  - President Rtn. Mahendra S. Rawal:
    - Informed on his participation together with Rtn. Siba B. Rajbhandary in the Nepali New Year's Day meeting at Rotary Club of Kathmandu.
    - Informed on his participation together with Rtns. Rabendra R. Pandey and Bishnu P. Sigdel for start of the 8<sup>th</sup> batch of training in organic vegetables and poultry farming to people with disabilities under the joint TRIFC/ADSoN/RCP project.
  - President Rtn. Hricha Aryal briefed on the 'Late Rtn. Krishna B. Basnyat memorial Blood Donation programme organised at Mangal Bazar, Lalitpur, by the Rotaract Club of Patan with sponsorship of the Rotary Club of Patan. The event was a grand success and was supported by several other partners with a collection 27 pints of blood from volunteer donors for Nepal Red Cross.
  - Rtn. Rabendra R. Pandey briefed on the session of President Elects Training Seminar 'PETS' on planned partnership among Rotary District, TRIFC, ADSoN and the RCP to support projects for people with disabilities by Rotary Clubs in Nepal. It is planned to support projects with 100% matching up to NRs. 100,000 per project with a total annual budget of NRs. 25 Lakh. Many Clubs are planning to work on disability sector next year and were pleased to learn about this joint effort. A MOU is being prepared to implement the programme starting from the next Rotary Year.
- 6. Peace on Earth: A photo session was held for the planned representation of the RCP inside a capsule in a rocket scheduled to launch for the Moon in late 2024. The photo with the banner of the club and the signage 'Peace on Earth' will be submitted to the organisers to promote Rotary's priority on 'Peace' as part of an endeavour to promote 'Peace on Earth' from the Moon on the UN's 'International Day of Peace' on 21 September 2024.

7. Before the adjournment of the meeting by the President, Secretary, Rtn. Shiv P. ## Summary of Rotary Club of Patan's 13th Vocational Service Awards Programme

President Rtn. Mahendra S. Rawal welcomed all to this annual programme of the RCP and Rtn. Prakash R. Regmi, Coordinator of the RCP's Vocational Service Awards committee conducted the programme.

On behalf of the RCP and other members of the committee Rtns. Rabendra R. Pandey and Nirmal K. Pradhanang, Rtn. Regmi welcomed the Chief Guest, AG, Rtn. Tika N. Lohani; Awardees Ms. Prakriti Bhattarai and Mr. Min B. Achami; RI District 3292, President of RC Kamaladi; Rtn. Ewerhard Engels; Mr. Anil Adhikari; Journalist Mr. Gopal J. Thapa; Ms. Amulya Rana; Teachers from Siddhi Mangal School; Rotaract Club of Patan President Rtr. Hricha Aryal and Rotaracts; and RCP members' spouses to this special annual programme of the RCP.

Rtn. Regmi gave a brief introduction about the awards to recognize outstanding personalities in vocational service that the RCP started in 2010-2011. This year, two awardees are recognized for their outstanding contributions with honesty and perseverance in the fields of 'people with disabilities' and 'Education'.

Rtns. Rabendra R. Pandey and Nirmal K. Pradhanang added to the background and importance of vocational service awards in Rotary and introduced the recipients Ms. Prakriti Bhattarai and Mr. Min B. Achami, respectively.

Chief Guest AG Rtn. Tika M. Lohani, President Rtn. Mahendra S. Rawal, and the RCP's Rotarians Matsyendra L. Kayastha, Preeti Khemka and Chandralekha Kayastha, represented all in welcoming and honouring the awardees (certificates & cash of NRs. 25,000 each).

**Ms. Prakriti Bhattarai** was awarded in the vocational service area of 'people with disabilities'. She was recognised as and 'epitome of courage, never give-up attitude' in her professional contributions to the society. Herself a person with disability, she currently works in Lalitpur Metropolis Women Development Section as a computer operator and has been very active in support of people with disabilities.

Ms. Bhattarai explained her life story since it was found that she had cerebral palsy and despite prevailing neglect, how her parents succeeded in her up-bringing to make her independent and able to support the society. She was thankful to Rtn. Maheswari Bisht Rawal under whom she worked in the Lalitpur Metropolis Women Development Section. She also plans to support people with disabilities with self- sustaining income generating activities. She emphasized the need of all concerned to unite for the improvements in the disability sector, and thanked the Rotary Club of Patan for this important and motivating recognition.

*Mr. Min B. Achami* was awarded in the vocational service area of 'Education'. He was recognised for continuous outstanding service to improve educational facilities and achievement by students at public school. He has been a teacher for the last 30 years with 9 years at a headmaster. For six years, he is the headmaster of Siddhimangal High School where he managed to increase the student enrolment from 600 to 1100 students and added a new four storey building together with the addition of two stories in the existing facility as well as several other facilities such as for WASH, sports and ICT and STEAM labs. This is one of the RCP's twenty-four PEEF scholarship supported school, which has also been adopted as one of the four schools for comprehensive support in line with the District's Rotary Nepal Literacy Mission (RNLM) priorities.

Mr. Achami talked about how he managed to change the school enrolment form 'collection to selection' in his public school raising the standard of education to not only compete but excel in comparison to private schools. He has received several encouraging rewards for his work, and he thanked the RCP for this recognition that will further motivate him in his professional service. He also recognised his spouse for her extra-ordinary support and shared the certificate with her.

Coordinator Rtn. Regmi, Chief Guest AG Rtn. Lohani and President Rtn. Rawal all praised the awardees and appreciated their contribution to the society as true examples of using their vocations for the excellent service to the society and the community. Rtn. Lohani also thanked the RCP for organising the awards ceremony and the President concluded with invitation to all the participants for a fellowship reception on behalf of the RCP.
