Minutes of Meeting No. 1948

Date: 8 Baisakh 2082 / 21 April 2025

Summary of Talk Programme by Ms. Urvasi Basnyat, Station Manager of Radio Sagarmatha, on the roles and responsibilities of radio for public

President Rtn. Preeti Khemka welcomed Ms. Urvasi Basnyat, Station Manager/Managing Editor of Radio Sagarmatha 102.4 MHz and Rtn. Som Paneru introduced her. Ms. Basnyat has been with Radio Sagarmatha for the last 25 years and has been the first female Station Manager since 2021. Prior to her current position, she had worked as Senior Producer (News and Programme) and Content Adviser (Rural Television Nepal).

Ms. Basnyat has a Masters in Humanities and Social Sciences and has completed several training courses on networking, radio/tv productions, radio feature and television presentation, programme production and broadcasting, election reporting, radio journalism, and gender equality in politics and media. She has been a professional member of several related associations and has been awarded with several honours.

Ms. Basnyat appreciated the opportunity to talk to the RCP family and started with the introduction of Sagarmatha Radio, which is the first independent community radio broadcasting station in South Asia that started in 1997. As a public radio, it was not permitted to broadcast news and economic information, so it started with 'Hal Chal' or current activities highlighting different social issues.

Radio Sagarmatha broadcasts are not commercial, but community based on various topics such as public health, rule of law, education for all, gender equality, environment, human rights, good governance, sustainable development and promotion of local culture, arts and tourism. It also promotes Nepali songs and works on social issues of awareness-raising in close collaboration with local governments.

The main aim of Radio Sagarmatha is to change society in a positive manner and be the voice of the poor, and its bold discussions encourages the government for action in a non-partisan and independent manner. Many of its programmes provide constructive critiques on social policies issues in Nepali and several ethnic languages of Nepal.

While the Sagarmatha Radio covers all areas of Bagmati Province and bordering areas, it also works with all the seven provinces of Nepal and supports them with the production of various relevant materials. It has also been collaborating with Rotary on various social issues including on WASH and on Polio eradication.

Mr. Laxman Upreti and Rtn. Raisha Shrestha complemented on the programmes of Sagarmatha Radio and also mentioned about the financial constraints that it is facing particularly on further digitisation.

Following a Questions/Answers session, on behalf of the RCP, Rtn. Khadak S. Bisht gave a 'Vote of Thanks' to the guest speakers and suggested further collaboration between Rotary and Sagarmatha Radio.

They have unanimously supported my decision, and I want to use this opportunity to thank President Stephanie and RI directors for their understanding and unwavering support. I am determined to return once the treatment is complete and continue to serve our organization, meeting the challenges ahead in Rotary.

My wife EunSun and I want to express our gratitude for all the care and encouragement. I have been deeply moved by the support of family and friends.
