Date: 29 Ashwin 2080 / 16 October 2023

6. Rotary Information:

- President Rtn. Mahendra S. Rawal:
 - Briefed on the District's 'Ethics Day' programme being held on 18 October as shared electronically and requested interested members from the RCP to participate.
 - Briefed on the successful closing ceremony of the 6th batch of training in the RCP's joint project of vocational training on organic vegetable and poultry farming for people with disabilities with ADSoN and TRIFC. From the RCP, himself, and Rtns. Bishnu P. Sigdel, Gabriele and Bijaya Mallapaty participated.
- It was reminded that there will be no regular weekly meeting on Monday, 23 October 2023, due to Dashain Holidays.
- Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty briefed on the completion of this year's KEEA short-listed students interview by the RCP's sub-group. For the programme on the KEEA, date being determined after Tihar festivities, it was suggested to have a session for all the headmasters coordinated by Rtn. Ganga R. Gautam like the last year.

He also handed-over a 'Token of Appreciation' presented to the RCP by the RCP's PEEF supported Path Pradarsak School, Badikhel, during their annual day celebrations participated by Rtn. Gabriele Mallapaty & himself.

Rtn. Prakash R. Regmi shared a detailed plan for the planned RCP trip to Galkot/Baglung during 18 to 22
November 2023 being organised in coordination with Rtn. Ganga R. Gautam. He requested interested members
to confirm their participation as soon as possible to finalise the trip. So far, 15 to 20 participants have been
interested to join.

- Amendment to the District By-Laws: The District's request to all the clubs on this was reviewed. The RCP
 'House' passed the resolution to support direct election for the selection of District Governor Nominee
 unanimously. Necessary report on this will be submitted to the District as requested by 21 October 2023.
- On behalf of the Rotaract Club of Patan, Rtr. Sandhya Chaulagain invited all the RCP members to join their annual 'Good Morning Tea Party Fellowship' on the occasion of 'Vijaya Dashami' from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturday, 21 October 2023, at Tri Padma School, Pulchowk.
- Rtn. Krishna Hachhethu briefed on his 18th and new book on 'Nation-building and Federalism in Nepal' published by Oxford, which will be available from 17 October 2023 in Nepal.
