Minutes of Meeting No. 1882

Date: 25 Mangshir 2080 / 11 December 2023

- 8. Before the adjournment of the meeting by the President, Joint Secretary Rtn. Ganesh R. Shrestha announced the meeting attendance of 5 guests, 6 Rotaracts, 26 school headmasters/teachers, 11 students, 14 members, 1 spouse, and 12 make-ups.

Summary of the 11th 'Kamalmani Educational Excellence Award (KEEA) Programme

President Rtn. Mahendra S. Rawal welcomed the special guests from late Kamalmani ji's family and all the participants to the above-mentioned programme.

Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty conducted the programme by remembering late Rtns. Kamalmani Dixit and Narayan Govind Halwai on this special occasion. On behalf of the RCP, he congratulated all the KEEA winners and encouraged them to study hard and excel in their studies further.

Giving some background, he talked about the RCP's flagship programme 'Prajapati Education Endowment Fund' known as PEEF started in 1991, which has reached a Trust Fund of 1.6 crore and an additional programme fund of 44 lakh Nepalese Rupees. The RCP provides annual scholarships from these funds to over 400 students in 24 schools of Lalitpur district every year. This year, scholarships were provided to 418 students with a total amount of NRs. 16.81 Lakh in grades 7 to 12.

Some 200 RCP Members, their family, relatives, friends, and other well-wishers have contributed to reach this level of the Trust Fund. The annual distribution programme is participated by all the RCP family on a voluntary basis, which is the most important reason for the continued success of the PEEF programme.

PEEF is a need-based programme, but also rewards merit. Late Kamalmani ji thought of recognizing the merit students among the PEEF recipients and contributed to establish an annual award to the best performing all-round

student from among the PEEF recipients at grade 9. This recognition also provides advocacy and motivates other students. The first KEEA was NRs. 5,000 in 2013.

The KEEA programme has since expanded with additional donations from late Kamalmani ji's family and sponsorship of other RCP members. Today, there are 10 awards with certificates and cash prizes. The first award is NRs. 30,000 in the name of late Kamalmani ji. The second award is NRs. 20,000 each to 3 students and the 3rd award is NRs. 10,000 each to 6 additional students – thus reaching a total award of NRs. 150,000 to 10 students from 10 different schools.

On behalf of the RCP family, Rtn. Mallapaty thanked the entire PEEF Management Committee and specifically the KEEA selection committee comprising of President Rtn. Mahendra S. Rawal, PEEF Coordinator Rtn. Preeti Khemka, Secretary Rtn. Shiv P. Khemka and Service Projects Chair Rtn. Bijaya Mallapaty for all the work of the committee.
