President Rtn. Shiva K. Pradhan welcomed the Chief Guest Mr. Kunda M. Dixit and his spouse Ms. Milan Dixit and all the participants to the RCP's annual GSSA and KEEA programme and Rtns. Bijaya Mallapaty and Mahendra S. Rawal conducted the programmes.

Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty introduced the KEEA and GSSA programme and the awardees highlighting:

The RCP's Flagship PEEF Programme started since 1991, which is need based programme and currently supports over 400 students in grades 7 to 12 in 25 public schools of Lalitpur district. The KEEA and GSSA programmes have been added to recognise merit. While KEEA recognises 10 best students receiving PEEF scholarship support based upon grade 9 results (more on this below), the GSSA programme recognises two best students receiving PEEF scholarship support based upon grade 11 results. This was initiated by Rtn. Matsyendra L. Kayastha and supported by Rtn. Prakash R. Regmi with first batch award given last year. With the second batch this year, a total of 4 students are receiving the GSSA of NRs. 14,000 every year. (Cont'd.....2)

2. Ms. Susmita Thapa, Shree Chandi Adarsha Sarall Higher Secondary School, Chakupat. Headmaster – Kul Bahadur Nepali. 11th Grade result was 3.42 grade point or A level. Joined Baneswor Multiple College (BBS) (Classes start in Baisakh 2080).

Continuation of Cash Award to last year's awardees: 1. Bir Dhoj Tamang (from Shree Mahendra Adarsh, Imadol. Sponsored by: Rtn. Matsyendra L. Kayastha (NRs. 42,000 per year as an exception). Studying Diploma in Civil Engineering (last year of a 3-year programme). 2. Priti Pandey (from Shree Bal Kumari, Sunakothi), Sponsored by: Rtn. Prakash R. Regmi. Studying Bachelor of Business Studies (BBS) 2nd year at Patan Campus. (Currently on travel).

Initiator and sponsor Rtn. Matsyendra L. Kayastha spoke a few words on behalf of himself and the second sponsor Rtn. Prakash R. Regmi about the GSSA programme. They have been very pleased with the start of this programme and hoped that this will truly support the higher-level education of the selected students and that the programme will continue to expand to support more students.

This year's awards were handed over by the two sponsors and the President to the three awardees named above.

On behalf of the schools, headmaster Mr. Gopal Kumar Pandey spoke a few words appreciating this initiative of the Rotary Club of Patan and thanked the sponsors for their initiative and contributions. On behalf of the recipients of the awards, Ms. Sushmita Thapa spoke a few words of gratefulness and how this recognition and support will go a long way in fulfilling their dreams of higher-level education.

Rtn. Mahendra S. Rawal introduced the RCP's KEEA, which started with the initiative of late Rtn. Kamalmani Dixit in 2013 to recognise the best student among the PEEF scholarship recipients. Since then, it has expanded several times to reach the current 10 awards, which is the 10th year of the award. The funds have increased with contributions from Late Kamalmani Dixit's sons Kunda & Kanak Mani Dixit, late Rtn. Narayan Halwai, and several members of the RCP. The ten award certificates this year has a total of NRs. 150,000 (One 1st NRs. 30,000; three second at NRs. 20,000 each, and six third at 10,000 each). Ten top-scoring students in the final examination of grade nine from ten different schools supported by the RCP's PEEF scholarship programme are selected. All ten students are called for an interview and categorised as: one best all-round student, three second-best students and six third-best students.
